

Sacraments

Baptism: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385 one week prior to class.

<u>**Reconciliation:**</u> The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present – body, blood, soul, and divinity – under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

<u>Confirmation</u>: In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

Priesthood: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. Even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing.

Dear Friends:

Breath, air, wind, water, fire - all of these elements have been used to speak of the Holy Spirit. Anointing, pouring, inflaming, descending are all the ways that the Holy Spirit's coming to us is described. The Holy Spirit is depicted most often in religious art as a dove, based on the accounts of Jesus' baptism in which the descent of the Spirit is described as 'like a dove' or 'in the form of a dove.' Images of Pentecost show the Holy Spirit as tongues of fire hovering over the heads of Mary and the Apostles, as in accord with the account given in the Acts of the Apostles.


There are so many images of the Holy Spirt given to us in Scripture and Tradition, perhaps because the work of the Holy Spirit is hard to capture in any one image. The Holy Spirit is the Person of the Holy Trinity that is closest to us, and perhaps for that reason is the hardest to describe. Given to us by the Father through the Son, the Holy Spirt comes to dwell in us. He is the life's breath of faith, a fountain of life welling up within us, a fire that lights up our minds and hearts to know and love God, the wind of God that moves us and gives us the ability to fly up into the very presence of God. On the day of our baptism, the Holy Spirit comes to live in our souls and is the source of what we call Sanctifying Grace.

If we avoid mortal sin or repent and confess it, the Holy Spirt stays with us to guide our lives to heaven. If we seek His guidance, He will lead us along God's way. The Spirit is given to each of us for the good of all. As we celebrate Pentecost today, the end of the Easter season, we celebrate the beginning of the Church's mission: to live in the Spirit and to share the Spirit with all the world. May today's celebration lead us on to a new fervor for that mission!

On Sunday, June 22nd, we will celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi with special devotions at Holy Family Church beginning at 2:00 p.m. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for Adoration, there will be a procession around the outside of the church, and we will close with Benediction. Join us for a time of appreciation for the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.



A portion of Virginia Avenue will close to traffic longterm beginning at 8:00 a.m. Tuesday continuously through mid-October between Jefferson Street and Sunflower Road. Crews will conduct full-depth roadway reconstruction, drainage cleaning and upgrades, guide rail updates, concrete curbing installation and repair, shoulder improvements, line painting, and other miscellaneous construction work. 

Our Lady of the Valley Society of Saint Vincent de Paul: A Burn In Your Heart

A few weeks ago the call came in to our Help Line from Mary (not her real name). She was requesting assistance for delinquent sewer and water bills; her shut-off notice stated in two days the water would be shut off and NO EXTENSIONS WOULD BE GRANTED. There were children in the house and Mary

was doing everything she could to solve this problem, but after losing her job not long ago, she had nowhere else to turn.

Two Vincentians quickly visited Mary in her home and listened as she recounted her saddest story. The four children living with her were brought to her from Children and Youth Services; they were victims of abuse where the agency stepped in and removed them from their home for their own safety, health, and well-being. Mary knew them since they were family members whom she loved and cherished, and opened her house to them. Mary described how she was pursuing guardianship for the children and the seemingly insurmountable legal challenges that she faced. She also told the Vincentians she found a job with the Sisters of Saint Joseph; she completed orientation and was starting work next week assisting the retired nuns. The Vincentians went to work on Mary's problems pledging to pay the past due water and sewer bills and prevent the shut-off. They also handed her bus passes to get to work until she receives her first pay check. Bedding and pillows were brought from the Food Pantry supplies to help with the living arrangements. And they explored legal services to assist with Mary's wish to provide a lasting home for "her children."

Mary has a mighty love in her heart, and is working hard for "her children." A widow of seven years, time has taught her how to be resourceful and caring as she lives a Christian life. She tells the Vincentians about nightly walks around the neighborhood when they talk about God and the youngest reminds them they have to pray. Mary said he likes to carry around a little statue of the Blessed Mother that was her grandmother's. The Vincentians gave her a small statue of St. Joseph to put in his pocket as well – the intercessor for their new family. They parted the Home Visit with a prayer and left some food from the Food Pantry and an invitation to bring her family to visit their new Vincentian friends each month.

As Vincentians carry out their ministry, we see the face of Christ in those we serve. Go back and read this story of Mary; consider the burning love in her heart as she gathers "her children" to herself and helps to "mend the wounds" they have suffered in their short lives. Witness the Vincentians' love and burn in their hearts for this family as they do everything in their power to help bring them closer to Christ. Please join us in prayer for Mary and "her children" with a burn in your heart that you may see the face of Christ.
