

Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u>: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385 one week prior to class.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present – body, blood, soul, and divinity – under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

<u>Confirmation</u>: In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.


<u>Priesthood</u>: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. Even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing.

Dear Friends:

This year marks the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. Called in response to a controversy over the teachings of a priest from Alexandria in Egypt named Arius who asserted that the Son was lesser than the Father, the Council gave us the Nicene Creed as a statement of the authentic faith of the Church.

The fathers of that council did not think that they were composing a statement of what people had come to believe about God on their own, but one that authentically represented what God had revealed to us about Himself. God had revealed Himself to us in the Holy Scriptures and in the tradition of the Church as Father, Son and Holy Spirit: one God, three distinct, but equal persons, each God. God has made known to us that He is the Holy Trinity. This is what the Council professed in the Creed, and this is what we recite each Sunday as we gather to celebrate Mass.

Our belief in the Trinity is the proclamation of a mystery. Mystery is not a puzzle we solve; it is something beyond our complete understanding. Nonetheless, it is something made known to us, which we accept by faith. We ourselves can be quite mysterious to others, even at times to ourselves. Saint Augustine musing over the death of a dear friend and the twists and turns of his life wrote "I have become a question to myself." We don't always understand ourselves, let alone other people, but if we trust them, when they tell us about themselves, we believe them. In that vein, when God tells us about Himself, we can believe Him, because He is perfectly trustworthy.

Perhaps when we reflect on this mystery of the Trinity, we discover that far from being an abstraction, it tells us something very profound about God. Saint John would write in his first letter: "God is love." We can believe that, because God is not absolutely solitary, but a unity of persons that are perfectly One. God does love us because while He is way beyond us, He came to be with us in the Incarnation and remains with us through the Holy Spirit. We can connect with God and through God with one another.

Father's Day reminds us that God is our Father. Saying that God is our father, is not meant to say that God is like our fathers, just bigger. It is meant to say that our fathers should always strive to reflect God the Father. They are meant to be a sign of God's fatherly love. Let's pray for the fathers of our parish today, and for our fathers living or deceased that they may always live in the love of the Heavenly Father. Happy Father's Day!



PennDOT District 11 has announced roadway improvement work on Route 68 (Adams Street, Virginia Avenue) in Rochester Borough and Township.

A portion of Virginia Avenue will close to traffic long-term beginning at 8:00 a.m. Tuesday continuously through mid-October between Jefferson Street and Sunflower Road. Crews will conduct full-depth roadway reconstruction, drainage cleaning and upgrades, guide rail updates, concrete curbing installation and repair, shoulder improvements, line painting, and other miscellaneous construction work. Traffic is detoured.



Our Lady of the Valley Society of Saint Vincent de Paul: Power Of The Rosary

March was a very busy month for the Help Line. Sixteen families needed assistance with their utility bills; nine faced shut-off in a few days while two had been shut off for over two months. Eight families needed some help with rent bills to avoid eviction proceedings and stay in their homes. At each Home Visit, Vincentians diligently discussed the bills with the utility companies and landlords as they worked out detailed arrangements to eliminate each crisis. Over \$6,700 was needed to put these families on a good path to a brighter future and ensure the safety and well-being of fifteen children.

Jasmin (not her real name) called when her food ran low and the rent came due. She explained to the Vincentians that part of the reason she is behind in rent is due to her food stamps being temporarily discontinued. Jasmin admitted she had been addicted to gambling and was not able to keep up, but was "clean" now for 10 months. She was honest with her landlord who agreed to a payment plan to get back in good standing. Once the food stamps are reinstated she should be able to keep up with the payment plan, but needed \$300 this month to stay on track. The Vincentians brought a bag of food and made arrangements to pay the rent bill. When they gave her a rosary, Jasmin brought out a rosary which belonged to her great-great-grandmother. They left an addiction chaplet from rosary makers and together said the prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel.

Vincentians got to know Jacob (not his real name) as they visited his newly refurbished home. Formerly incarcerated and homeless, Jacob met the owner of the home through a friend and is now employed full time as painter/handyman for his landlord. He had gotten behind in his rent and reached out for assistance. Jacob is a very personable, humble, sincere young man. He is working hard to turn his life around and stay on the right path. He is doing what he can to help the mother of his three children who live with her in another state (he proudly showed pictures on his phone). The Vincentians discussed the \$700 rent bill with the landlord, who spoke very highly of Jacob and praised his work. He agreed our pledge for half of the bill would put Jacob in good standing. At the end of our visit, the Vincentians pulled out a brown rosary (courtesy of the Rosary Makers) and saw a huge grin on Jacob's face as they started to explain its significance. He remarked he had the same rosary as a teenager and was delighted to pray with them.

Please join in prayer and the Rosary for our many Friends in Need who reach out for help to put their lives back in order. Their faith is revealed through the power of the Rosary.

Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh Calling for a New Class of Permanent Deacons

The Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh is calling for a new class of interested and qualified Catholic men to begin formation to serve the Church as permanent deacons.

Three information sessions for prospective applicants are planned at the Diocesan Pastoral Center, 2900 Noblestown Road, Pittsburgh 15205, from 9:00 to 11:30 a.m. Saturday, July 24th, 6:30 to 9:00 p.m. Thursday, July 29th, and Tuesday, August 3rd, 6:30 to 9:00 p.m.

"For anyone who'd like to learn more about the formation experience and diaconal ministry, I'd suggest attending one of these sessions; they'll be informal, and there will be no pressure," said Deacon Stephen Byers, director of the Deacon Formation Program. Wives are welcome and encouraged to attend with their spouse.

Deacons, along with bishops and priests, constitute the three levels of ordained ministry in the Roman Catholic Church.

Applicants must be a married or single man between the ages of 30 and 59, a college graduate with a secure job or source of income, and in full communion with the Catholic Church. Additional criteria for application will be discussed at the information sessions.

To begin the process, a nomination by an applicant's pastor or by another priest or deacon of the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh is required by the deadline of Monday, September 1st.
