The tradition of the St. Joseph's Altar is one of unending gratitude and thanksgiving.



In the Middle Ages there was a terrible drought and famine in Sicily, a region of Italy. Without any rain, all the crops withered and died. The only thing that grew was the fava bean, a food for cattle. In desperation, families ate the fava bean in order to survive. Turning to St. Joseph for help, they promised to honor him always if their prayers were answered. Miraculously, healing rains came. In gratitude, an altar was dedicated to St. Joseph with the best of the foods they harvested; and in thanksgiving they shared this food with others less fortunate.

Sicilians who came to America continued the tradition of the St. Joseph's Altar with petitions, thanksgiving, and generosity towards others.

The altar has three tiers representing the Trinity. Saint Joseph is placed on the top, and throughout the tiers are flowers, baked goods, fruits, and bread. A basket for petitions is placed on the altar, and the food is shared with the poor. Fava beans are handed out as a reminder to pray to Saint Joseph.

Please consider contributing to the altar and to those in need. You may bring baked goods, bread, fruit, or flowers and place them on the altar as you arrive for Mass the weekend of March 19/20.

Please wrap all baked goods, as these will be donated to Samaritan Place and Ronald McDonald House. Use only disposable platters as they WILL NOT be returned.

God of all, may we be moved to tap into the countless ways that human ingenuity, animated by your Spirit, has allowed us to collectively live more sustainably on the Earth, protecting the dignity of people and planet. We pray that we always prioritize the dignity and rights of workers as we make purchasing decisions at our parish/ in our community, and that we consider how our financial investments impact the health of the planet.


