Sacraments

Baptism: Baptisms may take place during weekend Masses or during a private ceremony. There is a one-time preparation class that must be completed if you plan to baptize your child. We are here to help you through the process!

First Holy Communion: First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion are usually received in the 2nd grade. Students prepare to receive the sacrament by attending Faith Formation classes on Wednesday evenings or Sunday mornings during the school year.

Confirmation: The Diocese of Knoxville has lowered the Confirmation age of our youth to the 5th grade. Confirmandi are prepared to receive the sacrament of Confirmation by attending Faith Formation Classes on Wednesday evenings or Sunday mornings.

If your child/children are late in receiving sacraments, that's okay! Some youth may be able attend and prepare for sacraments during our Youth Ministry programs on Sunday afternoons/evenings, for other youth, we may need to format a unique plan. Please don't hesitate to reach out for help in getting your child/children caught up on their sacraments!

Marriage: The Diocese of Knoxville requires a minimum of 4 months of preparation before receiving the Sacrament of Marriage. Please contact us early in your planning stage so we can help you through the process!

Sacrament of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is not just for the dying! If you are seriously ill, inpatient in a local hospital, homebound or having surgery, please contact the parish office to request this sacrament.

Confession: Priests are available to hear confessions each Saturday after the 9 AM Mass. You may also make an appointment by contacting the parish office.

DEACON'S CORNER

This summer, my wife and I traveled to Italy. Among other places, we went to Loretto, the site of the house that our Blessed Mother was conceived, born, and raised in. While everything I previously mentioned about the trip was truly amazing, what really amazed me was found in a small, maybe 15' x 20' room inside the church at Loretto. You almost had to be looking for the room to find it. In that room was the most amazing painting; no more than probably 8 x 10 inches; of Our Blessed Mother, the Mother of God, kneeling in front of St. John the Evangelist. St. John was presenting the Eucharist, the body, blood, soul, and divinity of HER Son, our Lord Jesus Christ to her. What struck me most about the painting was the look of pure desire Mary had on her face as she received back into her own body, the body of HER Son.

I've seen a lot of amazing things as a Minister of Holy Communion; things that have even brought me to tears. I've seen tears of joy on the faces of those that could receive the Eucharist and I've seen tears of pure longing and desire from those who could not yet receive. These people knew so profoundly the One they were receiving and and the One they could not yet receive. These people may have known much about our Lord, but more importantly, you could tell they knew our Lord as a deep, personal, and intimate Lord.

As we enter the Octave of Christmas, please take the time outside of Mass, each day if possible, to visit our Lord in the adoration chapel or in the Tabernacle in the main sanctuary. Read the Gospel reading for the day (see iMissal or similar app) and have a conversation with Jesus just like you would a friend. Thank Him for coming into our world as a baby, an innocent, vulnerable little child for us to take care of. Ask Him to show you what it is He wants you to do that day and to show you how to know and love Him more.

I pray that you continue have a Christmas like Mary: A very Mary Christmas.

The Mystery of Suffering and End of Life Decisions

- Paul Simoneau

Church's teachings on the salvific meaning of human suffering, care for the seriously ill, and end of life decisions. Important distinctions are made between that which is considered "ordinary care" (e.g., nutrition, hydration, basic care and comfort) and "medical treatment," and the principles that help us discern between what is obligatory treatment and what is optional. The subject of palliative care (treating pain) and that of the use or withdrawal of life-sustaining procedures will also be covered. The presentation will walk participants through the diocesan approved "Advance Care Plan" (what many call a Living Will) and "Assignment of a Health Care Agent" (someone who can make medical decisions on your behalf should be incapacitated). Throughout this presentation, the spiritual meaning of this important part of life's journey will be highlighted. Packets of information and resources will be provided.
