

Together, we help children overcome poverty and become productive, caring leaders in their own communities



Founded in 1954 by Father William Wasson, NPH is supporting nearly 7,000 children, both inside and outside our homes, ensuring they have a safe and nurturing place to live, an education, clothing, healthcare, and a strong family support system. In addition, NPH's St. Damien Pediatric Hospital employs more than 500 Haitians and is the only hospital wholly dedicated to pediatric and prenatal care in Haiti, a country of 11.5 million people



A Lenten Meditation on Lent (2)

(Adapted from "52 WAYS TO CARE FOR CREATION" from laudatosimovement.org)

In Laudato Si', Pope Francis calls us to live more simply. What can this short phrase or prayer mean to those of us who have been so showered with abundance in our lives? "People may well have a growing ecological sensitivity but it has not succeeded in changing their harmful habits of consumption which, rather than decreasing, appear to be growing all the more. A simple example is the increasing use and power of air-conditioning" [LS 55]. The term "overconsumption" may bring to mind shopping bags and large houses with overflowing closets, but more accurately, it is our common and pervasive use of energy that harms the earth through pollution and emissions, and creates wide gaps between global haves and have-nots (ourworldindata.org). As we begin our journey through Lent, let us seek to live more simply to lessen the strain on the earth's resources and its ability for renewal.



Urgent Need for Volunteers at St. Mary's Legacy Clinic!

The St. Mary's Legacy Clinic (SMLC) is a mobile medical clinic—a family doctor's office on wheels—that travels to the underserved areas of rural East TN to offer those without insurance holistic, compassionate, primary care services, "extending the healing ministries of Jesus Christ" to those in

need. There is no cost for SMLC services, as it is funded solely by donations and grants. The clinic is possible because of the hard dedicated work of a small staff and many wonderful volunteers who work as a team to help patients live their healthiest lives! Currently, there is an urgent need for volunteers with CDL licenses to drive our mobile clinic, as well as many opportunities for Clinical Nurses, Office Administration, and licensed/unlicensed medical professionals.
