#### **DEACON'S CORNER**

We may be tempted to see the story of the Transfiguration as one of transformation. Jesus, who appeared to the disciples as a man among them during the course of His ministry, is suddenly transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes are blazing white. Moses and Elijah stand with Him. It seems that this Jesus who is a man among us is now changed into a god-like being, powerful and bright, and given authority by God, whose voice speaks from heaven, enjoining the disciples to "Listen to him." In reality, of course, Jesus has been God all along. Jesus has been powerful all along. Jesus has taught with authority all along. The Transfiguration represents, not a transformation of Jesus from man to God, but a revelation that this man Jesus is and has been God all along. Fully human; fully divine. The disciples could hardly have been expected to grasp that at the beginning of their time with Jesus. Even here, Jesus only brings along three of them, the three who make up His most inner circle, and instructs them to tell no one what they saw. Peter understands what he sees. He knows the implications, which is why he wants to set this place aside as a place of worship. But that's not Jesus' plan at all. There is still much work to be done, and no time for lying about in tents contemplating how wonderful God is. To worship Jesus properly is to follow Him. Lent is a time of transformation for us. We hope to be different people at the end of Lent than we are at the beginning. We take on practices, sacrifices, prayers, and works of mercy to remind us of where our hearts should properly be and to help transform us into the people we long to be. Really, though, Lent is about being transformed into the people we already are. We are adopted children of the Father, co-heirs with Christ to the kingdom. That is what we are already, and we are by the declaration of Christ at our baptism, not when we manage to somehow be good enough or do good enough to warrant His mercy. We are holy ones called to holiness. Lent is a season not to become saints, but to be the saints we already are.



During the Lenten season, certain feasts occur which the liturgy or local custom traditionally exempts from the Lenten spirit of penance. This year, the Memorial



of Saint Patrick falls on Friday, March 17. It is well known that Saint Patrick's Day is a day of convivial celebration for many American Catholics. Therefore, Bishop Stika has issued a dispensation decree stating: "On Friday, March 17, 2023, all Catholics of the Diocese of Knoxville, by my authority, are dispensed from the abstinence obligation (can. 87 §1). It is not required that anyone make use of this dispensation. Those who do wish to make use of it are encouraged to abstain from meat on some other day as part of their penitential practices and to engage in some additional act of prayer, service to the poor or almsgiving."

However...nearly 30% of all greenhouse gas emissions originate from our vehicles, and these gases are warming our world, making summer weather last longer, storms more intense, and stressing trees and wildlife (nasa.gov). According to the DOT, the average American drives about 35 miles per day and reducing this number as a culture can have a huge positive impact. Carpooling, reducing trips and mileage by efficiently planning your errands, walking and biking, refusing to use drivethroughs, using public transportation, and switching our vehicles to electric are all healthier practices for creation!
