The Chrism Mass will be celebrated Tuesday, April 4, at 6:30 p.m. at the Cathedral of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. At the annual Chrism Mass, diocesan priests renew their priestly vows. Bishop Stika blesses the sacred chrism, the oil of catechumens, and the oil of the sick that will be used in parishes of the diocese for the next year.





This year, the Memorial of Saint Patrick falls on Friday, March 17. It is well known that Saint Patrick's Day is a day of convivial celebration for many American Catholics. Therefore, Bishop Stika has issued a dispensation decree stating: "On Friday, March 17, 2023, all Catholics of the Diocese of Knoxville, by my authority, are dispensed from the abstinence obligation (can. 87 §1). It is

not required that anyone make use of this dispensation. Those who do wish to make use of it are encouraged to abstain from meat on some other day as part of their penitential practices and to engage in some additional act of prayer, service to the poor or almsgiving."



It is once again time for our annual Saint Joseph's Altar!

Thank you for your generosity in past years! Please bring your baked goods, fruits, and vegetables in disposable containers and place them on St. Joseph's Altar the weekend of March 18/19th as you come to Mass. All of our blessings will be shared with others at the Samaritan Place and Ronald McDonald House.



The tradition of the Saint Joseph's Altar is one of gratitude, thanksgiving and petition. In the Middle Ages, there was a terrible drought and famine in Sicily, the largest island in the Mediterranean and a region of Italy. Without any rain, all the crops, the fruit, and the vegetables withered and died. The only thing that seemed resilient was the fava bean, a food given to cattle. In desperation, families ate fava beans to survive. The Sicilians turned to St Joseph for help, pleading for rain. They promised to honor St Joseph if these prayers were heard. Miraculously, healing rains came and the drought ended. In gratitude and thanksgiving, the people set an altar dedicated to St Joseph with the best of the foods that they harvested. They shared this food in thanksgiving with people who were less fortunate. Today, St Joseph is still honored with thanksgiving and generosity towards others. The St Joseph's altar has three tiers to represent the trinity. A statue of St Joseph is placed on top, and through the tiers are flowers, cakes, cookies, fruits, and breads. The bread is often in symbolic shapes of a cross, hammer, heart, or chalice. No meat is found because it is the Lenten season. A basket for petitions is placed on the altar and the food is blessed and shared with the poor. Fava beans are handed out as a reminder to pray to St Joseph.

La iglesia de Todos los Santos tiene una maravillosa tradición celebrando la Fiesta de San José con un Altar de San José. La tradición del Altar de San José es una de gratitud, acción de gracias y petición. En la Edad Media, hubo una terrible sequía y hambruna en Sicilia, la isla más grande del Mediterráneo y una región de Italia. Sin lluvia, todas los cultivos, las frutas y las verduras se secaron y murieron. Lo único que parecía resistente era el frijol fava, un alimento que se le da al ganado. Desesperadas, las familias comían los frijoles favas para sobrevivir. Los icilianos rezaron a San José en busca de ayuda, suplicando lluvia. Prometieron honrar a San José si estas oraciones eran escuchadas. Milagrosamente, llegaron lluvias curativas y la sequía terminó. En agradecimiento y acción de gracias, el pueblo colocó un altar dedicado a San José con lo mejor de los alimentos que cosecharon. Compartieron esta comida en acción de gracias con personas menos afortunadas. Hoy, San José todavía es honrado con acción de gracias y generosidad hacia los demás. El altar de San José tiene tres niveles para representar la trinidad. Se coloca una estatua de San José en la parte superior y, a través de los niveles, hay flores, pasteles, galletas, frutas y panes. El pan tiene formas simbólicas de cruz, martillo, corazón o cáliz. No se encuentra carne porque es la temporada de Cuaresma. Se coloca una cesta para las peticiones sobre el altar y se bendice la comida y se comparte con los pobres. Los frijoles favas se reparten como recordatorio para rezar a San José.
