



My Sisters and Brothers,

We continue to celebrate the great JOY of Christmas, that Jesus, Emmanuel, is born among us and has come to bring salvation, light and peace. What started very small and simple in Bethlehem with just a few chosen people, is now manifested by a star for the whole world. My prayer as we celebrate the great feast of the **Epiphany of the Lord** this weekend is that throughout this new year and always, you will truly be that shining star. I know that this wish could be interpreted in a number of ways. It could mean that others see you as the center of attention with the spotlight always on you. It could mean that your life and goals are interpreted as somewhat heroic and unique. Or, perhaps it has something to do with what others say and think about you, that you achieve some form of “super-stardom”—at least for some people. Actually, I really am aiming higher. My hope for us to be “stars” comes from our Gospel this weekend, that we will be the means of leading others to the Lord. The Magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem saying, “We saw the star at its rising, and have come to do Him homage”. I am sure there were lots of stars in the sky, but there had to be one that stood out, one that was brighter and more attractive, that they felt compelled to follow to find the Christ. I remember a couple weeks ago there was a meteorological phenomenon of two planets coming very close together that shined very brightly, but I don’t think that is what the message is really about for us. I think it is asking yourself what is it about your Christian life that will enable you to stand out amongst so many? Could it be the virtues you so clearly live, the service you so selflessly give, the joy you so freely witness? Many are searching, and many seem to be lost. So many peoples’ lives are shook and feel unstable because of the effects of this pandemic. We celebrate on this feast of Epiphany that Christ came to bring light and hope for all people—in Paul’s word to the Ephesians, “that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and co-partners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel”. No one is excluded or left out. Unless we strive to be true “stars” leading others to Christ, many will be left out in the cold and never experience that Christ has come for them. Being a true star has a lot to do with offering to Christ our most precious gifts, as did the Magi. Give your best and let God do the rest. Epiphany then can become a reality throughout our lives. This is what can make 2021 so special.

Next weekend, we celebrate the feast of the **Baptism of the Lord**. With this feast, we officially conclude the Christmas season. Even though most people have probably begun putting away decorations, etc., I believe it is important to keep the spirit of Christmas alive all year round. Perhaps even keep one decoration up as a reminder that the Lord is born for you. Mostly, I just want to say thank you to all who made Christmas so wonderful here at St. Gabriel. So many worked so hard to help us celebrate these great days so well. So many give so much to enable us to reach out to those less fortunate. And so many share their precious gifts of time, talent and treasure all year to empower us to continue the mission of **Being CHRIST ~ Every Day ~ Everywhere**, and spreading the Good News that He lives among us—Emmanuel. Thank you to all who were so kind and generous to me

personally and to our staff with your many acts of love and support. We appreciate you and all that you do for us. Although this has been in many ways a very different Christmas, it was truly wonderful. Thank you to all those who enabled us to celebrate our liturgies so prayerfully and so safely. Thanks for our Maintenance Crew, Heavenly Dusters and Art and Environment people. Thanks for all who presented our Live Nativity. We are so blessed. Praise God, and continue to cherish, use and share your many gifts. The GIFT of Christ’s presence and love is celebrated every time we celebrate the Eucharist. We certainly pray that in this new year, and as more and more people are vaccinated, that we can continue to welcome people home to celebrate and live more fully, and in person, the great gift of God’s life.

Our next exciting and faith-filled **ALPHA course** begins on January 12th, and continues on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 til 8:00 pm, as well as in the mornings from 9:30 til 11 am, for eleven weeks. Each session includes a video presentation on different practical questions that help us to get to know Jesus on a personal level. Each presentation is followed by honest, practical and non-threatening table conversation where each person can just be him or herself and express whatever is in their hearts. We grow together with the grace of the Holy Spirit. It is meant to be comfortable, real and very practical. We ask you to sign up online very soon, and to reach out and invite someone to come with you, especially someone who could benefit from this great boost of faith. ALPHA continues to make such a positive difference for our community. I urge you to share in this gift and to help utilize the great spiritual growth opportunity this could have for you. Please pray for God’s blessing on this important faith tool.

We invite any Catholic adults who have not received the sacrament of **Confirmation** to four sessions beginning next Sunday and for the following three Sunday afternoons from 12:30 to 2:00 to help you prepare and to review basic areas of what it means to be a fully initiated member of the Catholic Church. The most important requirement is a real desire to be a full member of the Church and to share in the work of the Lord. We typically celebrate Confirmation in March, but with the safe health restrictions, we may have to adjust a bit. Please call the parish office or Maureen Dowd if you would like to be a part of this preparation process.

It is back to work this week, and hopefully back to school in person for our students. Thank you again for all the ways you have enabled life to continue on and even become better during this pandemic. We are learning a lot and growing in new ways. Time waits for no one, and yet time is such a precious gift when we use it to do good things for the Lord. May you be the Lord’s STAR leading others to Christ, and may God fill you with light, hope and joy in this new year. The peace of the Lord be with you.



NEW BREAKING BREAD BOOKS FOR 2021 – Important new changes!

With the start of this new liturgical year, we have the new Breaking Bread books. After consultation, we have a cart with Breaking Bread books for each of our weekend Masses. As you enter the church, you can take a Breaking Bread book and then **return it to the cart or place on one of the tables in the Gathering Area** as you exit Mass. **Please do not take these books home!** Health guidelines indicate that any germs die within 3-4 days. Different carts with books are used for each Mass and immediately put away until the following weekend. We hope that this will help people to worship better while at the same time ensuring that the books are free of any germs the following weekend. Please do not congregate by the tables or cart and keep your safe distance before returning your book. Please do not leave the books in the pews!! Thank you for your cooperation as we continue to navigate these challenging times together!

LITURGY CORNER

We celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany this week. We all know the story of the three wise men. The story that we're all familiar with is that three wise men came from the east to honor Jesus. The three wise men we see in Nativity scenes typically depict three wealthy men, wearing costly robes and representing different races. However, this is all speculation. The only biblical reference we have to the wise men is the story we hear this weekend from Matthew. Matthew describes them as "magi". This word normally refers to people that were scholars, philosophers or religious professors. These are the sorts of people that kings would surround themselves with, seeking their advice. So they were likely not kings, but people who kings would look to for guidance. Matthew also doesn't tell us how many there were. It's assumed there were three as they brought gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. However, we don't know how much of each were brought. The gifts are significant, though. Gold was very valuable as it's been used as currency for centuries. Frankincense is a very costly perfume, or fragrance, that was commonly used by royalty. Myrrh, on the other hand, was a somewhat odd gift in that it was normally used as an embalming fluid and an antiseptic ointment. So while gold and frankincense refer to Jesus' royalty and divinity, the myrrh refers to his humanity and perhaps points to his death on the cross and being laid in the tomb. While we listen to this famous story, let's reflect on what our own gifts to Jesus will be. God has blessed us all with various gifts, and we must choose to use them wisely, in the service of our Lord.




