My Sisters and Brothers,

It is time to get to work—the work of what it means to be a follower of Jesus. On this Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, we hear in Mark’s Gospel the call of the first disciples. They happened to be fishermen, and Jesus called them to be “fishers of men”. In other words, Jesus uses the gifts and talents that we have been given and finds ways of using them to build the Kingdom of God—if we are willing to offer our gifts and allow God to use them according to His plan. This is what Jesus meant when He said, “**The kingdom of heaven is at hand**”. These simple fishermen, ordinary people like you and me, left all things and ended up doing great things as true disciples of the Lord. Why would we think that God could not do the same if we are willing to follow Him? It may be right in our own homes, neighborhoods, workplaces or parish where God needs us and uses us to be a light shining in darkness. The early disciples made the decision to answer His call. They gave their best. The Lord did the rest. Negativity, divisiveness and unfair criticism destroys. Love builds up. Let us work together to build the Kingdom.

Catholic Schools Week begins a week from this Sunday. Although there is always room for growth, the good things that take place in our school on a daily basis are overwhelming. I am so proud of our administration and staff. Their dedication, commitment and competence are unparalleled. Our faculty is outstanding, not only as very professional educators, but as truly caring individuals who always go the “extra mile” for each and every child. Most importantly, I am so proud of our students. They are excellent young people who are a pleasure to be with, who have great qualities and virtues, and who have such great potential to become those “leaders in faith” that we work so hard to help mold. Thank you to our parents who care so much, work so hard, and make such a difference for our school. And thank God for you, the generous parishioners of our parish whose weekly sacrifice helps us to continue providing Catholic education for our children. We are so blessed.

We continue to rely on God to guide our future and to provide for all our needs. After much prayer and careful deliberation, our wonderful co-Principal, **Ann Ulrich**, has discerned that God is calling her to a change of roles and to return to the classroom as a teacher. Although Ann has been an absolutely fantastic principal at St. Gabriel School the past three years, as well as a phenomenal teacher for many years prior, her heart has always been with the children (which is why she is such a fantastic principal). She changes roles at a time when our school is literally at its very best (at least in my 30+ years), and at a time when we feel so confident in the leadership skills and love for our school that Robert Kumazec will continue to bring to our school. In the

meantime, we will begin a search for a new assistant principal to assist Robert in the ongoing growth of our great school. Change is always hard, but this is all happening for the right reasons, under the best conditions, and most importantly, with deep trust and prayer that God is leading us and will always lead us to what is best for everyone. Our sincere hope, as is Ann’s, is for her to remain an integral part of our great faculty and to continue sharing her very special spirit and gifts. I know I can count on everyone to help us work together for a very smooth and positive transition. I will keep you updated.

Wednesday we experienced the inauguration of a **new President of the United States**. Regardless of your political affiliation, opinions or past, it is time for a new beginning. There will never be a person in any political office that everyone agrees with or that agrees with everything we hold. However, unity, respect, truth and cooperation is what will enable our country to be its best and to be a means of fostering justice, peace and goodness for every person. Patrick has sent us many pictures, and Mike Ulrich and I went and visited his shop this past Tuesday. Patrick is aiming to begin installation shortly, and should be done by the end of February. I am very excited and believe this will be a very beautiful and inspiring renovation that can enhance our worship and prayer.

It is hard to believe, but we are already into the third quarter of our fiscal year and our school year. Thanks to the faith, hard work, goodness and generosity of so many people, we are doing well and are very stable. Our parish offers so many opportunities to grow in faith, to do God’s work, and to build a community of believers. Financially, we are very close to budget as we do our best to contain expenses and to be good stewards. We are very grateful and rely on your generosity. I know these are challenging times financially for most of us. Most importantly, we trust God and continue to give our very best. Thank you for all that you do and for the ways you help us to grow and respond to God’s call. Let us continue to be people of hope, joy, and Christian charity for all. LITURGY CORNER



This past October, Pope Francis issued an encyclical he called "Fratelli Tutti – On Fraternity and Social Friendship". The document is very timely. In this document, the Holy Father reminds us we are all created in the image and likeness of God and are therefore all brothers and sisters, regardless of race, national origin, religion, economic background or political view. It is normal for a person to wish one he loves to do well and to succeed. If we love our brother/sister, then we want him/her to succeed as well. Pope Francis uses Jesus' famous parable about the Good Samaritan as an example throughout the encyclical. During our lives, we all can identify with each person portrayed in this parable. Sometimes we're the injured person; sometimes we're the robbers; sometimes we're the passers-by that avoid the injured person and sometimes we are the Good Samaritan. We all need to put ourselves in the position of the Good Samaritan – the person who goes out of his way to help a person in need. In Jesus' days, a Samaritan was an outcast. We can look at this today and ask how can an outcast, a person who is looked down upon by society, reach out and help a person who may otherwise persecute him? Similarly, we must look at our own world-view and seek the outcasts, as it is our responsibility, through our common lineage with God, to help our brother and sister. So many of the world's problems can be addressed if we were to all stop and remember that we are all sons and daughters of God.

RECEIVING COMMUNION AT MASS

It has come to our attention that some folks have dropped the host after receiving it and trying to remove their masks to put it in their mouth. If that happens to you or if the host broke and part of it fell on the floor, please pick up the host and consume it. Do not leave it on the floor. This is the Body of Christ and should be treated with utmost reverence and respect. Don't be afraid to take your time putting the host in your mouth, so that you don't risk dropping it.





Fresh Air

We would all love to be able to be outdoors enjoying sunshine and fresh air; however at this time of year in northeast Ohio, that isn't usually possible. But there are steps we can take to keep our indoor air as fresh and healthy as possible. To minimize dust, dander and other airborne irritants, vacuum 1-2x/week with a filtered vacuum and change furnace filters regularly. Consider a dehumidifier for damp areas to decrease the chance of mold/mildew growth. Let some fresh air in when outdoor temps permit. Make sure carbon monoxide detectors are on each level of the home and are functioning as well as having furnaces checked and cleaned yearly. Having a radon test is another helpful way to assure safer air quality. Being tied to home more this past year has led to more home improvement and crafting projects, but keep in mind some products used contain chemicals that require ventilation to expel potentially harmful chemicals. We can all "breathe a little easier" after taking these simple steps to improve the air quality in our homes. *Here's to our health! Pam Lewis, Parish Nurse*


