Call 440-285-7051 for times and to register.

Reconciliation:

The sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated every Saturday from 3:45 - 4:30 pm, or by appointment.

Marriage:

Diocesan policy directs couples to arrange for marriage at least six months prior to the intended wedding ceremony. Please call the priest or deacon of your choice for an appointment to make arrangements.

My Sisters and Brothers,

Although the Easter season is officially over with our celebration of Pentecost, we have a couple more big feasts which celebrate major foundational parts of our faith. Today is **Trinity Sunday**—the foundation of our doctrine and the basis of how we relate to God, and how God calls us to share personally in His life. Most would say that the Trinity is a mystery, and we could never fully understand how there could be three Persons but only one God. And in some respects they are correct. However, I believe our belief in the most Blessed Trinity is meant to be personal, and not doctrinal or “mysterious”. God, as Father, Son and Spirit existed for all time, but was only revealed to us in time. You know the story, God the Father sent His Son, Jesus, to be born of the Virgin, and to be fully human and fully God in order to make very visible who God is and how God calls us to live our lives, as well as to show the way to salvation and eternal life. After Jesus’ rather short time here on earth, culminating with His Death and Resurrection, He remained with His disciples for a short time after, and then ascended into heaven. Finally, He sent them the promised gift of the Holy Spirit, which is what we celebrated last weekend on Pentecost, to give birth to the Church, the Body of Christ, and to be God’s presence with us always. What a plan! As a matter of fact, the Greek word for “mystery” does mean plan. The plan is not that we understand this fully in our heads or just theologically, but that we enter into a deep, personal and intimate love relationship with our God—that we see ourselves as beloved children of the Father, genuine sisters and brothers of Jesus, and the dwelling place of the Holy Spirit. Those are matters of the heart. Those are all about love. And, that is who God is—pure **LOVE**. Love unites as one.

Monday is **Memorial Day**. There are a number of “Summer starts”, and Memorial Day is certainly one of them. Things are looking up in many ways. Some things we never really have control over—like the weather—but good times are definitely ahead. So, let’s rejoice, celebrate, “smell the flowers”, and allow our entire beings to be renewed and refreshed. On this national holiday, I urge you to not lose sight of what this day of remembering is all about. Certainly, we remember all our departed loved ones. In a special way, we remember all those who gave their lives for our country in the military, as first responders and medical professionals, and perhaps uniquely this year, all those who lost their lives to the virus. Although Memorial Day is a good time for family picnics and fun activities, we urge you, if at all possible, to come to Mass **“to remember”**. Mass is celebrated here at 9 am. Also, we are able to return to **All Souls Cemetery** for a very special outdoor Mass at 10am. Kevin and our wonderful Music Ministry will be providing the music—as they have for many years now. The location has been changed to close by the cemetery office, but I am sure there will be clear directions and easy enough parking. Bring a lawn chair and remember your loved ones, whether they are buried at All Souls or not. This truly is a most beautiful and meaningful way to begin this holiday. I would love to see you there.

This past Friday was the **last day of school** for St. Gabriel and

for many schools. Our eighth graders graduated this past Wednesday, and we are so proud of them and wish them well as they prepare to move on to high school. Our prayers extend to all who are graduating from any school at any level. “Commencement” is all about preparing for a new beginning. May that beginning and all that follows be filled with God’s grace and direction. For St. Gabriel School and Learning Loft, like just about every school, this has been a very challenging year. However, our teachers, staff and administration have risen to the challenge, and this has been a year of excellence on every level. It has been a year of great growth, exciting new ways, a very contagious, positive spirit, and most importantly for us, growth in faith and in experiencing how good our God is. I pray that everyone’s Summer vacation is filled with fun times, opportunities to rest and relax, ways of renewing our spirits, and a growing awareness of the goodness of God. Thanks to all for a phenomenal, over-the-top, school year. On to new adventures and heights!

This coming Saturday is our **FESTIVAL—Welcome Home—Family Picnic**. 
GIFT BEARERS

WELCOME HOME!

It is with joy and gratitude to our loving God that we are moving beyond the worst of the coronavirus pandemic and entering a more normal time both in our communities at large and in our parishes. We want to share with you a summary of the guidelines that we received from Bishop Malesic as they apply to St. Gabriel Parish. These guidelines will take effect on the weekend of June 5/6. As in all things, good judgment and respect for others, as well as yourselves, should be paramount for each individual. We thank everyone for your flexibility, fidelity, patience and generosity during this past year and going forward.

Face Masks – Face masks are no longer required, but strongly suggested for those who have not received the COVID-19 vaccine.

Social Distancing – Social distancing is no longer required and the use of all seating areas is permitted.

Holy Water – The use of holy water fonts is permitted. As pre-COVID, our receptacles as well as the baptismal font are cleaned and sanitized regularly.

Liturgical Processions – Liturgical processions are permitted, including offertory processions and bringing up the gifts.

Offertory collection – Passing the baskets during the Offertory is permitted. There will still be one basket on a back table for those who wish to put their offering in as they arrive.

The Sign of Peace – The Sign of Peace is permitted. It should be exchanged without physical contact between persons who are not of the same household or family, or as each recipient feels comfortable.

Liturgical ministers – Liturgical ministers are permitted, including altar servers, cantors and choirs.

Holy Communion – The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended until further notice. It is highly recommended that one receives Holy Communion in the hand, but anyone choosing to receive on the tongue should proceed to the end of the communion aisle in the center, as the diocesan guidelines say that the minister, ordained or lay, must immediately sanitize his/her hands.

Communion to the Homebound – Clergy as well as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are permitted to bring communion to the homebound, hospitalized and nursing home residents (where permitted) if the homebound person is comfortable.


Greeting of the faithful – Clergy and Greeters may greet parishioners.

Hymnals – Hymnals (Breaking Bread Books) may be returned to the pews.

Cleaning of the church – General cleaning of the church, restrooms and door handles will take place on a regular basis. It no longer will be necessary to have the deep cleaning, sanitizing procedures after every use, but we will sanitize periodically.

Entrance Hand Sanitizers – We will continue to have hand sanitizers at the church entrances and other public meeting spaces.

Online Mass – We will continue to offer viewing Mass online for those who are unable to attend each Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation once the obligation is reinstated on June 5/6. Weekday Masses will also continue to be videoed.

As Bishop Malesic said, “we are excited to gather together in person without restrictions in our parish churches, most fittingly on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 5/6. We ask the intercession of St. Joseph through his fatherly care and protection, that we might experience a renewal of faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.” Your St. Gabriel Parish Family welcomes you with open arms and all of our love! “This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us be glad and rejoice in it!”

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

Following the directives from the Diocese, we are now able to resume taking communion to the homebound for those requesting it. Eucharistic ministers should be vaccinated. Parishioners who are homebound and who would like to receive Holy Communion should call Maureen Dowd at the Parish Office (440) 352-8282. Any Eucharistic minister who would like to resume the ministry of taking communion to the homebound should also call Maureen Dowd to go over procedures. We will again have a log book in the main sacristy indicating the name/address of the homebound person as well as the Eucharistic minister.



LITURGY CORNER

As we celebrate Memorial Day on Monday this week, before we fire up the grill and begin the summer picnic season, we need to remember what Memorial Day is all about. It's our opportunity to remember, and honor, those that have given up their **lives** so that we can enjoy the freedoms we have in our country. It also is an opportunity for us to remember those that have gone before us in our families. Attending Mass on Memorial Day is a great way to spend some time honoring, and praying for those who have gone before us. We'll be having a special Memorial Day Mass at 9am at St. Gabriel. In addition, we will be having a 10:00am Mass at All Souls Cemetery in Chardon. Bring your lawn chair.

ALPHA

You've probably no doubt heard about Alpha, frequently mentioned here in the bulletin or during announcements at Mass. St. Gabriel has been offering Alpha courses for two and a half years and nearly 400 people have gone through it. Alpha provides an opportunity for people to ask questions and discuss issues related to their faith. It explores Christian fundamentals and takes its participants to the very basics of Christianity. It's designed for anybody, and all are welcome, regardless of faith background.
