I believe that Pilate knew and was conflicted and too weak to really acknowledge that Jesus is the true King of the Universe. Understandably, what kind of King wears such ordinary garb with just sandals on His feet? What kind of King has a crown woven from thorns and smashed in His head with blood flowing down His face? What kind of King has a cross as His throne and ultimately, though completely innocent, is crucified unto death? It is Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, whose Solemnity we celebrate this last Sunday of the liturgical year. LITURGY CORNER

This Sunday, the Feast of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, marks the last Sunday of this liturgical year. Next Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent

begins a new liturgical year. But this feast of Christ the King is very important. In the readings, we are reminded that the Kingdom that Jesus brought is unlike any "kingdom" we know in this world. 

Society of St. Vincent de Paul St. Gabriel Conference 2024 Report to Parishioners


"Whatsoever you did to the least of My brothers and sisters, you did it to Me."

(Matt 26:45)

Our 2024 Activity Report

"My God... My God... Why have you forsaken me?" (Matt 27:46) These are the words spoken by Jesus shortly before he faced his bodily death. These are the same feelings of hopelessness all too often experienced by the needy. The basics of life such as food, clothing, shelter, and medical care are needed by all people. Some of our neighbors struggle to find their basic needs to survive. Thanks to your generosity we have been able to fulfill some of those daily needs.

During our past fiscal year (October 2023 through September 2024), our SVdP volunteers fielded hundreds of calls for assistance. Calls ranged from 3 to 12 per day. Of these, we accepted 295 cases, which provided help to 665 people. Many calls were referred to other area churches, agencies and ministries. This year we saw an increase in rent requests, while some government programs helped with utilities.



St. Gabriel parishioners contributed about \$79,500 to our conference via regular collections. This, combined with fundraising from the Mission <u>Circle</u>, <u>Tailgates</u> & Touchdowns and the Good Shepherd Walkathon, as well as other income from neighboring SVdP conferences and a very generous benefactor, allowed us to help our neighbors with over \$96,000 of support. Our operating expenses totaled just 0.35 % to cover postage, office supplies, and other items.

We provided over 2,800 hours of service and traveled about 2,700 miles in service to our neighbors.

In addition to the above, our conference conducted a School Supply drive, a Blanket Sunday collection, and the annual Share—A—Christmas campaign. The School Supply drive, in cooperation with many other area churches and businesses, provided supplies to about 1,600 needy Lake County children. The Blanket Sunday collection, in conjunction with St. Mary's (Painesville) and the St. Gabriel Food Pantry, provided blankets and bedding to almost 350 people. Share-A-Christmas helped approximately 300 families in our area.

We can only help when we have the means to do so. Your contributions help us help others. Remember, as Jesus said, "whatsoever you did to the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it to me".

Thank you for all your support.

How do we help?

Money entrusted to us is used to help the needy with utilities, rent, food, gasoline, repairs, and other needs. We coordinate with other agencies to assist our neighbors with these and other needs such as clothing or furniture. We work closely with our Food Pantry, the St. John Vianney Furniture Bank, and other ministries.

Discussions with our neighbors are always confidential, and include an overview of needs, current financial situation, and sources of help.

Typical people served in 2024 include families facing eviction or utility disconnection; the disabled; parents who have lost their jobs; and single mothers struggling to make ends meet.






