My Sisters and Brothers,

Who really is the King? That is the question that Pilate is asking in today's Gospel. I believe that Pilate knew and was conflicted and too weak to really acknowledge that Jesus is the true King of the Universe. Understandably, what kind of King wears such ordinary garb with just sandals on His feet? What kind of King has a crown woven from thorns and smashed in His head with blood flowing down His face? What kind of King has a cross as His throne and ultimately, though completely innocent, is crucified unto death? It is **Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**, whose Solemnity we celebrate this last Sunday of the liturgical year. As Jesus was brought before Pilate for interrogation, I always felt that Pilate knew this wasn't right, but for political reasons and to safeguard his precious reputation, was willing to go with the unfair condemnation of Jesus and His subsequent death. Jesus, as He always did, was faithful to the truth, even though He knew it would mean enduring the excruciating passion and death on the cross. He said something to Pilate that all of us need to heed, especially in the most difficult decisions that we are faced with, and that is, "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice". Being a person of honesty, integrity, and moral value may not be popular, convenient, and may be at great cost. However, this is what gives credence to the Lord's words at another time that, "The truth will set you free". Perhaps not your physical self, but certainly your soul and spirit. In the end, that's what really matters. The shortest and perhaps most powerful homily I ever heard on this feast simply said, **"If Jesus is your King prove it"**.

This Sunday, today, we offer a very special two-hour program for those who are grieving the loss of a loved one entitled, **Hope for the Holidays**. The program begins at 1:30 pm and takes place in the Community Room (lower level of the Parish Life Center), and the chapel, and is open to anyone who faces the coming holidays with the pain of losing someone significant in their lives. Everyone is welcome, so just come and bring anyone you would like to share in this very special time. If possible, and I know this is the day, let us know so we can be prepared. And above all, please keep all people who are grieving or going through difficult times in your prayers.

This Thursday, of course, is **Thanksgiving Day**. How great it is to gather with family and friends to share this special meal and to give thanks to God for so many blessings. There is no better way to offer thanks on this special day than to gather at the **Table of the Lord** at 9 am to celebrate the **Eucharist**. As I am sure you are aware, the word "Eucharist" means "Thanksgiving". We are so blessed in so many ways, and Eucharist is our very best way of offering our thanks to God. We give our St. Vincent de Paul Society the entire Thanksgiving Day collection to support their meaningful, Christ-like work on a daily basis for the poor and needy of our area, along with our prayerful and financial support. We are very grateful. So, "Come to the Table of Plenty", and have a wonderful Thanksgiving celebration.

Next weekend, we begin the beautiful season of Advent, the month of December, and a new liturgical year. This year, we are privileged to host the 74th annual presentation of **Handel's Messiah** in our church at 4pm. This magnificent and holy presentation is directed by our own Kevin Donahue and includes many of our own parishioners and musicians, as well as choir members from churches throughout northeastern Ohio. It is free to all and usually very crowded with people from all over. You are cordially invited to come and make this a very special part of your Advent preparation. Also, please be as welcoming and hospitable as you can be to our many guests.

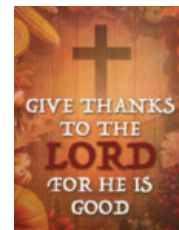
Our **Advent Communal Celebration of Reconciliation** will take place at St. Mary Parish in Chardon on Monday, December 16th, at 7:00pm, along with St. Patrick's in Thompson and St. Anthony's in Fairport Harbor. St. Mary's really isn't that far (barring a huge snowfall), so I hope you can get this on your calendar and plan to come. Fr. Joshua and I will be there along with several other priests from the area. Now, I know for some Chardon sounds like it is on the other side of the world. It really isn't. Depending on where you live, it is probably somewhere between a ten to twenty minute ride. Perhaps car-pooling could be helpful. Please try not to wait until the last minute to come. There will be the very limited times we will have here, as well as the limited availability of priests. We will host the Lenten Communal celebration here this coming year.

As Advent soon approaches, December 1st, only good planning and clear priorities will help to temper the holiday frenzy and lead us to a more balanced time that allows us to focus and experience the peace and joy of **EMMANUEL—God with us**—in a deeper and even more meaningful way. I really encourage you to set aside some time for quiet prayer, reflection, and pondering the gift of Christ's presence in your life. Come on Sundays for Eucharistic Adoration and Night Prayer (December 8th, 15th, and 22nd). Connect all the "Christmas stuff" with Christ as best as possible. And, if it just doesn't connect, you may need to re-think its place. Make time for the things that really matter, the things that last forever. Simplify in order that you might multiply the meaning.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of **Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**, take time to sharpen your focus on who really is the King. Number One in your life, and make sure your life reflects that belief in every way. This is a time to continue giving thanks and using the gifts God has blessed us with for the good of others, especially those less fortunate, and for continuing to find ways to do our part to help the Church to grow stronger and more vibrant. May God bless you at this "thanksgiving time" and reward you for all the ways you share your gifts for God's glory. Peace be with you.

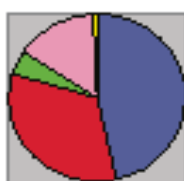
Society of St. Vincent de Paul St. Gabriel Conference 2024 Report to Parishioners

"Whatsoever you did to the least of My brothers and sisters, you did it to Me."
(Matt 26:45)

Our 2024 Activity Report

"My God... My God... Why have you forsaken me?" (Matt 27:46) These are the words spoken by Jesus shortly before he faced his bodily death. These are the same feelings of hopelessness all too often experienced by the needy. The basics of life such as food, clothing, shelter, and medical care are needed by all people. Some of our neighbors struggle to find their basic needs to survive. Thanks to your generosity we have been able to fulfill some of those daily needs.

During our past fiscal year (October 2023 through September 2024), our SVdP volunteers fielded hundreds of calls for assistance. Calls ranged from 3 to 12 per day. Of these, we accepted 295 cases, which provided help to 665 people. Many calls were referred to other area churches, agencies and ministries. This year we saw an increase in rent requests, while some government programs helped with utilities.

St. Gabriel parishioners contributed about \$79,500 to our conference via regular collections. This, combined with fundraising from the Mission Circle, Tailgates & Touchdowns and the Good Shepherd Walkathon, as well as other income from neighboring SVdP conferences and a very generous benefactor, allowed us to help our neighbors with over \$96,000 of support. Our operating expenses totaled just 0.35 % to cover postage, office supplies, and other items.

We provided over 2,800 hours of service and traveled about 2,700 miles in service to our neighbors.

In addition to the above, our conference conducted a School Supply drive, a Blanket Sunday collection, and the annual Share-A-Christmas campaign. The School Supply drive, in cooperation with many other area churches and businesses, provided supplies to about 1,600 needy Lake County children. The Blanket Sunday collection, in conjunction with St. Mary's (Painesville) and the St. Gabriel Food Pantry, provided blankets and bedding to almost 350 people. Share-A-Christmas helped approximately 300 families in our area.

We can only help when we have the means to do so. Your contributions help us help others. Remember, as Jesus said, "whatsoever you did to the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it to me".

Thank you for all your support.

How do we help?

Money entrusted to us is used to help the needy with utilities, rent, food, gasoline, repairs, and other needs. We coordinate with other agencies to assist our neighbors with these and other needs such as clothing or furniture. We work closely with our Food Pantry, the St. John Vianney Furniture Bank, and other ministries.

Discussions with our neighbors are always confidential, and include an overview of needs, current financial situation, and sources of help.

Typical people served in 2024 include families facing eviction or utility disconnection; the disabled; parents who have lost their jobs; and single mothers struggling to make ends meet.

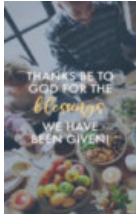

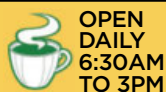
