Reconciliation:

The sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated every Saturday from 3:45 - 4:30 pm, or by appointment.

Diocesan policy directs couples to arrange for marriage at least six months prior to the intended wedding ceremony. Please call the priest or deacon of your choice for an appointment to make arrangements.

My Sisters and Brothers,

We celebrate the great feast of PENTECOST—the birthday of the Church, OUR birthday. To put this in proper context, Pentecost ranks right up there in importance with Christmas and Easter. With this great feast, we bring the Easter season to its culmination as we recall how the Holy Spirit came down upon the apostles and literally transformed rather ordinary and often weak people into courageous, authentic, and tireless witnesses of the Risen Lord. It is the same Holy Spirit that has been given to us through Baptism and Confirmation—not one bit less—that is intended to transform us to do the same kinds of things in our place and time as the apostles and disciples of the early Church did to spread the Good News. There are certainly differences in how it is done and what we may have to put up with and sacrifice for, but even more importantly, there are some common elements that remain the same. First is commitment and conviction that Jesus is truly alive and with us. Second is the willingness to come out of our comfort zones and be witnesses and heralds of the Good News, especially in a culture where it may not always be well received or even understood, but without a doubt in a time What a great time for us to be celebrating our Summer Kick-off when it is tremendously needed. And third, we need to be willing martyrs. How fitting.

If this be the birthday of the Church, then how fitting it is to honor our Blessed Mother in conjunction with this feast. On Monday, we celebrate the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. There is no one who gives us the example of a true disciple of Jesus better than His very own mother. Mary's "yes" to God's call, even though it did not make perfect sense to her and caused her to have to change her own plans, brought salvation into the world. Although May is behind us, I pray our devotion and imitation of Mary will never be over. Ponder her example and let it speak loudly and boldly to your life in Christ. There are many Marian devotions and reflections aimed at Have a great week. Celebrate who we are as the Church of God, helping us become better followers of her Son. In the end, discipleship is the greatest and most valid way of measuring the value of Mary in our lives. Mass here on Mondays is at 7 am. great Summer. Peace. There are other times in other parishes around here. What better way to honor Mary than to receive her Son, much like she did, and then bring Him to others. I also encourage you to come and pray at our beautiful Marian Shrine.

Pentecost is a special day for our Neophytes, those initiated into the Church at this past Easter Vigil, as well as those in past years who were a part of our RCIA (now OCIA) journey of conversion. Again, it is a time for celebration, as well as a time to renew our commitment to use our gifts in response to God's call, and to help to continue to build up the Body of Christ. When I look out at our parish family and remember people who were initiated into the Church through the RCIA, I am overwhelmed at how blessed our parish is and in so many ways. However, that is also true of so many of you, regardless of when or where you were initiated into the Church. You will note that our beautiful and powerful Paschal Candle has burned at every liturgy throughout the Easter season. After Pentecost, we return the candle to its usual place by the Baptismal Font to burn for all baptisms and funerals. And as we officially conclude this OCIA journey for this year, I sincerely want to thank Maureen Dowd and the entire team for the outstanding love, care, support, and witness of what it means to be a faithful disciple of the Lord and model of Catholic Christian life. You are so good. We are so blessed. Alleluia!

Happy Pentecost Sunday! We conclude the Easter season this weekend and celebrate the day that many consider the birthday of the

Church. Jesus had already begun the Church with His ministry and had already designated Peter as its leader. But what were the disciples doing in the Upper Room on Pentecost? They were hiding. They were fearful of what the Jews and Romans might do to them if they were found. Then something dramatic happened. God sent the Holy Spirit down to the disciples. With the Spirit present in each of them, they shrugged off their fears and went off to fulfill Jesus' Great Commission to "Go out and make disciples of all nations. . ." (Matthew 28:19). We can question whether the Church would even be here today if it weren't for the Holy Spirit moving in each of the disciples. Through our Baptism and Confirmation we have all received the same Holy Spirit. Knowing that through our relationship with Jesus, He is by our side and we can use the strength and inspiration of the Holy Spirit to be today's disciples. We are the Church. It's up to us to help it grow.



OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) Are you interested in finding out more about the Catholic Church?

Is your spouse, fiancé, neighbor, or friend interested?

Formerly called, RCIA, the Church has renamed the process for becoming Catholic, The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, as there are several Rites that are part of the process, and they are ordered as Inquirers discern their journey toward initiation.

The OCIA process enables those who are interested in finding out more about the Catholic faith to come and "find out what it is all about." Most often, people join us because they are invited. Be the voice of Christ and offer the first invitation. The OCIA Process is for unbaptized, those baptized in another faith tradition, as well as adults who have been baptized Catholic and have not celebrated the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. 






FRIENDLY REMINDER HANNAH'S HOME BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN




