PARISH UPDATE

Pentecost is Next Weekend!:

The Birthday of the Church and an Opportunity to Welcome and Invite

Next weekend (May 22 and 23) is the Solemnity of Pentecost, which concludes the 50 days of the Easter Season. It is a celebration of the Holy Spirit's descent onto the early Church, and the Spirit's presence in our Church today. It is often known as the "birthday" of the Church - it is the Holy Spirit that makes us Church, transforms us, and gives us energy to live the mission of Jesus. And, guided by the Holy Spirit, we are called to do what the earliest disciples did: invite and welcome others into our community.

We would like to encourage you to invite someone to come to Church with you next weekend. Perhaps you have a friend or family member who has been searching for faith during the pandemic, and your invitation is exactly what they need. St. Michael's is always welcoming new members and visitors - we will celebrate this in a special way next weekend!

Mass Times and Overflow Seating: This summer, Mass will continue at our normal times: Saturday at 4pm and Sunday at 8:30am, 11am, and 5:30pm. We continue to offer overflow seating in the gym (with video streaming and Communion) at our 4pm Mass and both our Sunday morning masses. We may invite parishioners into the gym if the church fills, and it is also a great option for those who feel more comfortable with a bit more social distance (but everyone's doing a great job maintaining social distancing and mask protocols at all our Masses!). In the summer months, we plan to use a different room for overflow seating - details to come.

Eucharistic Chapel Window and Adoration at the Window:

Please see the special page in this bulletin about the installation of our beautiful new Eucharistic Chapel Window. Adoration at the Window will continue during this work, in the lower parking lot on Thursdays - but the Eucharist will now be visible in the first floor window directly under the current window.

ROSARY - SUNDAYS IN MAY

Throughout the month of May (which is dedicated to Mary), we are praying the rosary on Sundays at two times. Join us on Sunday mornings at 8am in the Church (before the 8:30am Mass). Additionally, we are resuming our pre-pandemic custom of praying the rosary after the 5:30pm Mass, in the chapel.

Hospital Visits

Deacon Pete Pohl has resumed hospital visits to Aultman Hospital. (He is not yet able to visit Mercy Medical Center). We thank Deacon Pete for his important ministry to the people of St. Michael Church. If you are in the hospital, and you desire a visit from St. Michael parish, please let the hospital know upon admission. Thank you for your understanding as we continue to follow hospital and health guidelines.

Church Teaching on Vaccines: U.S. Bishops write that **receiving vaccines "ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community."** Thank you for being vaccinated, as a way of protecting yourself and your family, and also the most vulnerable during this time of worldwide suffering. Because of the ways in which the vaccines were developed, and with the aim of forming our consciences and culture to promote respect for human life, the bishops ask us to receive the Moderna or Pfizer vaccines if we are given the opportunity to choose a vaccine. But recognizing that often individuals do not have a choice of which vaccine to receive, Bishop Kevin Rhoades, chairman of the USCCB Committee on Doctrine, notes that, "the Vatican has made it clear that all the COVID vaccines recognized as clinically safe and effective can be used in good conscience."

Bishop's Appeal for Catholic Charities and Church - Update:

TEMPORARY RELOCATION OF RECYCLING BINS

This week (beginning May 10th) you will see some temporary changes in the East Parking Lot. Recycling bins will be slightly relocated to clear the way for installation of a concrete pad for recycling. This will improve safety and eliminate the wear and tear on the asphalt. We have received a grant from the Stark Tuscarawas Wayne Recycling Agency that will cover the cost of this part of the project. The change in recycling drop-off and parking is temporary and hopefully only a minor inconvenience. **Update:** We now expect recycling bins to return to their usual location on June 1st. As a reminder the proceeds from our recycling efforts continue to fund the St. Michael Emergency Assistance Program.



EUCCHARISTIC CHAPEL WINDOW

Installation begins this week!

After many years of planning, our Eucharistic Chapel (Tabernacle) window will be installed beginning this week. The installation will continue into the summer. Marchione Studios has created a beautiful design that complements our worship space, including our upper windows, while also creating a "contemplative and serene atmosphere appropriate for the Eucharistic chapel." As previously noted during our Financial report, this project has been fully funded through the generosity of donors as memorial tributes. These are restricted funds separate from our operational budget.



Once installed, we will invite Marchione Studios to offer a presentation. As they write, "The theme of this window is sacrifice, progressing from Old Testament practices of bloody sacrifice, to the New Testament culminating in the Eucharist. A flaming altar represents the immolation of the slain victim in the Old Testament practice. An amphora of wine and two loaves symbolize the gifts of Melchizadek to Abraham" and the "Chi-Rho represents the sacrifice Our Lord on Calvary which becomes our unbloody sacrifice in the Eucharist depicted by chalice and host." All of this is composed with undulating forms and lines, and presented with a lively field of color.

First Reading

Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for “the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

When they had gathered together they asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the

sky?

This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”

which he worked in Christ, raising him from the dead and seating him at his right hand in the heavens, far above every principality, authority, power, and dominion, and every name that is named not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things beneath his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way.

Jesus said to his disciples: “Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned. These signs will accompany those who believe: in my name they will drive out demons, they will speak new languages. They will pick up serpents with their hands, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not harm them. They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.”

So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God. But they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs.
