PARISH UPDATE

PENTECOST WELCOME!: On this Feast of Pentecost, the Birthday of the Church, we are pleased to welcome visitors and express gratitude to all our newly registered parishioners. Please see the special page in this bulletin, and welcome to all!

IMPORTANT WORSHIP UPDATES

The Diocese of Youngstown has released new guidelines for our liturgies, in light of new health orders from the State of Ohio and guidance from the CDC, as well as good news about the efficacy of the vaccines, more people being vaccinated, and a reduction in infections. At St. Michael's, we are therefore following diocesan guidance and implementing these measures - with a huge thank you for all you have done to make our parish a safe place to worship during the pandemic, and with the aim of continuing to make our parish a welcoming and reasonably comfortable environment for all.

Facial Coverings: Those who are fully vaccinated are no longer required to wear facial coverings. As a way of serving all of our parishioners, those serving in various liturgical ministries (including ministers of communion) will continue to wear facial coverings when exercising their ministry. We know that many of our parishioners will continue to wear facial coverings as a way of protecting themselves, their families, and also to show their concern for one another's comfort - we encourage this and thank you for doing so.

Seating: Social distancing restrictions are removed throughout most of the Church, except where noted below.

Sections Reserved for Masks and Social Distancing: Parishioners who continue to wear masks may, of course, sit anywhere in the Church. **Additionally, we are reserving two sections where masks and social distancing will continue to be required: these will be the two sections closest to the Mary statue (along the wall and behind the organist).** These two sections can be easily accessed from the side door into the Church and via the lower and upper parking lots. Going forward, we will evaluate the desire for these sections and make changes as needed. If you sit in these sections, please continue to wear masks and social distance using the designated ribbons, and thank you for accommodating the comfort of others.

Streaming into the Gym / Fannon Center: Parishioners have requested that we continue to stream Mass into a separate room, and we will continue to do so at the 4pm (Saturday), 8:30am, and 11am Masses, with Communion brought from the Church. During May, we will continue to use the Gym, which can be entered via the Bell Tower or Gathering Space entrances. Beginning in June, due to construction, we will begin to stream into the Fannon Center - this room can also be accessed via the Gathering Space, but also via the Parish and School office entrance on St. Michael Drive.

General Obligation to Attend Mass and Various Circumstances: In light of the improving situation, the bishops have reinstated the general obligation to attend Mass beginning June 5th and 6th. Please see their letter in this bulletin. They have also offered guidance about various circumstances where individuals and families may not be able to come to Mass at this time, due to health or significant anxiety. Whatever your personal circumstances, all members of the Body of Christ are precious to us, and we are grateful that you are part of our parish family.

Livestream and Additional Resources: We will continue to stream the 4pm Saturday Mass online, and it will be available throughout the weekend, for those unable to gather at Church at this time. Additionally, we remind you that we continue to print the readings and a form of prayer in our bulletin, and additional resources for keeping the Lord's Day on our website. We look forward to welcoming you back to Mass as soon as you are able, and serving those who are homebound as part of our parish's pastoral care.

Music and Singing: Following diocesan guidelines, singing will resume and we will gradually re-introduce various ways we pray musically, in order to allow for the "full, conscious, and active participation" of the liturgical assembly, and supported by our parish's excellent music ministry.

Collection: We will resume taking the collection in the customary way.

Sign of Peace can continue to be offered via a bow and words of peace (instead of shaking hands)

Distribution of Holy Communion: We will resume the customary communion procession. Those who choose to receive communion on the tongue are asked to receive from the priest, and join the end of the procession as they are able. At the present time, the current environment suggests that reintroducing the reception of the Precious Blood from the chalice by the assembly is not prudent. It is hoped, over time and with improving circumstances, an appropriate and proper reintroduction of the reception of the Precious Blood by the faithful will be possible.

Again, we thank you for your care and empathy for one another during these times, and will continue to assess how we gather and worship as a community.

Church Teaching on Vaccines: U.S. Bishops write that **receiving vaccines "ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community."** Thank you for being vaccinated, as a way of protecting yourself and your family, and also the most vulnerable. Because of the ways in which the vaccines were developed, and with the aim of forming our consciences and culture to promote respect for human life, the bishops ask us to receive the Moderna or Pfizer vaccines if we are given the opportunity to choose a vaccine. But recognizing that often individuals do not have a choice of which vaccine to receive, Bishop Kevin Rhoades, chairman of the USCCB Committee on Doctrine, notes that, "the Vatican has made it clear that all the COVID vaccines recognized as clinically safe and effective can be used in good conscience."





A Novena to St. Joseph



In this year of St. Joseph, St. Michael the Archangel Parish with the help of the Knights of Columbus, will be holding **a nine day novena to St. Joseph**, leading up to Father's Day. **We will start Friday, June 11, at 6:30 PM in the lower Chapel.**

We will START AT 6:30 PM ALL DAYS EXCEPT the Last Day when we will conclude on Saturday, June 19th following the 4:00 PM Mass.

Each day will consist of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary, prayers, reflection on St. Joseph, Litany to St. Joseph and ending with Benediction.

Prayer cards and explanations will be provided and guidance will be given throughout the novena.

WHAT IS A NOVENA, AND HOW DO YOU PRAY A NOVENA?

Simply put, a novena is a prayer that you pray for nine days. This can be nine consecutive days, or as part of regular practice for an extended period of time (e.g. the Fridays of a month for nine months). There are many types of novenas: for example, novenas of preparation (before a feast day), petition (in times of need), mourning, penance, or indulgence. Some novenas may fall into more than one category.

A novena, like the rosary, are often recited with a specific intention or request in mind. Our Catholic faith discourages superstition – praying a novena doesn't guarantee that a miracle will occur. Rather, a novena can be an act of devotion you display to God while asking God for a specific need or request.

All novenas consist of prayers. In prayer, we adore God, admit our failures, ask for forgiveness, offer thanksgiving, and ask God for our needs.

CATHOLIC CONFERENCE OF OHIO

The Bishops of Ohio Announce the Lifting of the Dispensation from the Obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation May 13, 2021

As we move beyond the worst of the coronavirus pandemic and access to the COVID-19 vaccine has become more widespread, the time has arrived for the good of all the faithful when the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is no longer necessary.

Together, the Bishops of Ohio have decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the Saturday/Vigil Mass) is to be reinstated (CIC, can. 1247). This will take effect in each of the Dioceses of Ohio the weekend of June 5-6, 2021. As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2181). This includes those who are ill, have *significant* health risk factors or care for someone who is immuno-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons. Nevertheless, these persons should observe the Lord's Day (CIC, can. 1247) and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death and resurrection; an appropriate way to do this is through viewing a broadcast of the Sunday Mass. Masses that are broadcast through various media are not intended as a substitute nor do they fulfill the obligation for the persons who are able to gather for a Sunday celebration and other Holy Days of Obligation. Instead, they are intended for the sick, home-bound, the imprisoned, etc., who are unable to attend Mass in person. Kindly consult your pastor with any specific questions regarding the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

The book of Exodus reminds us to keep holy the Sabbath day (Exodus 20: 8-10). As Catholics, we are invited by God to gather together in community, and participate fully in the Sunday Eucharist, which is the "source and summit of the Christian life." "Participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to his Church. The faithful give witness by this to their communion in faith and charity. Together they testify to God's holiness and their hope of salvation. They strengthen one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2182).

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days is not something God asks of us out of his own necessity to be worshipped, but rather a gift to the faithful for their spiritual well-being, eternal salvation and formation in our relationship with God and one another. To that end, Saint John Vianney rightly asserts, "There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us." The Eucharist is the greatest gift Christ left to the Church—the gift of Himself. There is no substitute for Mass celebrated in person.

We are profoundly grateful to our pastors and all of the faithful for their flexibility, fidelity and great generosity in support of the mission of the Church throughout this unprecedented time. As we prepare for the reinstatement of the obligation to attend Mass, we are excited once again to gather together in person without restrictions in our parish churches, most fittingly on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. As we reflect on our Lord's goodness and mercy in the midst of the sacrifices made during the coronavirus pandemic, we ask Saint Joseph to intercede for us, that through his fatherly protection and care, we may experience a renewal of faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

We welcome you back with great joy and eagerness!





When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together.
