## PARISH UPDATE

**Changes to Mass Procedures:** As previously announced, the Ohio bishops have re-instituted the general obligation to attend Mass beginning this weekend, June 5th and 6th. This weekend is the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, and we are again reminded that the Eucharist is at the center of how we practice of our faith. At the same time, the bishops have offered pastoral guidance for those with health concerns or significant anxiety. The Diocese of Youngstown has also instituted changes to how we gather for worship. Please see the full page in our bulletin about personal considerations and how we are praying at St. Michael's, with the effort of creating a welcoming and reasonably comfortable environment for all. Again, we thank you for your care and empathy for one another during these times, and we will continue to assess how we gather and worship as a community.

**St. Joseph Novena:** Our novena to St. Joseph begins Friday, June 11th, and continues through Father's Day weekend. Participating in this novena is a great way to celebrate this Year of St. Joseph. See the page in this bulletin for more details.

**In Gratitude: Father Patrick Manning and Libby Saxton:** As we announced last week, Father Patrick Manning has accepted a new assignment as sacramental minister at Regina Coeli in Alliance and St. Joseph in Maximo - these two parishes will be served by a lay parish leader. These are temporary assignments, and the next step of the diocese's pastoral plan for eastern Stark County. We are grateful to Father Manning for his dedication to our parish during his time with us this last year, and his long history with us. We know that this relationship with St. Michael's will continue with us in some way, but for now we say thank you. We will celebrate him at the 4pm, 8:30am, and 11am Masses on June 19th and 20th.

**Libby Saxton** has been our Director of Music since 2011, and most recently has served as Director of Music and Liturgy. With sadness, but also gratitude and pride, we will be sending her off to the next step of her ministry journey. She will be serving as a Director of Music for a parish in the Diocese of Toledo. Fortunately, she will be with us until July 18th, which gives us time to thank her for the incredible mark she has made on our community, and all of her hard work.

**Church Teaching on Vaccines:** U.S. Bishops write that **receiving vaccines “ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community.”** Thank you for being vaccinated, as a way of protecting yourself and your family, and also the most vulnerable. Because of the ways in which the vaccines were developed, and with the aim of forming our consciences and culture to promote respect for human life, the bishops ask us to receive the Moderna or Pfizer vaccines if we are given the opportunity to choose a vaccine. But recognizing that often individuals do not have a choice of which vaccine to receive, Bishop Kevin Rhoades, chairman of the USCCB Committee on Doctrine, notes that, "the Vatican has made it clear that all the COVID vaccines recognized as clinically safe and effective can be used in good conscience."

### CHURCH AT HOME COMBINED COLLECTION

This weekend parishes in our diocese will participate in the combined collection for three major **CHURCH AT HOME** ministries. The Catholic Campaign for Human Development provides local diocesan and national support for groups of low-income persons to change their lives. The Catholic Communication Campaign supports the efforts of the Catholic Television Network of Youngstown (CTNY) and other national telecommunications services to help spread the Word of God. The Catholic University of America and Newman Campus Ministries continue the educational programs at the national university of our Catholic Church. Your generous support is greatly appreciated!



# A Novena to St. Joseph



In this year of St. Joseph, St. Michael the Archangel Parish with the help of the Knights of Columbus, will be holding **a nine day novena to St. Joseph**, leading up to Father's Day. **We will start Friday, June 11, at 6:30 PM in the lower Chapel.**

We will START AT 6:30 PM ALL DAYS EXCEPT the Last Day when we will conclude on Saturday, June 19th following the 4:00 PM Mass.

Each day will consist of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary, prayers, reflection on St. Joseph, Litany to St. Joseph and ending with Benediction.

Prayer cards and explanations will be provided and guidance will be given throughout the novena.

## WHAT IS A NOVENA, AND HOW DO YOU PRAY A NOVENA?

---

Simply put, a novena is a prayer that you pray for nine days. This can be nine consecutive days, or as part of regular practice for an extended period of time (e.g. the Fridays of a month for nine months). There are many types of novenas: for example, novenas of preparation (before a feast day), petition (in times of need), mourning, penance, or indulgence. Some novenas may fall into more than one category.

A novena, like the rosary, are often recited with a specific intention or request in mind. Our Catholic faith discourages superstition – praying a novena doesn't guarantee that a miracle will occur. Rather, a novena can be an act of devotion you display to God while asking God for a specific need or request.

All novenas consist of prayers. In prayer, we adore God, admit our failures, ask for forgiveness, offer thanksgiving, and ask God for our needs.

## Summer Solstice Labyrinth Walk Monday, June 21

**6:00 PM**

**A**s we mark the Summer Solstice, we enjoy the most daylight of any time of the entire year. The term "solstice" means "sun stands still." On this day the sun appears to halt in its journey across the sky and changes little in position during the days before and after. The Summer Solstice is a time of light and of fire. It is a time to reflect upon the growth of the season: the seeds that were planted in the earth and the seeds planted in our souls. It is a time of cleansing and renewal. It is a time of love and growth as well. It is the first day of glorious Summer. From pre-Christian and early Christian times, people have seen the Summer Solstice as a time of celebration and thanksgiving.

**The Summer Solstice is a perfect time to walk the Labyrinth** ~ bringing whatever is in our heart ~ to give thanks, to pray for the needs of the world, to meditate, to praise God for the abundances with which we are gifted, to simply be -- and receive what God is speaking to us.

### **How are you doing lately?**



### RETURNING TO MASS - CONSIDERATIONS

In light of the improving situation, the bishops have reinstated the general obligation to attend Mass in-person. They have also offered guidance about various circumstances where individuals and families may not be able to come to Mass at this time: "As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2181). This includes those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immuno-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons." Whatever your personal circumstances, all members of the Body of Christ are precious to us, and we are grateful that you are part of our parish family.



### KEEPING THE LORD'S DAY

For those who cannot be present in person due to health or significant anxiety, we want to help you continue to keep the Lord's Day, as urged by the bishops. ### MASKS - SOME CONSIDERATIONS



Following current health orders, the Diocese of Youngstown no longer requires masks in our churches. Masks are encouraged for those not yet fully vaccinated. We thank all who continue to wear masks for their own protection, for their families, and for the comfort of others. Liturgical ministers will continue to wear masks.

### MASK AND SOCIAL DISTANCE SECTIONS

Masks may be worn anywhere in the Church. Additionally, we are reserving **two sections where masks and social distancing will continue to be required: the two sections closest to the Mary statue.**

In our large space, we hope these sections will be of use to create a welcoming and reasonably comfortable environment for all. If you sit in these two sections, please continue to wear masks and social distance for the comfort of others. We will re-evaluate as we go forward.



Additionally, we are now broadcasting **Mass to the Fannon Center** at the **4pm, 8:30am, and 11am Masses - with masks and social distancing required.** The Fannon Center is easily accessed from our office entrance on St. Michael Drive, as well as via the Gathering Space. Communion is brought to the Fannon Center.

### CHANGES AT MASS AND COMMUNION



**Please continue to offer the sign of peace** in a distanced way, with a bow or friendly wave. **We will begin taking up the collection and receiving Communion** in the way we did before the pandemic (by passing the basket and a Communion procession). For communion, those who choose to receive communion on the tongue are asked to receive from the priest, and join the end of the procession as they are able. We won't be receiving from the Chalice at this time. **Finally, following diocesan guidelines, we are reintroducing singing,** in order to allow for "full, conscious, and active participation."

## First Reading

**Exod 24:3-8**

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us."

Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early the next day,

he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar

and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel.

Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites

For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant:
