FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Beloved: The grace of God has appeared, saving all and training us to reject godless ways and worldly desires and to live temperately, justly, and devoutly in this age, as we await the blessed hope, the appearance of the glory of our great God and savior Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to deliver us from all lawlessness and to cleanse for himself a people as his own, eager to do what is good" (Titus 2:11-14).



The Christmas season officially concludes this weekend with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. While we may have already packed up all of our Christmas decorations and stowed them away for another year, the transitional event in the life of Christ that we celebrate this weekend gives us a chance to pause in our own transition between seasons in order to reflect on what we have just celebrated and what it means for how we live our lives going forward.

At Christmas, we celebrate Christ's coming into our world and our lives. He didn't just come to provide heartwarming images for Christmas cards, though; he came to save us from the powers of sin and death that rule this world. The baby lying in the manger would battle those powers through his ministry of teaching and healing and ultimately conquer them through his cross and resurrection. To do that, he had to grow up, leave his quiet childhood home in Nazareth, and tackle the awesome mission that the Father had sent him to accomplish. That is what we celebrate this weekend, the moment that Christ, the child, became Christ, the man and messiah, assuming the responsibility of his saving mission and beginning his public ministry by passing through the waters of John's baptism, taking his place among sinners, though he himself was sinless, so that he could save us from sin.

Christ's baptism recalls for us the grace and meaning of our own, because it is through baptism that Christ enters our lives. Every baptism is like Christmas as the life of Christ is born within us and we are reborn to a new life, free from sin and open to eternal life. But just like Christ, that new life remains unrealized and incomplete until we make the transition that Jesus did at the Jordan River and assume the responsibility

of the mission that the Father has planned for us. When we receive the life of Christ in our baptism, we receive a share in his mission, and only by prayerfully discerning what that is and striving to carry it out each day, with the help of God's grace, will we realize our new life's full potential.

As we transition this weekend from Christmas to Ordinary Time, spend some time reflecting on Christ's transition through his baptism and ask God to grant us the grace to transition ourselves to ever newer and fuller service of the mission he has given each of us through our baptism.

Preschool News:

St. Boniface Preschool returned from Christmas break on Monday, January 3. We are glad to be BACK!!

Our January religion lessons will focus on Faith. Students will learn that faith is a gift from God, that God wants us to live in faith by trusting Him in all things. The song the students will be singing is "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands."

January is also a time for re-evaluation and reflection. School has been in session for 4 months, and teachers have taken this time to evaluate academic, social, and motor skills for each individual student as well as the classroom as a whole. This is the time of year where classroom curriculums become more customized to meet the needs of all children. Some students may require a more individualized education in academic areas such as simple math or language development while others may need to work on social skills like sharing and communicating effectively with others. These skills are important for children to practice daily. It is part of St. Boniface Preschool's mission to provide opportunities that support development in all areas of growth and learning. Because of our mission, consistent reflection through assessment observation assists in ensuring our program is in fact meeting the needs for successful growth. The mission also requires flexibility and capability of change in the staff to adapt to meet these needs. We are excited to be back with our students and can't wait to see the growth that happens over the rest of the school year!

FAMILY CONNECTION~ Every family has a unique identity that is defined by the behaviors, attitudes, and expectations that govern a family's daily life. This identity is influenced by the family history of the parents, but each family's expression of this history is unique. In today's Gospel, we learn that Jesus' behavior, attitudes, and expectations were governed by his identity as God's beloved Son. In our Baptism, we were made children of this same heavenly Father. This identity as members of the family of God, and as brothers and sisters of Jesus, also shapes our family's daily life.

As you gather as a family, identify some of the expectations and behaviors that govern your family life by answering the question, "What are some of the things that make our family life unique?" Celebrate these things about your family life. Read today's Gospel, Luke 3:15-16,21-22. Observe that Jesus' identity as the Beloved Son of the Father governed his behaviors, attitudes, and expectations. Recall that at our Baptism we were made children of this same heavenly Father. How does this identity as a member of the family of God govern and shape our family life? Conclude in prayer together that we will remain faithful to our baptismal identity as children of God and as brothers or sisters of Jesus. Conclude by praying together with the Lord's Prayer.


