

# **PASTOR'S COLUMN**

I'd like to commend the Garden Club for doing such a wonderful job with the parish grounds this spring. The flower beds look amazing. We are always in need of additional weeders, mulchers, and planters, so please consider joining the Garden Club by contacting the rectory. Many hands make light work.

Inspired by the Garden Club I'd like us to consider the importance of making sure our souls receive the light and nourishment God, the first gardener, wants for us.

Just as plants need to spend time gradually absorbing the light of the sun for their growth, our souls need to spend time basking in the light of Christ's revelation.

Because God is infinite, our souls cannot hope to absorb his truth, goodness, and beauty all at once. We need continual exposure like plants need continual exposure to the source of their sustenance. But if we hide away from the light, we will wither like sick little plants.

The continual exposure, first and foremost, takes place on the Lord's Day. We come to Mass every week, to bask in the light of Word and Sacrament, which we need to nourish us, guide us, strengthen us, and sustain us in the Christian life.

Most people cannot get to Mass every day, but we all certainly need SOME exposure to the light of God daily, as we pray "give us this day our DAILY bread". If you can, get to weekday mass, if not, make sure a day doesn't go by without some reflection on Scripture. Throughout the week try to make a holy hour, read the lives of the saints, study the magisterial teachings of the Church (the catechism and papal documents), and reflect upon the Church Fathers like St. Augustine, St. Ignatius of Antioch, St Justin Martyr, St. Athanasius.

As the evenings grow longer, take a moment after a long day of work to sit on the front porch with the bible or catechism or theological reading on your lap. "Tolle et legge", take and read, as the Holy Spirit told the young St. Augustine before his conversion. Ask the Holy Spirit to illuminate the concrete circumstances of your lives through your reading to help you understand how God is working in your life and moving you to works of sanctity. Ask Him to shed light on the complexity of your life, to grant you clarity and conviction for doing what is right and just.

"Make room in your lives for the Word of God" Pope Francis taught recently. "Each day, let us read a verse or two of the Bible. Let us begin with the Gospel...let us keep it open on our table, carry it in our pocket, read it on our cell phones, and allow it to inspire us daily. We will discover that God is close to us, that he dispels our darkness and, with great love, leads our lives into deep waters." Make time to encounter the Word of God daily in order to hear what God wants to tell you of His love for you and his plans for you, for the glory of God, and salvation of souls.

50 years of marriage during the 2022 calendar


