



Dear Sr. Manners: Should we applaud during the Mass when the choir sings something special? Some people start, but it is always kind of awkward.

Gentle Christian: First, Sr. Manners would like to remind you that Mass is a joyful celebration, instituted by Christ Himself at the Last Supper in remembrance of Him. There are many ways that the faithful are called to express this jubilation, through joyful prayers, songs and other forms for worship. However, it is never appropriate to applaud for appreciation of any of these expressed forms of ministry. The key is to remember that the ministers are sharing with the faithful community the gifts and talents that God has given them, which is to enhance the Mass and lead others to a more "sacred" experience of the liturgy, which leads us to God Himself. Anytime that the congregation applauds, we immediately depart from the sacred realm and abruptly return to the secular world. It would be much more reverent to allow everyone to just experience the profoundness of the moment, in silence, and not cut it short, allowing for a period of meditation in order to fully grasp the holiness of what was just proclaimed.

The same holds true for the priest. One should never applaud after he gives the homily or prayer as that would be ridiculous! Our hands serve us best at Mass when we hold them together silently in prayer. Mass can be noisy enough without adding applause.
