
Holding hands during the Our Fathershould we or should we not?

There have been numerous gueries regarding whether it is appropriate to hold hands during the Our Father. While the Church has not officially prohibited the practice-perhaps because it is an innovation unique to the United States, which developed during the 1960s and '70s-it is suggested that people not hold hands (especially during COVID). The reason is that the Roman Missal does not prescribe a gesture for the people during the Lord's Prayer and the Embolism that follows; it simply states that the priest "extends his hands" (which is not the same as holding hands).

Typically, when the *Missal* expects a gesture or posture for the priest and the people it indicates what this is; here it only says that the priest should extend his hands, and so presumably only the priest should do so. Since nothing is said about the people's gesture, presumably nothing should be done. Neither the Vatican nor the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has authorized the holding of hands during the Our Father.

Thus, the following norm would seem to apply: "The liturgical books approved by the competent authority are to be faithfully observed in the celebration of the sacraments; therefore, no one on personal authority may add, remove, or change anything in them" (Code of Canon Law, canon 826 § 1). On a practical level, many people feel uncomfortable holding hands, and so it seems best to respect this preference.

In addition, those of us seated within close proximity to a gum-chewer are often subjected to chomping, cracking, and noisy chewing, all of which are unpleasantly distracting.

Sr. Manners strongly encourages foregoing this habit before Mass and offering up the sacrifice out of respect for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.
