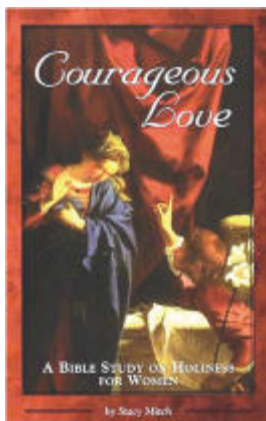
While prayer volunteers may show up at any time, it helps organizers to ensure all time slots are filled if you sign up in advance.

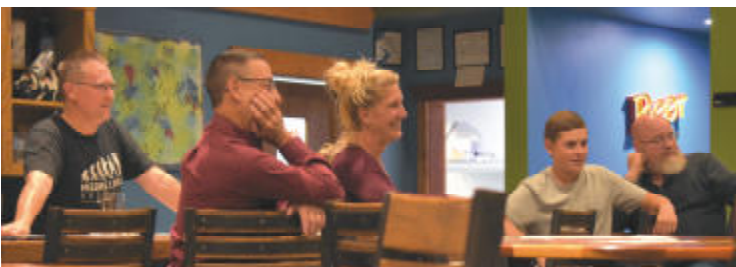

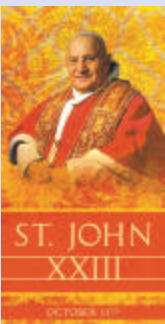

World Mission Sunday: One Sunday for the Whole World

In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday reminds us to rejoice in our unity as missionaries by our baptism.

World Mission Sunday, our annual worldwide Eucharistic celebration for the missions and missionaries of the world, will be celebrated on Oct. 24 this year. That weekend's second collection is a unique, global effort for the entire Church to provide for the building up of over 1,000 local churches in Asia and Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe.

Through the work of these churches, and their witness to Christ, the poor receive practical help and experience God's love and mercy, His hope and peace.

Masks, Vaccinations Encouraged Indoors

Following the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's guidance, Bishop David A. Zubik strongly encourages everyone to get vaccinated and wear a mask at indoor gatherings, including Mass, regardless of vaccination status.

"Our response to the pandemic falls under the commandment, 'Love your neighbor as yourself,'" Bishop Zubik wrote in a letter to clergy.

"For us as members of the Church of Pittsburgh, any response to COVID must be guided by the Catholic social principles of solidarity and the common good. It is impossible in these circumstances to make decisions that affect one person alone. COVID affects

the whole community, so we must act with the whole community in mind."

Currently, all ministers of the Eucharist, ushers and greeters must wear masks while engaging in their ministries.

Masks Must be Worn for Faith Formation and Youth Ministry Classes and Events

Because of the substantial level of community spread of COVID-19, participants in our faith formation and youth ministry programs must wear masks for indoor classes and events.

This applies to all children and adults, regardless of their vaccination status, unless medical or developmental conditions preclude their use.

After the bags were blessed at the school-wide Oct. 1 Mass, a group of students took them to the hospital to be distributed the same day.

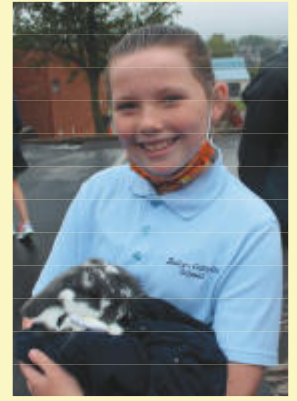
"Everybody in school did something," said Sister John Ann.

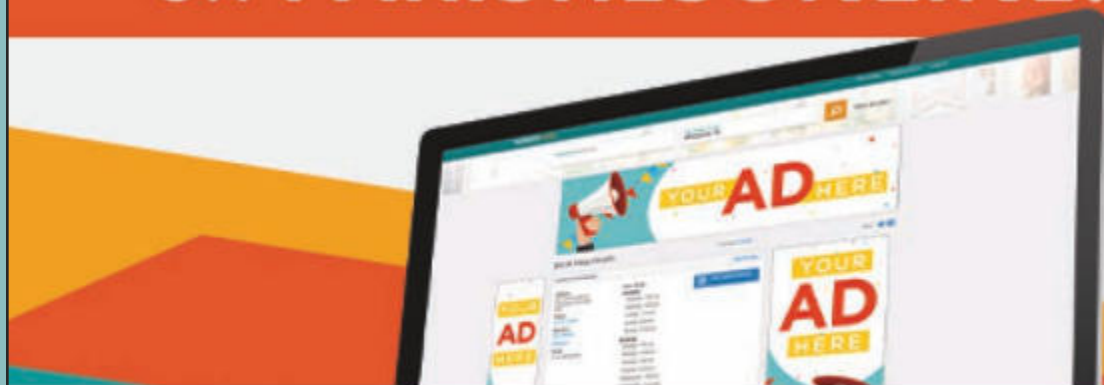


