May we do our best to restore any damages to our family relationships that have occurred over the years, or perhaps only recently, through acts of mercy, forgiveness, compassion.



Online Givers: Be Sure to Set Up Account with VANCO

Do you make your offertory donations online?

If you originally set up your online giving account through St. Michael the Archangel, St. Paul, or St. Peter, you will need to make a change.

All Saints Parish has been working with two e-giving software companies – VANCO Services, LLC and Our Sunday Visitor (OSV) – to process online donations.

All volunteers and employees at All Saints Parish must comply with Safe Environment requirements, which the Diocese of Pittsburgh administers for all of its parishes.

The Diocese now requires recertification training every 3 years on the original Protecting God's Children training. The training is a combined Protecting God's Children Maltreatment 3.2 and Vulnerable Adults Training.

You may have received an email notice from VIRTUS Online regarding recertification online training. VIRTUS is the brand name that identifies best practices programs designed to help prevent wrongdoing and promote "rightdoing" within religious organizations.

You need to go to Virtus.org and log in. Then click on the link that says "a training module has been assigned." The training takes about one and a half hours. Upon completion, please notify Safe

The project allowed students to mesh creativity with science to provide a well-rounded lesson that hit myriad aspects of education.


"They loved it!" Mrs. Friel said. "It was that hands-on effect."


The "edible cells" were briefly on display for
