



Protocol

In this bulletin and on our website we have posted Bishop Zubik's latest update regarding COVID protocol given the recent increase in positive cases.

Please wear a mask if you decide to attend Mass, regardless of your vaccination status.

If you are understandably uncomfortable sitting in one spot surrounded by numerous other people, but still desire to attend Mass, I suggest attending a weekday or Saturday morning Mass because fewer people are in the pews then. For the weekend, our least attended Masses are at 6pm on Saturday and Sunday evenings at St. Paul Church.

In addition to the continued refrain from distributing the Precious Blood, we are also to refrain from the sign of peace during Mass, and the priest or deacon will not even say the words, "Let us offer a sign of peace."

Please do all that you can to remain safe and healthy through these continued challenging times.

Important Covid-19 Protocol Reminders For Mass Attendance

Given the recent record-breaking surge in positive COVID-19 cases, Bishop David Zubik is reminding everyone of the current Diocese of Pittsburgh safety protocols that include wearing masks regardless of vaccination status.

He is doing so to safely continue in-person Masses throughout the diocese. The celebration of the Holy Mass, where we gather to worship God and receive Holy Communion, is the heart of our Catholic faith.

This reminder is also being done as an urgent request for everyone to do their part to remain vigilant and mitigate the spread of the virus.



The current diocesan COVID safety protocols are:

The obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Masses in person – which was restored effective Aug. 15 – remains in effect. Those who are sick, have a health risk, or are a primary caregiver, are excused from this obligation.
Given the high transmissibility rates, mask-wearing is urgently encouraged for all attending Mass regardless of vaccination status.

•Priests, deacons, and all Eucharistic Ministers must continue to wear masks during the distribution of Holy Communion, and at all times except when speaking.

- All greeters and ushers must wear masks while welcoming parishioners, should maintain social-distancing, and should refrain from hand-shaking with fellow parishioners.
- •The practice of extending the Sign of Peace at Mass is suspended until further notice.
- •The distribution of the Precious Blood continues to be suspended until further notice.

"As we mark the end of 2021 and look with hope to a new year filled with God's continued blessings, please join with me in praying for an end to the spread of COVID-19, and for health and happiness for all," Bishop Zubik said.

Safe Environment Clearances Need to Stay Up-to-Date

All volunteers and employees at All Saints Parish must comply with Safe Environment requirements, which the Diocese of Pittsburgh administers for all of its parishes.

The Diocese now requires recertification training every 3 years to follow up on the original Protecting God's Children training that you completed when you first registered on the Safe Environment Database. The training is a combined Protecting God's Children Maltreatment 3.2 and Vulnerable Adults Training.

You may have received an email notice from VIRTUS Online regarding recertification online training. VIRTUS is the brand name that identifies best practices programs designed to help prevent wrongdoing and promote "rightdoing" within religious organizations.

You need to go to Virtus.org and log in. Then click on the link that says "a training module has been assigned." The training takes about one and a half hours.

Upon completion, please notify Safe Environment Coordinator Georgene Natali so she can print your certificate for our All Saints Parish Safe Environment file.

If the recertification is not completed, the individual will be considered "non-compliant" with Safe Environment requirements and will not be able to volunteer until recertification is completed.

Mrs. Natali will notify you when your Child Abuse History Certification and your Fingerprint/Waiver update are due. Your Pennsylvania State Police Clearance is updated through the Diocese. Please keep in mind that we are required to update those clearances every five years.





New Science Program Challenges Students



"Every student is a scientist and every scientist was once a child, eager to learn!"

Those words from fifth-grade teacher Jennifer Friel illustrate the potential of a new science program for fourth and fifth graders at Butler Catholic School.

The Nancy Larson Science Program challenges students through a combination of rigorous curriculum and hands-on learning. Lessons are built on scientific conversations that encourage students to further their knowledge by using scientific vocabulary on a daily basis.

"The program provides children with scientific discovery, vocabulary, work booklets, and study skills to prepare them for a lifetime of learning and possibly a STEM career," Mrs. Friel said.

Students will have the opportunity to create take-home scientific booklets featuring scientific


reading materials, as well as their own writing, drawings, graphs, and charts. A corresponding website provides resources students can access independently from home.


