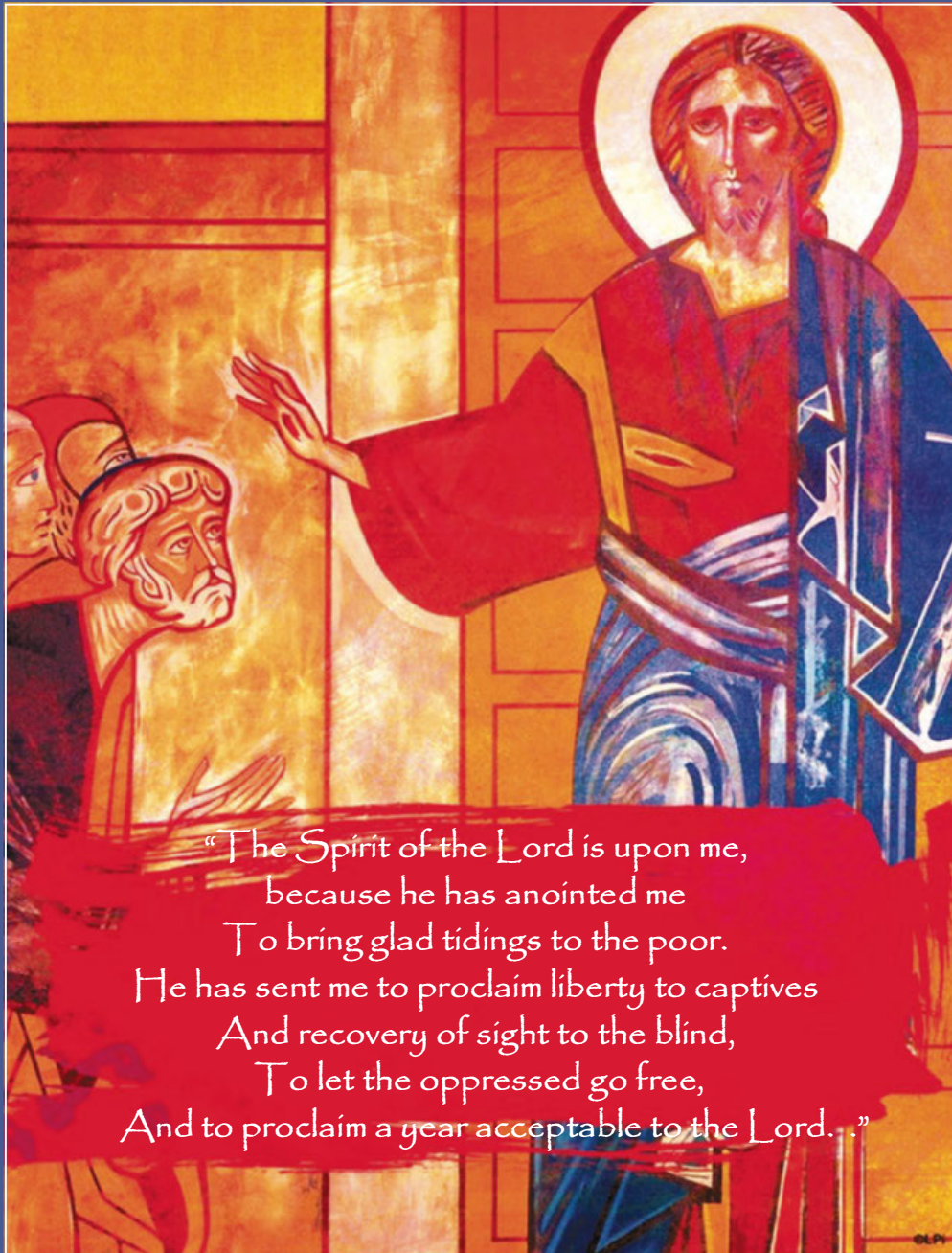

Synod on Synodality

During the next few weeks you will see in this bulletin and on our website more information about the “Synod on Synodality” that Pope Francis is initiating for every Catholic diocese in the world.

Each parish within every diocese is expected to host a session(s) for people to gather and offer their experiences of their Catholic faith and the Catholic Church. These sessions will have a facilitator and notetakers to keep the objectives and flow of the meeting moving in the direction that we have been given by a diocesan committee working on an agenda for us to follow.

Upon completion of the meetings, the notetakers will work with the facilitator to synthesize the conversations and valued input from those people in attendance, and compile this information into a report that will be submitted to the diocesan Synod committee. That committee is then expected to synthesize each parish report, and submit that to a Synod committee in Rome, which will eventually report to the pope.

As you can imagine, this is a very ambitious and global undertaking!

All Saints Parish will host two sessions:

- Monday, February 21, at 6:30pm at St. Michael the Archangel hall
- Sunday, February 27, at 12:30pm at St. Andrew Hall

Each session is to last approximately two hours with an agenda that includes an introduction and welcome, opening prayer, overview of the Synod process, small group discussions on fundamental questions and core topics. The sessions will conclude with what is being called an “honorable closure” and closing prayer.

May we be open to the guidance and wisdom of the Holy Spirit through this synodal process, and at all times in our lives.

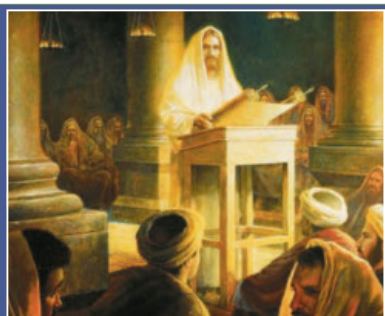

Blessing of Throats on Feb. 3



Our priests will give a general Blessing of Throats on Thursday, Feb. 3, after communion at the 8am St. Paul Mass and the 12:05pm St. Andrew Mass.

Traditionally the Blessing of Throats on the feast day of St. Blaise is done individually with candles placed on either side of a person's throat. Because of COVID concerns, the blessing this year will be a general one to the entire congregation.

St. Blaise is the patron saint of throat illnesses. Legend has it that he miraculously healed a boy who was choking on a fishbone.

Diocese “Urgently Encourages” Churchgoers to Wear Masks

Because of the dramatic surge in community spread of the Omicron variant of the COVID-19 virus, the Diocese of Pittsburgh is “urgently” encouraging those attending Mass to wear masks, regardless of vaccination status.

The diocese recently announced updated COVID-19 safety protocols and said these will be re-evaluated on an ongoing basis as more information from the Centers for Disease Control and local healthcare officials becomes available.

Anyone who is sick, feels they are at risk, or is a primary caregiver, as well as those who have serious anxiety about being part of a large group at this time, are excused from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

All Saints Parish continues to televise and livestream its 10am Sunday Mass and 8am Monday-Saturday Masses on Armstrong Channel 10 and Facebook.com/AllSaintsButler respectively.

During Mass, priests and deacons, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, servers, greeters, ushers, lectors, cantors, and choir members must wear masks.

“As Christians and community members, we have a responsibility to protect ourselves, each other and our neighbors. When we all follow these steps, it will slow this virus, help us keep our churches open and move us toward the day when we can once again associate with others more freely.”

Pope Francis, Bishop Zubik, and other Catholic bishops across the world continue to encourage all who are eligible to get COVID vaccines and booster shots as an act of love for all people, especially the most vulnerable.

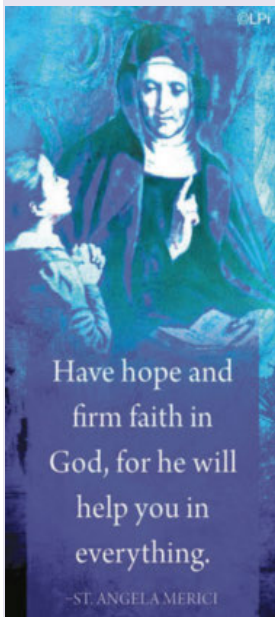
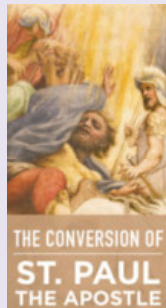

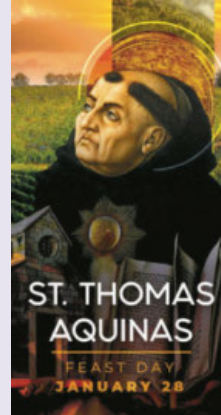

Pope Francis has invited every Catholic to advise him on how to discern the Church's path forward in advance of a 2023 Synod of Bishops.

All Saints Parish invites you to participate in this global process by attending one of two synod sessions that we are holding on the parish level.

The sessions will be held on Monday, Feb. 21, at 6:30pm at St. Michael the Archangel Hall and Sunday, Feb. 27, at 12:30pm at St. Andrew Hall.

Note: If the COVID surge continues and we are unable to meet in person, we will make these sessions virtual.

This journey will conclude in October 2023 in Rome where Pope Francis will listen to bishops who have been listening to their people worldwide.

What is a Synod?

A synod is a meeting of bishops gathered to discuss a topic of theological or pastoral significance, to prepare a document of advice or counsel to the pope. The theme for the upcoming Synod of Bishops is "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission."

The current "Synod on Synodality" is a two-year process of listening and dialogue that began in Rome in October and is now in the diocesan phase. The Diocese of Pittsburgh and dioceses throughout the world are reaching out to the faithful from now through April for their input.

The synodal process moves into its final phase with the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops at the Vatican in October 2023.

Cardinal Mario Grech, the general secretary for the Synod of Bishops, said in a May 21 interview with Vatican News that the synod has been transformed "from an event into a process."

"The Second Vatican Council teaches that the People of God participate in the prophetic office of Christ. Therefore, we must listen to the People of God, and this means going out to the local churches," Grech said.

Pope Francis has frequently discussed the concept of "synodality." The term is generally understood to refer to a process of discernment, with the aid of the Holy Spirit, involving bishops, priests, religious, and lay Catholics, each according to the gifts and charisms of their vocation.
