

Message from Father John Baver

Dear Friends in Christ,



Each year we have the privilege of walking with Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem. We know the story, yet Holy Week is more than a review of well known events; it is an opportunity to deepen our faith, appreciate the sacraments, and let the grace of Christ fill our hearts. At this sacred time of year, consider the following three points as a guide to Holy Week:

- 1. Holy Thursday, the Mass of the Lord's Supper What would you do if you knew you had less than 24 hours to live? Many ideas might fill our minds. Jesus, when faced with this situation, gives us a remarkable example. The Gospel for Holy Thursday always comes from John 13, and describes Jesus washing the feet of all twelve apostles. This includes Judas, who would betray him; Peter, who would deny him; Thomas, who would doubt the Resurrection even happened; and all the others, who ran away from Jesus as quickly as possible. Jesus is teaching us love, service, and sacrifice to the end. Even when nothing is expected in return.
- 2. **The Two Passions** Every year during Holy Week the Passion of Jesus is proclaimed twice; once on Palm Sunday and again on Good Friday. At first glance, this may seem redundant. Yet, we are learning the Gospels are like a multi-faceted diamond. For us to understand the story of salvation, we need all four accounts. On Palm Sunday, we hear the Passion from either Matthew, Mark, or Luke. Because we are currently studying Luke at Sunday Mass, we will hear his account of the Passion. Luke provides us with incredible details only found in his Gospel. While all the Passion accounts describe the threefold denial of Peter, only Luke tells us after Peter denied Jesus a third time, "the Lord turned and looked at Peter." (Luke 22:61) After this poignant moment, Peter, "went out, and wept bitterly." (Luke 22:62) All the Gospels tell us three men were crucified on Good Friday, with Jesus being in the middle. Only in Luke's account do they speak to one another. It is here the "Good Thief" is told, "today, you will be with me in paradise." (Luke 23:43) Finally, while all four Gospels describe Jesus being brought to Pontius Pilate, only Luke has Jesus additionally dragged before Herod. This gives another powerful Roman official a chance to scoff at Jesus, who seems to pale before the might of Rome. Neither Herod nor Pilate, the two most powerful people in this part of the Roman Empire, could have imagined the Empire would turn to dust. Jesus, and the Church he was establishing, would cover the globe, and last until Jesus returns again.
- 3. **The Easter Vigil** The highlight of the Liturgical year is the Easter Vigil. Mimicking Christ in the tomb, the Vigil begins in darkness only to explode in light, life, and joy. Death could not contain Jesus, and the tomb is empty. A special part of the Vigil is when the RCIA candidates are fully initiated into the Church. This year we have a large class of candidates, who will become members of our parish family. As we watch them receive the sacraments, it is a chance for us to remember when we received the sacraments. We are renewed and inspired by these candidates, and witness with joy our parish family growing. Fittingly, after our candidates receive baptism and confirmation, we are all blessed by the Easter water, and renew our baptismal promises.

May this Holy Week be sacred, joyful, and forever hopeful. Happy Easter!
