Peace & Justice: Continue to pray for one another and pray the Rosary! **Know that God loves all of us, no matter what, no matter what we have done, and no matter who we are!** May we take time to share kindness with one another as that is what God hopes for each us to do for our fellow brothers and sisters, and that is what Jesus taught us! Share at least one random act of kindness for someone each day, and without any need for recognition or praise. God knows the love and good care that you have shown! God knows us all very well! Sometimes it is that one act alone that can bring hope to someone who has been in need of a blessing! We can make it through any challenge together by faith and with God!



Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. (Heb. 11:1)

Hope is what we desire to happen. Faith is what we trust will happen. And with God, all is possible!

Social Outreach: Thank you dear parishioners for your support of our SOS Social Outreach's mission to share God's love by serving the needy and homeless in our parish community! Social Outreach promotes SERVICE. We give out bag lunches and prepacked grocery bags of food to help our community's hungry and those struggling to feed their households.

ANY of following food items can help with our Social Outreach's bag lunches and prepacked grocery bags:

- Bottled Water
- Cookies or individualized sweet snacks
- Canned vegetables: green beans or peas

<u>Respect Life</u>: Please pray that human life is never devalued or violated! May we always appreciate the gift of life that God gives all of us! May we trust in His plan where we take care of each other as all life is precious and His love is for all of us! We undermine our commitment to human life and dignity when we fail to see the dignity of those who have a different view-point. We must detach from the bitterness that surrounds us and seek a better path! A commitment to **civil dialogue** and communication can help us make real and authentic human connections, which breaks down the barriers that divide us.



When asked which was the first of all the commandments, Jesus replied the first is this: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' And the second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mk 12: 28-31). Prejudice goes against these commandments of love. Loving neighbors who are different from us through kind and generous actions can be as simple as forming friendships, supporting minority-owned businesses, or participating in community activities with those of other faiths or other races. Loving our God obligates us to love our neighbors as well.

Talking about societal prejudices such as racism, sexism, ageism, or homophobism can be difficult, especially in these politically polarizing times. In *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, the Catholic bishops of the United States urge all people to practice civility, charity, and justice in public life. (Excerpt from www.usccb.org/racism)

Engaging in civil dialogue can help our faith communities create a new space to model love for our neighbors and respect for the dignity of all. Civil dialogue can best be defined as the ability to enter meaningful conversation with people whose viewpoints may be different from our own, who have a different background or experiences, or who come to a different conclusion about the best way to promote the common good. We enter into civil dialogue because we want to build a community that is rooted in understanding one another. God's love for each person requires us to remember that someone who disagrees with us is still a beloved child of God who deserves our love, respect and care.

Just like any authentic human connection, the process of dialogue is complicated, often uncomfortable, and requires vulnerability and trust. We must rely on our faith in Christ who taught us that everyone is truly our neighbor. Promoting civil discourse is one way we can put this teaching into action. This means that we must treat everyone as worthy of being at the table, worthy of our respect, worthy of



being listened to and worthy of being heard. In short, it means treating everyone as our neighbor. (Excerpt from Civil Dialogue: *A response to Jesus' call to love our neighbor; USCCB, www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/faithful-citizenship*)
