


Two Saints, One Heart

This past Monday, January 24, was the feast of St Francis de Sales, the patron. namesake and inspiration of the Oblates of St Francis de Sales. As is our custom, on Sunday all the Oblates in the NW Ohio and SE Michigan gathered together, this year at our parish in Adrian, Michigan to celebrate the feast together. This year was a special gathering because it marked the beginging of a special year for the Oblates. This year, 2022

is the 400th anniversary of the death of St. Francis de Sales (Dec. 28) and the 450th anniversary of the birth of St. Jane de Chantal (Jan. 28). We Oblates are celebrating this as a double Salesian Jubilee. Here are a few thoughts from these two great Saints:

"Fear is a greater evil than the evil itself."

"Let the waves growl and roar all around you, but fear not, for God is there." Francis de Sales

"Courageous feelings do not lie within our power, but courageous conduct does."

"We cannot always offer God great things, but at all times we can offer God little things with great love." Jane de Chantal

Tom Ribits is a fellow Oblate priest and a very good friend. He's an accomplished artist in Buffalo New York and has provided the symbolic logo on the center of the page to honor this double Salesian jubilee year. His explanation says a great deal about the faith and the spiritual relationship shared by the two Saints we're honoring.

Live Jesus. Live in me that I may always live in thee. (based on ideas expressed in letters of Francis de Sales to Jane de Chantal)

Francis de Sales challenges us "to be who we are and to be that well" so that we may Live + Jesus to our fullest nourishment and become for others. We are called to live the Gospel of God. Gospel of a mercy, compassion, reconciliation and forgiveness wrapped in the mantle of Love. This is the foundation of the relationship between Francis de Sales Chantal. and lane de Uniting them was their relationship to Jesus who identifies himself as the way, truth and the life as well as the light who scatters all darkness.

Central to the design of the logo is the circle representing God, total and eternal, the infinite and timeless, the original perfection, the one who is whole and complete yet unbound and unlimited. Within the circle are three

hearts, the largest representing the heart of Christ. Held together by the heart of Christ are the unified hearts of Francis de Sales and Jane de Chantal. They beat as one heart always united in order to Vive + Jesus, to Live + Jesus. V+J defines their mission and raison d'être.

Everything is bound together by the cross through which lesus gave all. By dying to self and surrendering their all, Francis and Jane became fully united in and with Christ. Blue symbolizes the hope of peace in heart, mind and soul. Red represents redemptive love, a passionate embrace of life and the willingness to share that life with others. Goldenrod yellow suggests the hope of light, warmth and wealth of a shared and the kindred spirit. The intent of the logo is to express the bond of love, founded, rooted and maintained in God. This bond united Francis de Sales and Jane de Chantal and enabled them to proclaim to the entire world, "Live + lesus!"

May God be praised!

Take a little time to google the names of these Saints and learn more about their timely, practical, wise spirituality.

In the face of so much division in the world around us, may our hearts be united like the hearts of Francis and Jane. Like them, we'll find the source of that unity in the heart of Christ.

Sunday Salesian Perspective

St. Francis de Sales reminds us that God's words to Jeremiah are words said to us: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you."

God loves us immensely, and he has a plan for each of us. God gave us a share in Jesus' ministry as prophet in our baptism. We have been appointed to remind those around us that God loves all of us and has redeemed us for himself through the blood of Jesus. Because we are baptized, we are called to live in a prophetic way.

We Oblates, as professed religious, have accepted an additional prophetic role. By living faithfully as poor, chaste and obedient men in community, we are to remind our brothers and sisters that God's great desire for union with us extends beyond our earthly life into eternal life. Letting Jesus live in us each day keeps us focused on God's loving presence and his desire to be one with us. We Oblates are called to live in a prophetic way.

St. Paul reminds us that love – God's love within us – is the foundation of our prophetic way of living. When we allow ourselves to be fully embraced by God's love, then God's love can overflow into the world around us.

God's love within us will show itself in our willingness to be patient and kind, our willingness to put others' interests before our own, our willingness to put up with the faults and failings of others. We will be better able to control our anger and choose not to brood over injuries real or imagined. Because we believe that God is present and working in all the events of our day, we are better able to see the possibilities for good and better able to accept the challenges and disappointments of life with a peaceful heart.

Jesus warns us that prophets are not always welcomed and accepted, so we shouldn't be surprised when we aren't. We must learn each day to choose to focus again on God's ever-present, unconditional love and ask for the grace to respond faithfully by loving.

Whenever we feel a little discouraged in our efforts to be faithful prophets, let us place confident hope in the words of St. Paul: "At present, we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face. At present we know partially; then we shall know fully, as we are fully known" by our God. Let us ask for the grace to be a gentle and humble prophet today.
