KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS KNIGHTLY NEWS

October was a very busy month for St. Francis' Knights of Columbus Council 10064. The Fall Meat sales were successfully held from the 23rd through the 25th. Meat fundraising sales were slightly scaled back this quarter due to Covid, but still netted a healthy \$2300 after expenses. The Council earmarked \$800 to the 8th grade funds and \$200 to the Parish Hispanic Mission. Free meat was distributed to several parish families hit particularly hard by the effects of the COVID-19 virus. The Knights of Columbus council greatly appreciates the SFX community support for this important fund-raising event allowing us to fulfill our fraternal mission.



October is Right to Life Month in the Catholic Church. To support this cause, The Knights of Columbus at Saint Francis placed a "Giving Tree of Life" with maple leaves requesting new born needs in the vestibule of the church. While donations were down this year due to the pandemic, the parish response has been overwhelming with hundreds of donations ranging from infant clothing, to beds and their fitted sheet. The staff at Her Choice is very appreciative of the outpouring of generosity from the SFX community as they work to continue the work of Christ's mission by providing counseling, basic subsistence and hope to many mothers and fathers in need of guidance. Donations collected from the Tree of Life during the month of October were a bit down this year due to the pandemic, but your giving spirits shined through regardless.



The Knights also wish to thank those who attended Masses on October 17th and 18th and placed monetary donations in the Tootsie Roll jars outside of the Church doors. Brother Knights and volunteers staffed the tables and showed their spirit by wearing their Knights of Columbus vests stating the purpose of the drive; "Helping Those With Intellectual Disabilities". The Council donated \$200 of the proceeds to The Special Olympics and \$200 to The Nazareth House. Nazareth House is a Diocese of Birmingham program ministering to persons having developmental and intellectual disabilities. Jesus said, "What one has done to the least of my children, you have done unto me." Thank you to all SFX parishioners who supported this very worthy cause.






