John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem

were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledge their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey. And this is what he proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

HOMILY NICENE CREED



Stand Up and Make Your Voice Heard

It is never easy to stand up for something that is not popular. What was it like for the lovers of liberty to stand up against the religious intolerance, racism, hate and violence of the fascist regimes before and during the Second World War? And yet, we know, that people did stand up to them and many gave their lives because, even though they may have been afraid, they wanted to stand for something. What was it like for the democrats of Russia and Eastern Europe after the Second World War to stand up to the Communists, Marxists, and Soviets who promised a workers Utopia and delivered a totalitarian hell? And yet, in spite of their fear, many people raised their voices in a call for liberty, freedom, an end to oppression and political enslavement. Millions were arrested, imprisoned, tortured, executed, and murdered and yet, they were willing to raise their voice. They would not be silent, they would not go quietly, they raised their voices even if it was a cry in the wilderness. What must it be like to be the voice in the wilderness? John the Baptist is one of the great figures of Advent: the voice in the wilderness condemning the evil of his age and pointing to a new begin-

ning. The new beginning is not a King, not an Emperor, not a general, not even a politician. This new beginning is a "lamb." Lambs don't usually grow up to be lions. In John's day, lambs were sacrificed and this is true of the Lamb John points us to: The Lamb of God. This Lamb will be sacrificed, but some things are worth the sacrifice. This Lamb is the Lion of Judah.

In spite of the crowd, the mob, the bullies of social media, and political elites, there always has been, and will be, many courageous voices raised for goodness, truth, freedom, compassion, life and faith. Brave people who would rather suffer than be silent, would rather give their lives than have them have no meaning or purpose. They are not willing to be content living in fear, in the shadows, living in silence and shame. We are called to be such voices for the Lord. We may be sacrificed like lambs, but at least we will have lived like lions. As we begin Advent, we should ask: What do I stand for? Am I willing to sacrifice for what I believe?




