Fr. Ben's Column

Watch over me for “thy sea, O God, is so great, and my boat is so small.”

“Thy sea, O God, is so great, and my boat is so small.” President John F. Kennedy kept an inscribed wood carving with this old Breton prayer on his desk in the Oval Office. It was given to him by Admiral Hyman Rickover who typically gave it to new submarine captains as they began their assignment. The president quoted it when he dedicated the East Coast Memorial to the Missing at Sea on May 23, 1963.



We have all lived through storms, both actual storms that make you feel the world is coming to an end and the figurative storms of life when we feel overcome by darkness and terror and we seem to be sinking and drowning. There have been times when we have all felt that the waves of life were just going to overpower and sink us.

Just like our personal lives the same feelings can arise for communities, parishes, the archdiocese, and even the Church. It can seem, at times, like the storms that beat against us, the winds that prevent us from moving forward, the waves that threaten to sink us are just too powerful and we are going to falter and sink into oblivion. And yet, after all the storms of history, the Church is still here. In a storm, the crew looks to the captain and our captain is Jesus.

In Jesus we find our direction, our hope, our strength, our captain. In Jesus we find the one who calms storms, who settles the waves, and silences the wind. Whether in the Church, archdiocese, our parish, our homes, and especially in our own hearts, it is His voice that we should listen for because His voice calms the storms and silences the wind. Even more, His voice gives us direction, shows us the way, and provides the vision for our future.

In the last year we have been listening closely for this voice of Jesus to show us the way. Although there have been storms and winds, nevertheless, we listen for Jesus' voice showing us the way – through you, His faithful people. I want to thank all those who over the last year have participated in our Vision for Victory program led by the Institute for School and Parish Development (ISPD). The process has been well worthwhile and has given us a strategy for moving forward that is based on the best intentions and hopes of our parishioners. There was tremendous energy and goodwill exhibited in the process and that is surely a sign of the movement of the Holy Spirit.

The first public engagement in the process was the Ultimate Question Survey which helped us identify the areas of parish life that parishioners felt were the most important. Based on the responses, we identified eight areas of challenge which have become the focus of our parish and school renewal. However, other important information was gleaned from this survey which we will also take into consideration as the parish and school move forward creating an even more vibrant community. After the initial survey, over ninety parishioners were engaged in a further refinement and analysis of the eight challenges and they were asked to come up with strategies for achieving the goals identified in the challenges. Last Tuesday, at a parish convocation, parishioners were asked to give their input on the eight challenges and find strategies and solutions to help us achieve our goals.

ALL PARISH VOLUNTEERS/ EMPLOYEES: NEW CHILD PROTECTION PLATFORM

In July 2021 the Archdiocese will be moving to SafeParish as the new platform for Child Protection training and compliance. SafeParish is an organization that specializes in training and education solutions for organizations worldwide. They have 20+ years of experience in providing child safe environment training programs. SafeParish will continue to work with our current background check provider – Selection.com. All training and background information in your current VIRTUS account will be transferred to SafeParish. No new live training through SafeParish will be required if you have completed live child protection training through VIRTUS. Ongoing child protection training will still be required for all volunteers and employees and will consist of quarterly interactive video-based training instead of monthly bulletins.

Once all the local safe environment coordinators have been registered on the SafeParish website, set up as local site administrators, and trained on the SafeParish website and database, SafeParish will send emails to all current VIRTUS account holders with instructions for registering on the SafeParish website. SafeParish will match information entered by each user to data transferred from the VIRTUS database to identify the user and transfer information from their VIRTUS account including background check, B4, training, and monthly bulletin information to their SafeParish account. We anticipate this email and registration process will begin sometime shortly after July 1.

We ask that all our volunteers and employees check your VIRTUS accounts to ensure that the address, phone number, and email address are up to date. If you are behind in any monthly bulletins, please take this time to catch up before the end of June.



Do you remember how it felt to be together?
