MASS PROGRAM

FIRST READING

The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, "Would that we had died at the LORD's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread! But you had to lead us into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!"

Then the LORD said to Moses, "I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not.

"I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites.

Ex 16:2-4, 12-15

Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the LORD, am your God."

In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, "What is this?" for they did not know what it was.

But Moses told them, "This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat."

GOSPEL

When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus. And when they found him across the sea they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus answered them and said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal." So they said to him, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of

God, that you believe in the one he sent." So they said to him, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: *He gave them bread from heaven to eat.*" So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

Fr. Ben's Column

Make a difference for eternity

During my first summer in the United States, I took classes at the University of Dayton during the week and spent the weekends travelling by car to different parishes around the country preaching for the missions – mission preaching. I was in Indiana, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, New York State, and Wisconsin. As we see here at Victory, a preacher makes a presentation, and we give donations to the missions. The preacher is not paid for this mission as all proceeds go to the missions.

For the most part the priests I met along the way were very kind and hospitable. However, there was one that was a standout experience. I went to an old and poor parish in the Archdiocese of Boston. I arrived on Friday afternoon and was met by the pastor and his dog. "Father, I'm so glad you are here. Welcome to St. Peter's" (not the real name). These were the first words the old priest said as the young golden retriever bounced around. He told me to put my bags down and he would show me the church. When we got to the church the dog sat patiently at the entrance from the sacristy to the church and waited for his master's return. When we got back to the rectory the old man turned to me and said: "Father, I have a big favor to ask of you. My sister, who is even older than I am, has been ill and because I'm the only priest here I have been unable to go and see her. Your being here is an opportunity for me to get away and visit her. Would you mind terribly if I was to leave you here alone and take off. I have food and drink in the fridge, the TV is there, and you have your own room and here are the keys to the house and church. Someone will be in to set up for Mass on Saturday and Sunday." I was delighted to help the old man out, so I said, "please Father, you go, take care of your sister." With that, he and the dog went off to care for someone in need.

After the last Mass on Sunday the old priest was waiting in the sacristy as I came off the altar. He was overjoyed to have seen his sister. I got my bag and he walked me to my car. The pastor said to me "now Father, the collection will be sent to the mission office, and we will take care of that." Then he handed me an envelope and said: "But Father, what's in this is for you personally. It is not for the missions. It is for you. We can't thank you

enough for taking time and coming to be with us and for allowing me to visit with my elderly sister. God bless you Father." And with that we said goodbye. I drove from Boston to Dayton that afternoon. When I got "home" I opened the envelope that old man had given me to find a substantial gift and a kind thank you note.

The kindness of that old man made such an impression upon me that I made a vow to do the same thing for visiting priests when I had the opportunity. Also, my first dog in the States was a golden retriever. Strange how impressions have lasting effects.

The impression that this old priest's kindness, generosity, and compassion along with his obvious love for the priesthood, his family, and people made such an impact on me that it is like a treasure he has passed on. His goodness moved me. The financial gift is long gone but the impression will be with me as long as I live, and if I have an impact on others, it will live even longer. In God's heart, however, this old Boston priest's kindness will live for eternity and because of it, this old priest will live for eternity with God. Now that is a treasure worth having.

The crowd in today's Gospel story asks: "What must we do to perform the works of God?" Jesus tells them that believing in Him and building His Kingdom is doing the works of God. Investing in eternal things is the only investment worth making if we want to have eternal happiness.

What will be your lasting legacy? Surely not the things of this world! We cannot take the things of this world with us, and eventually all the things of this world will pass away. In the end, even gold, silver, and diamonds will be melted away and will explode into a billion pieces of dust. All that will last will be the things that God treasures in his heart. And what God treasures is us, the love we shared, and the good we have done for others.

Institute for Parish and School Development (ISPD) Update

Last week, ISPD delivered their final report called the "Strategic Plan for Development and Stewardship." This plan is based on all the data provided from interviews, the ultimate question survey, convocation, and group meetings. At this stage, four leadership groups will be formed, each taking two of the eight challenges identified by parishioners as priorities. These four leadership groups will review all the data and recommendations in the "Strategic Plan for Development and Stewardship" and will make recommendations to the pastor, principal, and parish leadership for moving the parish forward on our priorities. Many of the ideas gleaned from parishioners' comments, recommendations, and suggestions will find a place in these recommendations. At that point, we will publish our strategic plan to the parish. Each year we will have an 'ultimate survey' of parishioners to review how the plan is operating and to identify new areas of excellence and mission.



In July, the Archdiocese moved to SafeParish as the new platform for Child Protection training and compliance. All volunteers and employees whose accounts were active in Virtus received an email from SafeParish with instructions for registering on the SafeParish website. SafeParish will continue to work with our current background check provider – Selection.com. All training and background information that was in your Virtus account will be transferred to SafeParish. No new live training through SafeParish will be required if you had an active Virtus account and had previously completed live child protection training through Virtus. Ongoing child protection training will still be required for all volunteers and employees and will consist of quarterly interactive video-based training instead of monthly bulletins.
