Fr. Ben's Column

In time you envy less as you appreciate more

It is not unusual for people to envy others for what they think they have or even to covet (desire) what others possess. When I was a child, it always seemed to me that our neighbors had more than my family and their lives seemed to be a little easier. As well as a mother and father there were three kids, while we had a mother and father and five kids, three angelic boys, and then two identical twin girls. Five kids weren't a lot, but it made life tight, and my father and mother had to make sure they stretched every pound (dollar). Life was comfortable, simple, sparing and we made do with what we had. I have to say, we were a happy family, and we had great parents. We also had a large extended family of grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins, all of which were close and tight-knit. Nevertheless, when you are young, you can tend to envy what you think others have that you don't seem to have, you long for a little more, and for life to be a little easier. Sometimes, we never overcome these feelings, and we can forget to count the blessings we have and the gifts we have received.

I mention that because in the Gospel today Jesus warns his hearers not to lead any "little one astray." A few years ago, I realized that I wouldn't change my family for all the world or all the treasures in the world. I realized how fortunate I was to have grown up with parents who struggled to keep it all together, who worked hard, but who were always present, always there, always involved, and engaged in our lives. In the eyes of the world, we didn't have anything, and even from time to time, we may have felt that, but, in reality, we lived a graced and joyful life. It wasn't without struggle, sacrifice, pain, and hardship, but of all the treasures we could have had we had the most important. We had parents who loved us and who lived for us and who enjoyed sharing in our lives, even if at times, they didn't understand us. Today, I realize how truly lucky we were, how rich we were, and how fortunate we were. To-

day, I don't envy others, I don't covet what they have, I'm grateful to God because my parents responded to His call and they were not just good parents, they were the best of parents. Funny, my brothers and sisters have turned out to be just like them.



"Don't lead one of these little ones astray." All life begins in the desire of God. Long before God created us, He knew us, He loved us, and He planned for us to come into being. Then, God sent His child, this little boy, or this little girl, not just into the world, no, He sent them to parents. He didn't send them to just any parents, no, He sent them to this mother and this father. No other man will be your child's father, no other woman will be your child's mother. You are it. That God sent His most precious treasure to you shows that He has confidence that you can be the mother/woman, father/man that your child needs. God has confidence in you, otherwise, things would have been different. Now I am not Pollyanna. I realize that due to our human weakness, our particular situations, our own history and limitations, that life can be messy, and things may not turn out as they should or could, or as we would like them to be. Sometimes, God asks others to take over the mantle of father or mother, brother, or sister.

Nevertheless, God has given us His treasure, your child, who is God's child first and always will be, and God asks you to care for this treasure – do not lead them astray – but be a light that guides their way. Can you do it? Well, God seems to think so, that's why He sent them to you. Sometimes we only appreciate the good when we grow up.



Letter from Office of the Archbishop

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The mission of the Catholic Church, *our mission*, entrusted to the apostles by Jesus, is to proclaim the Good News of salvation and “make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you” (Mt. 28:19-20). In short, to radiate Christ.

We have a responsibility to make the best use of all the means which God has provided us to pursue this sacred mission. It is therefore appropriate to ask, are all our resources – human, physical and financial – properly ordered to missionary discipleship? Are they working in concert to continuously draw parishioners and attract new members into a more intimate relationship with Jesus? Or are they consumed by efforts to maintain the status quo and spread too thin to be truly effective?

These are the concerns that **Beacons of Light**, the multi-year process of comprehensive pastoral planning for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, has been addressing. After months of study and analysis, we cannot escape the conclusion that in many cases our church buildings are grossly underutilized, our priests and parish staff members are stretched to the limit, and our parishes are simply not the vibrant, evangelizing communities Catholics want and need them to be.

To help remedy this situation and be better stewards of the resources God has made available to us, parishes in the archdiocese will be grouped into “Families of Parishes” under the leadership of one pastor. After that, each Family will collaborate internally to determine the best and highest use of their shared resources to radiate the love of Christ and form a strong, vital community of evangelization and service centered on the Eucharist.

Your thoughtful feedback at this stage of the planning process would be most valuable. **A draft of the Families of Parishes will be shared for public comment October 1-20** at www.BeaconsAOC.org, the website of the Beacons of Light initiative. Please be sure to familiarize yourself with the information on the website, then prayerfully provide your input on this important step which will shape the future of our archdiocese.

As we continue this challenging but necessary endeavor, it is critically important that we earnestly seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit so that we might together discern the best path forward with humility and courage. Please join me in asking for the intercession of our Blessed Mother, to whose care we have entrusted our archdiocese, that God continue to bless us with His presence and His love, as we pray:

*Mary, Mother of the Church and our Mother,
present our prayer of thanksgiving to your Son.
Beg from Him the graces we need to be faithful disciples
who follow Him with enthusiasm and joy.
May our witness to the love of God bear fruit
in our archdiocese, parishes, homes and hearts.
Teach us to be God's joyful witnesses,
to radiate Christ in all we do,
so that all people might know, love and follow your Son
through this life and into the next.
Amen.*


