Jesus asks us to live more fully

When I was much younger my Dad would allow me to stay up with him to watch the late Saturday night horror shows. These were the horror movies of the 1930's, 1940's, 1950's, and 1960's starring actors like Bella Lugosi, Boris Karloff, Lon Chaney, and later Christopher Lee, Peter Cushing, and Vincent Price. Dracula, Frankenstein, the Wolfman, and The Mummy were the main features. Just great old classics that at the time scared the life out of me so much that I would look under the bed before getting in and I would clutch my rosary as I fell asleep. Now I look back and they just seem enjoyable to recall and they remind me of a special time with my Dad.

It is now the Sunday afternoon before the priests of the Archdiocese will meet with Archbishop Schnurr to discuss the future alignment of the "Family of Parishes." Because this pastor's column has to go to the printers on Monday, I have to write it before knowing what that alignment will mean for Victory. It is an anxious and somewhat fearful time. Personally, I don't care for change, unless I'm the agent of change. At the same time, my whole life has been a series of changes: moving from a family to a monastery, moving from monastic life to diocesan priesthood, moving from Ireland to Rome to the USA. As a priest in the Archdiocese, I have moved from parish life to seminary life and back to parish life. I have been assigned to three different parishes as well as the seminary. At the seminary, I moved from being a professor teaching full time and an administrator, to being the director of seminary formation, to president of the Athenaeum and Rector of Mount St. Mary's Seminary. The truth is that I have experienced a lot of changes in life. This is true for most of you also. Life brings change, and for many, life means change.


Change brings challenges and opportunities. In my experience, every change has brought its own rewards, its own blessings, joys, and sorrows, but they have all brought new life and experiences that have enriched my life. Without change I would not have had the oppor-

tunity to be the pastor of Victory and Victory is a great place to be with great people to enrich and bless my life. All change brings sacrifice, but some sacrifices are worth it, some sacrifices are worth giving everything. A priest sacrifices marriage and family to be a good shepherd. Married people give up independence to be captured by the love of their life. Some sacrifices are worth it.

The gospel today may seem to be about an argument concerning divorce, but it is really about much more. Jesus is saying that if we give ourselves to each other, it should be absolute, without holding back, forever, promising everything, all we are, all we have, all we do, all our life, and love given for the other. This is the same "demand" made of priests for their people. It is the same "demand" of one spouse for the other. It is the same "demand" of the love we are asked to give to God as it is the same, uncompromising, absolute, and total giving of love that God offers to us.

I don't know where this new path of "Families of Parishes" will lead us at Victory. But I want to be open to doing what Jesus asks of me, what Jesus asks of us. Jesus asks us to "put out into the deep and cast our net." Not easy after working so hard all this time to be asked to continue to work and maybe even being asked to make radical changes. Yet, we at Victory, generation after generation, have done this over and over again. Parishes are living things and so they have always changed. And Victory has changed over the years. Victory will continue to change, to grow, and to respond to God's voice to "put out into the deep." With this change will come opportunity – we will need to grasp the opportunities and build a future. Every gift we need to be a great community of

faith, the Holy Spirit has given to us – given to you. Don't be afraid to put those gifts to work for the sake of the Kingdom. We are being given a unique opportunity to forge a new future and it seems to me, knowing what I know about the people at Victory and the Catholics of the west-side, fear is not an obstacle they are willing to let get in their way. They have created a unique culture of faith before, and they can continue to do so for the future.

Victory has been a community for over 180 years, but more than this, Victory has always been a family, in fact, a family of families. Like all families we have helped each other, we have supported each other, we have encouraged and challenged each other, we have fought with each other, we have shared what we have with each other, we have cared for each other, and we have loved each other.

That's what families do. And this, at Victory, will never change, no matter what other changes we are challenged to accept and live through.

All families grow. Maybe our family of families is about to grow and expand in a way we didn't expect but it will still be our family, our family of families. We don't know what the future holds for us, but we do know that we have a future because we are family. We believe in our future – with God's grace we will make things happen, great things, awesome things, because that's who we are and that's what we do at Victory.

Jesus asks us to live more fully let's not disappoint Him.

Congratulations Deacon Charles Jenkins and Deacon Joseph Schultheis – 45th Anniversary of Ordination

This past Sunday was the 45th anniversary of the ordination to the Permanent Diaconate for two of Our Lady of Victory's first deacons: Deacon Charles Jenkins and the late Deacon Joseph Schultheis. Both men were ordained on September 26, 1976 by then Archbishop Joseph L. Bernardin at the Cathedral of St. Peter in Chains. They were among the 39 men who were ordained in the very first ordination class of permanent deacons in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati following the restoration of the permanent diaconate after the Second Vatican Council.



Deacon Charley has served his entire 45 years of ordained ministry here at Our Lady of Victory. Likewise, Deacon Joe, prior to his death in 2008, served his entire 32 years of ministry at OLV.

Our Lady of Victory extends our sincere congratulations and appreciation to these two men who devoted so much of their lives to the spiritual enrichment of the people of this parish and the entire Archdiocese.

ESAP & THE GEORGE HUBERT FAMILY FOUNDATION

ESAP and The George Hubert Family Foundation will be continuing the "Fostering Philanthropy Program" to help parishes raise money for Tuition Assistance.

Letter from Office of the Archbishop

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The mission of the Catholic Church, *our mission*, entrusted to the apostles by Jesus, is to proclaim the Good News of salvation and “make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you” (Mt. 28:19-20). In short, to radiate Christ.

We have a responsibility to make the best use of all the means which God has provided us to pursue this sacred mission. It is therefore appropriate to ask, are all our resources – human, physical and financial – properly ordered to missionary discipleship? Are they working in concert to continuously draw parishioners and attract new members into a more intimate relationship with Jesus? Or are they consumed by efforts to maintain the status quo and spread too thin to be truly effective?

These are the concerns that **Beacons of Light**, the multi-year process of comprehensive pastoral planning for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, has been addressing. After months of study and analysis, we cannot escape the conclusion that in many cases our church buildings are grossly underutilized, our priests and parish staff members are stretched to the limit, and our parishes are simply not the vibrant, evangelizing communities Catholics want and need them to be.

To help remedy this situation and be better stewards of the resources God has made available to us, parishes in the archdiocese will be grouped into “Families of Parishes” under the leadership of one pastor. After that, each Family will collaborate internally to determine the best and highest use of their shared resources to radiate the love of Christ and form a strong, vital community of evangelization and service centered on the Eucharist.

Your thoughtful feedback at this stage of the planning process would be most valuable. **A draft of the Families of Parishes will be shared for public comment October 1-20** at www.BeaconsAOC.org, the website of the Beacons of Light initiative. Please be sure to familiarize yourself with the information on the website, then prayerfully provide your input on this important step which will shape the future of our archdiocese.

As we continue this challenging but necessary endeavor, it is critically important that we earnestly seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit so that we might together discern the best path forward with humility and courage. Please join me in asking for the intercession of our Blessed Mother, to whose care we have entrusted our archdiocese, that God continue to bless us with His presence and His love, as we pray:

*Mary, Mother of the Church and our Mother,
present our prayer of thanksgiving to your Son.
Beg from Him the graces we need to be faithful disciples
who follow Him with enthusiasm and joy.
May our witness to the love of God bear fruit
in our archdiocese, parishes, homes and hearts.
Teach us to be God's joyful witnesses,
to radiate Christ in all we do,
so that all people might know, love and follow your Son
through this life and into the next.
Amen.*


