### **Holy Family**

I am the eldest child of Gerry and Martha and I have two brothers and two sisters. No matter what I'm doing, no matter where I am in the world, no matter what happens, no matter how old I am, I always see myself as part of that family. It is an indication of how important our family is that we always see it as fundamentally the same, unchanging, constant. Our family, our place to belong, the most formative relationships in our lives, seem to stay with us forever and seem to be unchanging. Yet, our family was always bigger than the seven of us, as we had grandparents, uncles, aunts,



cousins, and extended family members. As it happens both sides of my parents' families were large with 11 and 13 siblings and every weekend, we gathered in one home or another as families. We all knew each other, we were all close, and it is still the same. I could add to those who belong to our family a list of friends, neighbors, parishioners, schoolmates, the priests I know and respect. And because these people are my friends, they automatically become friends of my parents, brother, and sisters, who are grateful that they have befriended me – especially as here in the States I am alone. They appreciate you even more because I'm a stranger and you have taken me in.

We think of our families as constant and permanent, however, we all know from experience that the truth is very different. My brothers and sisters have married and now have children of their own. One of my nephews has two children so my brother is a grandfather, and I am a grand uncle. The biggest change in our family was the death of my father in January 2021. And yet, I think of my Da every day. He is never far from me. He is always my Da and he is always right there. Nevertheless, when I think of my family, I still immediately go to the image and memories of my mother, father, brothers, and sisters when we were children, teenagers. When my life was the most vibrant and when we lived under the same roof. And yet, our family has always been bigger than that, but they are the core, the heart, they are home, both in time and space and in my heart and memories. In one way it will always be the same, it will never change, and yet it has always been more, bigger, always changing.

In the middle of this year our little family here at Victory will become part of a larger community of parishes. A time of change is also a time of opportunity, grace, and vision. We will both renew and expand our vision. We will determine to become a more dynamic, vibrant, expansive, and energetic community of faith. We as a family are determined to grow, to build, to gather in and to reach out. Families grow and new birth means new life. We choose to live. We choose to grow. We choose to be a family. We choose to follow the Lord wherever He leads us. All families change and at the same time, there is something that always remains the same. The truth is that our family at Victory has always been bigger than just Victory. I'm confident that this will be true in our family of parishes. What we have we will share with others and what they have they will share with us. I'm positive that we will all be enriched because we are family. We will strive to welcome everyone so that like me, a stranger, all will find a home and a place to be, a family to belong to.

## A Message From Fr. Ben

### Tell the Pope what to do!

Pope Francis has called for a synod of the Church to take place in Rome in 2023. The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of praying, listening, dialoguing, and discerning which will culminate in the celebration of the Sixteenth Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023. Every diocese in the world will participate. Pope Francis said that the two-year process leading to the 2023 synod is not about "gathering opinions," but "listening to the Holy Spirit." Catholics are invited to participate in the process of the synod by participating in the preliminary gathering which will help prepare the documents for discussion. In our Archdiocese this dialogue will take place at the deanery level.

Our deanery is the St. Lawrence deanery and there will be an open meeting at Our Lady of Victory on February 24th, 2022 from 7:00 PM - 9:00 PM. If you can't make that meeting you might attend one of the other deanery meetings. A list is available in this bulletin. 




