

## R. Ben's Column

#### Baptism of the Lord

When my youngest brother Gerard was serving in the Irish Army, he was on an exercise in the Phoenix Park in Dublin. While running across a field he tripped over a small stone block. As he got himself up from the ground, he looked to see what had tripped him. It turned out to be a monument marking the spot where, on May 6th, 1882, Lord Frederick Cavendish, Chief Secretary, and Thomas Burke, Permeant Under-Secretary, of the British Imperial occupation powers in Ireland, were assassinated by a group of Irish revolutionaries known as the Invincibles. It was a strange coincidence that my



brother's fall happened on May 6th, the anniversary of the assassination. Both men were killed not far from the Viceregal Lodge, at that time the home of the British Viceroy in Ireland. This house is now the home of the President of Ireland. Not far from the gates of this home stands a column with the image of a Phoenix at its summit.

Although this Phoenix and the park were named before the independence of Ireland it always seemed to me that it was appropriate that at the heart of the city of Dublin was a symbol of life rising from the ashes. The Irish people never gave up hope of being free and men and women of every generation made the realization of that freedom their goal and purpose in life. From the ashes rose a new nation, free and vibrant, ready to make its mark on the world, not for occupation and expansion but for brotherhood, friendship, freedom, and peace.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The great figure of John the Baptist rises like a Phoenix, proclaiming the coming of God's new life, the light of the world, our salvation, the Lamb of God. John rises from the old to proclaim the new. He is on fire, he is totally committed, and he is vibrant with life and courage. Nothing will stop John from carrying out his mission as God's prophet. Then, John baptizes Jesus and recognizes in Jesus the One who will bring life to all as even death will not overcome Him. Jesus will overcome darkness, evil, and death itself.

From ancient times through the Middle Ages Christians have seen in the mythology and image of the Phoenix a representation of the Resurrection of the Lord and all the baptized. The Phoenix dies and from the ashes rises again. For Christians, the Phoenix was a symbol of self-sacrifice, passion, vitality, a vibrant all-consuming life, and of course, resurrection from the dead.

We are at the beginning of a new year, a new start, and a new opportunity. This is especially true this year as we face the final countdown to the beginning of our Family of Parishes. This will be a new reality for us here in Delhi, at Victory, St. Dominic, St. Simon, St. Al's, and St. Vincent de Paul. It seems to me that we can face this reality in two ways: we can be like the tortoise and in the face of perceived danger, hostility, a threat, we can pull in our heads, limbs, and our tail, while hiding in our shell hoping that we will survive another day and maybe things might get better. In this case we don't determine our own destiny, we can simply try to protect ourselves and possibly go on existing, hoping for deliverance at the will of another. That's certainly a way to go. A pretty weak, poor, and sad way to go into the future.

On the other hand, our image could be the Phoenix, a creature that survives the destruction, the change, the ashes, and the burning, and refuses to lay down and die. We can choose to be like the creature that rises from the ashes with renewed and reinvigorated life willing to rise up and spread its wings because, after all, life is worth living and every life is an adventure. Five parishes are not a burden, it is an opportunity. Five communities are not too much, it is only a beginning. Five communities coming together give us greater opportunity and more gifts in those who belong. The Catholic Church has been on this hill for over one hundred and fifty years and in spite of the commentary of some, we are not in decline. The first one hundred and fifty years have only been the pre-game, the start. What we have the potential to do here and now is only limited if we allow ourselves to be the tortoise instead of the Phoenix. I don't know about you, but I have only one life to live and I'm not living it hiding in my shell hoping that something better comes along. I don't mind dying but I'll be damned if I'm not going to live life to the fullest as God wants me to live.

Here in this family of parishes we are going to rise higher, grow stronger, live with a passion, build a community of affection, and live as completely and as fruitfully as possible. We are going to be the place, and the people, that others only dream of being. The only things that limit us are our own unwillingness to believe, to hope, to be involved, to be willing to make that difference, make our mark, be who God asks us to be. As we move forward, we need to be big, bold, energetic, we need to be a people of vision and imagination. I'm not asking for much. I'm just asking for everything! Don't be a tortoise – be courageous – be on fire – be a Phoenix. For God's sake, we only get one shot at life, so let's set the world on fire!

#### Tell the Pope what to do!

Pope Francis has called for a synod of the Church to take place in Rome in 2023. The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of praying, listening, dialoguing, and discerning which will culminate in the celebration of the Sixteenth Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023, Every diocese in the world will participate. Pope Francis said that the two-year process leading to the 2023 synod is not about "gathering opinions," but "listening to the Holy Spirit." Catholics are invited to participate in the process of the synod by participating in the preliminary gathering which will help prepare the documents for discussion. In our Archdiocese this dialogue will take place at the deanery level.

Our deanery is the St. Lawrence deanery and there will be an open meeting at Our Lady of Victory on February 24th, 2022 from 7:00 PM - 9:00 PM. If you can't make that meeting you might attend one of the other deanery meetings. A list is available in this bulletin. 


