Jesus Blesses the Wedding at Cana

I have a friend in Ireland who is a Robin Hood fanatic. He reads everything he can on the subject, and he visits Nottingham almost every year for the Robin Hood festival. I don't know where his interest started but he has great enjoyment just being involved in the legend and "history" of Robin Hood.



If you haven't seen the 1991 movie Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves starring Kevin Costner, Morgan Freeman, Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio, and Christian Slater don't bother, it's complete rubbish.

However, there is an interesting quote when Robin is speaking to Lady Marian, and she asks him how such an arrogant man could have changed so much. Robin says: "I've seen knights in armor panic at the first hint of battle. And I've seen the lowliest, unarmed squire pull a spear from his own body, to defend a dying horse. Nobility is not a birthright. It's defined by one's actions."

Today we see Jesus performing His first miracle at a wedding in the town of Cana. The Church has always considered this Gospel passage as the indication of the sacramentality of marriage. A sacrament is one of the seven privileged ways in which God reaches out from heaven and touches our lives. There are lots of important meanings in this short story from St. John's Gospel, but I would like to focus on just two.

The first is the fact that Jesus does not only bless this wedding, and by extension this couple, their guests and family, Jesus overabundantly blesses them. Not only is the wine the best anyone has ever tasted but there is so much of it. More than they could possibly, realistically, drink. It is estimated that Jesus made 180 gallons which is equal to 1000 bottles of wine. It is an expression of generosity. Generosity is one of the essential qualities of marriage. Each spouse is called to be a companion, a friend, willing to love the other even more than themselves, even more than life itself. Marriage calls for a generosity of spirit where we give all to serve, help, cherish, and love our spouse. In this story Jesus does not take, He gives, and He gives in abundance, He gives what is best not what is over, or secondary. If we do not give generously, completely, we run the risk of hiding away what is best, withholding what is necessary and essential. And what is best of ourselves is necessary for our marriages to be rich, overabundant, and whole, ample and even complete. Giving ourselves generously in marriage is essential.

The second point goes back to the quote above. Marriage requires nobility. Very often nobility is associated with aristocratic titles and honors. If that is what nobility is, we are better off without it. Nobility as it is properly understood has nothing to do with privilege and everything to do with character. Nobility cannot be given to you by another, it can only be given to you by yourself. Nobility is from within but makes itself known in action. Nobility is a way of being, a way of living, a way of treating others and it is how we choose to make our mark in life and on the world.

Nobility always stands for the good, the true, and fights for the oppressed and the suffering. Nobility does not ask others to do what you yourself won't do and nobility makes its stand even when that stand is alone and forlorn. Nobility is the character that is brave, self-sacrificing, and

directed toward a life of purpose and meaning. The noble person serves and serves with honor and grace. A man, or woman, who says to another: "I will stand by you in sickness and in health, in good times and in bad, forsaking all others, I will love you and honor you all the days of my life," is a noble person. This is a noble way to live, and this way of life requires a noble spirit. Nobility is not an easy way to live but it is the best way to live. In marriage the noble person serves the other in love, forsaking all others, including themselves.

Marriage is nobel because it takes a willingness to be brave and courageous. Married people are noble because marriage requires courage and bravery – to enter together an uncertain future with conviction and hope. Marriage requires a willingness to "put out into the deep" not knowing what the future holds, and yet, a couple does so trusting in God and each other. Such a life, relationship, marriage, will produce abundant blessings and a wine that is unique, like no other, a life of abundance, the very best life possible.

Tell the Pope what to do!

Pope Francis has called for a synod of the Church to take place in Rome in 2023. The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of praying, listening, dialoguing, and discerning which will culminate in the celebration of the Sixteenth Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023. Every diocese in the world will participate. Pope Francis said that the two-year process leading to the 2023 synod is not about "gathering opinions," but "listening to the Holy Spirit." Catholics are invited to participate in the process of the synod by participating in the preliminary gathering which will help prepare the documents for discussion. In our Archdiocese this dialogue will take place at the deanery level.

Our deanery is the St. Lawrence deanery and there will be an open meeting at Our Lady of Victory on February 24th, 2022 from 7:00 PM - 9:00 PM. If you can't make that meeting you might attend one of the other deanery meetings. A list is below. 



VICTORY FUTURES PROJECT UPDATE

In January 2020, Our Lady of Victory Parish began a strategic planning process for our development, stewardship, communication, and people engagement efforts. We completed an Initial Assessment in March 2020, and then the pandemic caused us to pause our planning activities. Beginning in February 2021, we resumed our efforts. Parish and school leaders identified the need to plan on how we can invite, involve, and engage more people into our faith community. Did you know that we have over 50 ministries that consist of over 600 volunteer positions? These organizations offer a range of volunteer opportunities so there is something for everyone based on their interest, skills, and busy schedules. An assessment of every organization is presently taking place. Soon you will be able to see opportunities that may be right for you.

With a 23-acre campus, we all know the importance of maintaining and upgrading our fields and facilities which consist of 8 buildings, a playground for our preschool students, and numerous sports fields. A site development plan is being discussed so our community can maximize our efforts and allow us to enjoy this campus for years to come.

What makes Our Lady of Victory school such a dynamic place? What are our "WOW" factors? What are our Top 10 selling points? What separates us from any other school in the surrounding area?
