MASS PROGRAM

FIRST READING

Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly, which consisted of men, women, and those children old enough to understand. Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Water Gate, he read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion. He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it — for he was standing higher up than any of the people —; and, as he opened it, all the people rose. Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, "Amen, amen!"

Neh 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Then they bowed down and prostrated themselves before the LORD, their faces to the ground. Ezra read plainly from the book of the law of God, interpreting it so that all could understand what was read. Then Nehemiah, that is, His Excellency, and Ezra the priest-scribe and the Levites who were instructing the people said to all the people: "Today is holy to the LORD your God. Do not be sad, and do not weep"— for all the people were weeping as they heard the words of the law. He said further: "Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared; for today is holy to our LORD. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the LORD must be your strength!"

SECOND READING

Brothers and sisters:

As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ.

body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit. Now the body is not a single part, but many. You are Christ's body, and individually parts of it.

GOSPEL

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all.

He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. Lk 1:1-4: 4:14-21

He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah.

He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,

because he has anointed me

to bring glad tidings to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind,

to let the oppressed go free,

and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him.

He said to them.

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

The Day Everything Changed

When it was time for me to leave Ireland and go to Rome to study theology my family held a big going away party for me. They rented a room at a local club and invited about two hundred people. I don't know what my parents were expecting but it seemed to me that the image they had in their mind was of Irish missionaries leaving for foreign lands never to return. No doubt I was starting a new stage of my life, a new mission for God, however, I was only going to Rome, a three-hour flight from Dublin, and I would be back three months later for Christmas vacation.



In the Gospel today Jesus begins a journey of another kind. Today Jesus announces His sacred mission. He quotes the beautiful passage from the Prophet Isaiah and this passage will define His mission: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He anointed Me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent Me to proclaim release to the captives, recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed, to proclaim the favorable year of the Lord." (Luke 4:18–19).

It is a beautiful statement and represents the compassion of God who sends His Son to search for God's children, relieve their suffering, and restore them to God's friendship, life, and love. Of course, as disciples of the Lord, what is true for Jesus' mission must also be true for us. God has sent each of us into the world with a purpose, a work to do, a mission to accomplish. That might be a vocation to marriage, family, priesthood, religious life, or something more but it is certain that we each have a mission. This passage from St. Luke quoting the Prophet Isaiah is to describe what our mission is to be like, how we are to act toward others, and what we are to bring to the world from God.

The day Jesus began this mission the world changed. The day God sent you into the world the world changed. Has the world changed for the better because of you? Is your wife, husband, children, parishioners, religious community, better because of your presence in their lives? Today, is this Scripture passage fulfilled because of our mission, our presence? With God it is never too late to start.

New Initiatives

Chalice for Vocations

On the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd, 2022 we will begin a new devotional practice at Victory in order to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The Feast of the Presentation recalls the occasion when the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph brought the Child Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to be dedicated to the Lord. This devotion will be our vocation

Chalice devotion. Once a month a family in the parish will be given the chalice at Mass and will keep it in their home with a promise to pray, as a family, for vocations, every day. I have designated a chalice, that has been used for many years at the celebration of Holy Mass, to be passed from family to family. The volunteer family will be announced in the bulletin the week before and will be given the chalice after Holy Communion at the 11 am Mass. If you would like to volunteer your family for this devotion, please call Sara at the parish office. This practice is part of our parish renewal program recommended by our parishioners' priorities outlined by the Institute for School and Parish Development (ISPD) initiative. Our first volunteer family will be Kevin, Carly, Jude, Declan, Holland, and Elsie Kipp.

Little Angels Care: New Baby Welcome Package

In our ISPD process welcome, kindness and friendship were three of the most important values our parishioners identified as essential to reinvigorate and identify our parish. As part of our welcoming parish initiative, I am instituting a new project as part of our welcome ministry. I want to recognize the important work of parents and the great work they provide in bringing children into the world and caring for them. As a support to them and as a parish we will contribute a care package to newborn children who are born to registered parish members and so are part of our parish family. In particular, we will help by providing some of the extra necessary items parents need for the first three months of the baby's care. The care package will include diapers (it seems these are most essential), diaper cream, baby wipes, burp cloths, bibs, baby shampoo, baby powder, and onesies. We will create a special account for this initiative. If you would like to donate to this project just mark donations "Little Angels Care" and we will take care of the rest. I will personally donate the first \$1,000 to this initiative. – Fr. Ben

Seniors Breakfast Roundtable

As part of our ISPD initiatives starting in the Fall we will hold a monthly breakfast and talk for our senior parishioners. Typically, these gatherings will take place in the convocation center on the first Monday of each month, beginning at 9:30 am, and will include a time for social gathering, buffet breakfast, and a guest speaker. These gatherings will take place in September, October, November, February, March, April, and May.

Archconfraternity of St. Stephen Altar Servers Guild

In recognition of the importance of serving at the Altar of the Lord and in gratitude for the ministry of service provided by our youth, Our Lady of Victory parish has been enrolled into the Archconfraternity of St. Stephen. His Grace, Archbishop Schnurr, made the application on behalf of our parish to His Eminence, Vincent Cardinal Nichols, Archbishop of Westminster, England. Servers will be incorporated into the guild beginning on the feast of St. Pat-



rick, March 17, 2022. Soon you will see the emblem of the Guild worn by servers at Mass. Our Lady of Victory may be the first parish in the United States to be associated with the Guild. The objects of the Guild are: To encourage, positively and practically, the highest standards of serving at the Church's liturgy and so contribute to the whole community's participation in a more fruitful worship of God. To provide altar servers with a greater understanding of what they are doing so that they may serve with increasing reverence and prayerfulness and thereby be led to a deepening response to their vocation in life. To unite servers of different parishes and dioceses for their mutual support and encouragement.

Tell the Pope what to do!

Pope Francis has called for a synod of the Church to take place in Rome in 2023. The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of praying, listening, dialoguing, and discerning which will culminate in the celebration of the Sixteenth Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023. Every diocese in the world will participate. Pope Francis said that the two-year process leading to the 2023 synod is not about "gathering opinions," but "listening to the Holy Spirit." Catholics are invited to participate in the process of the synod by participating in the preliminary gathering which will help prepare the documents for discussion. In our Archdiocese this dialogue will take place at the deanery level.

Our deanery is the St. Lawrence deanery and there will be an open meeting at Our Lady of Victory on February 24th, 2022 from 7:00 PM - 9:00 PM. If you can't make that meeting you might attend one of the other deanery meetings. A list is below. 


