

<u>A brief Christmas review of the essentials of our</u> <u>Catholic Christian Faith</u>

As we celebrate Christmas and soon begin the New Year 2022, I thought that it'd be good once again to offer a basic review of our Catholic Christian faith! I usually presume that all members of our parish and all Catholic Christians know the basic beliefs of our faith along with many of the details of Catholic Christianity and the Good News of the Lord Jesus. Our Catholic faith and life are indeed tremendous treasures that are comprised of so many amazing facets – just like a diamond. At the same time, as a pastor, I want to once again share this simple reminder with everyone who reads this bulletin during the Christmas holidays.

As Catholic Christians, our three most essential and basic beliefs - found in our Sunday Creed - are these:

- <u>DIVINITY</u>. We believe there is One Eternal God in Three Divine Persons (God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit) as revealed to us by Jesus of Nazareth, and we believe that God is life-giving, good, and loving;
- 2.) **INCARNATION**. The Son of God became fully human in Jesus of Nazareth thus joining together both the Divine and humanity (yes, this is the belief that we celebrate every Christmas!); and
- 3.) **RESURRECTION**. The Lord Jesus was raised from the dead three days after his crucifixion and death on the cross, and Jesus' Resurrection gives us hope for our own Resurrection and for Eternal Life.

Again, there are many, many wonderful beliefs in our Catholic Christian faith, yet it's always good to see everything in the context of these three basic beliefs: **Divinity, Incarnation, and Resurrection**. This Christmas, please take some time to reflect on these three essential and important beliefs, and take a moment to actually say once again "Yes, I believe in the Trinity, the Incarnation, and the Resurrection!" Amen. Have a joyful Christmas, and God bless!

Best wishes for a joyful Christmas Season - and for a blessed new Year 2022!

Best wishes for a very good Christmas Season and for a very good Holy Family Sunday! Again, thank you very much for your continued faith, discipleship, dedication, goodness, and generosity – to our parish community, to one another, and to those in need.

EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH St. Stephen | Feast Day December 26

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin.

Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.

St. Philip families enjoyed *an Evening in Bethlehem* on Monday Night, December 13 in Ascension Conner Hall. Each family shared a pizza supper followed by crafts for the children. Each child then received a book while families enjoyed samples of cookies and hot chocolate. Everyone created a tree ornament or bookmark to share with Meals On Wheels for the Christmas Season. The evening continued in Church with a reading of The Shepherd's Story and caroling. The evening concluded with Father Torquato reading the Nativity Story from the Gospel of Luke and giving each family a blessing.



We would like to wish you and your families a very merry and holy Christmas! As the birth of Jesus brought an inextinguishable light into the world, all of you - who support our conference through donations, volunteering, or keeping us and those we help in your prayers - bring a light to our friends in need when they need it the most. As you celebrate Christ's birth, we ask you to pray that our friends in need will feel the love of Christ no matter how difficult their current situation may be.

Many of our friends in need face similar challenges to those of the Holy Family. Some struggle to find adequate shelter. Some find themselves having to travel long distances, maybe to escape abuse or violence in their home country. Many are trying to raise children the best they can in an uncertain world and with limited resources. We are very blessed, with your help, to be able to assist so many families on their journey, even if only in little ways.

This week, your generous donations enabled us to give a man \$575 for rent; a single mother was given \$244 for her gas bill; a woman was given \$250 toward a security deposit; and a disabled woman was given \$346 for her electric bill.
