

## Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a very good week and a blessed 2022!



Today's Word of God Sunday

Three years ago, Pope Francis declared the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time to now be "Word of God Sunday" to remind us of the importance of the Bible in our Catholic Christian faith, in our Sacred Liturgy and prayer, and in our daily living!

In recent weeks, I reminded everyone that the Bible is one of the three foundations of our faith (again, they are known as "S.T.M." - the Scriptures in the Bible, the Apostolic Tradition, and the Official Magisterium - *the Official Teachings*.) Also, in every Sunday and weekday Liturgy, we read from the books of the Old Testament AND the New Testament especially from the Four Gospels of Jesus' life and teachings which are the most important writings in the Bible (*that's why we stand in church to listen to the Gospel Reading*). Likewise, reading the Bible (*the Word of God*) is highly recommended for our daily reading and for our time in prayer.

This Sunday's Bible readings in the Liturgy show us the use of the Bible (*the Scriptures*) in the life of Israel and in the life of Jesus and the early Church. The people of Israel (*our ancestors in the faith*) and Jesus and his disciples read the Jewish Scriptures (*what we traditionally call the Old Testament*) in their Saturday synagogue prayer and in their daily religious practice. The Jewish Scripture readings were composed over many centuries. They give to us the story of God's choice of Israel to be his people. The Jewish Scriptures also point Israel toward the promised Messiah (*Jesus*) who would come to them to restore Israel and create a new the people of God.

The Gospels and writings of the New Testament were composed in the first generations of the Catholic Church. The Church was already alive and growing and teaching our faith in Jesus and his death and Resurrection for years. In time, the Apostles knew that it would be important to record the story of Jesus which they had been sharing verbally and preaching for years. The writings that were inspired by the Holy Spirit and then written and circulated eventually became the New Testament. We believe that the writings of both the Old Testament and the New Testament were truly inspired by Almighty God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and so we call these writings the "Word of God."

Again, the Bible is so essential to our Catholic Christian faith that it is one of the Three Pillars of Christianity. The Bible is read in each of our Liturgies throughout the year. The Bible is essential to our own daily prayer. Just as Jesus read and honored the Word of God in the Jewish Scriptures, may we too honor and read all the writings in the Bible – especially all the writings about the Lord Jesus. This week, please find your Bible, open it, and read the Gospels. Then read the Acts of the Apostles, the New Testament letters, and the Old Testament. You and your faith (*and your family*) will benefit from the Word of God being important in your life and in your home every day!

#### This Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

The Annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity was established more than a century ago to further the effort to reunite all Christians. This important week is observed each year during the third week of January - concluding with the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul the Apostle on January 25. However, because it follows only a few weeks after the conclusion of the Christmas Season – and because this is our winter hibernation and illness season – the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity doesn't receive the attention that it should. (*If the week were moved to the middle of the year, perhaps it would be celebrated with more energy and events.*)

Ecumenism - or the effort to reunite all Christians - is an important service to the Lord Jesus and to the Lord's disciples. As you may remember, the division between Catholics and Eastern Orthodox occurred in the eleventh century A.D., and the numerous Christian divisions within Europe were created in the sixteenth century A.D. As we all know, it's difficult to repair and heal fractures. However, for the spread of the Lord's Gospel and the growth of the Kingdom, it's important for members of the Lord's Catholic Church to work and pray for Christian unity here and throughout the world. May we respect all members and shepherds of the Catholic Church as well as those of other Christian communities, and may we join together in praying for and promoting unity among all the Lord Jesus' disciples!

#### Remaining healthy and well

As we continue this the third year of the worldwide Covid-19 pandemic, please remember to protect yourself, your health, and your family during these winter months when illnesses occur much more frequently.

Thank you for receiving a Covid vaccination and a booster vaccination. Thank you for wearing a full face mask when appropriate and wise. Thank you for sanitizing and distancing. Please be mindful of current safety measures as we all try to mitigate and survive this ongoing health crisis. May the good Lord protect you and all of us, and may we all have a healthy and safe 2022!

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 -1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.

#### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

For the 2020 tax year, the average federal income tax refund was \$2,827 (CNBC: <u>https://cnb.cx/3jByd9y</u>). Many people count on their tax refund each year, as it is the one time a year that they will have access to a lump sum of money that can be used for a rainy day fund, vehicle repairs, home repairs, real estate tax payments, or other extraordinary expenses. Those who are anxiously awaiting their tax refund can now get the process started by filing their 2021 federal tax return.

The IRS started accepting returns for filers with income of \$73,000 or less on January 14, and will start accepting returns from all other filers on January 24. Filers with income of less than \$73,000 can take advantage of the Free File program, which allows qualifying filers to utilize online tax preparation software and file their return electronically for free. Visit www.irs.gov/filing/free-file-do-your-federal-taxes-for -free for more information.

People who received advance child tax credit payments in 2021 have already or will soon be receiving Letter 6419 from the IRS, which states how much of the child tax credit was paid in advance. Recipients need to retain this letter, as this information is necessary when preparing your 2021 tax return to determine how much child tax credit you are entitled to receive as part of your 2021 tax refund.

The IRS estimates that it will be able to issue most refunds in 21 days or less, but if your return needs to be reviewed for inaccuracies, or if you file by mail instead of electronically, your refund will likely take longer. If you are anxiously awaiting your refund money, you should file your return early – and you can monitor the status of your return by utilizing the "Where's My Refund?" tool on the IRS website at <u>www.irs.gov/refunds</u>.

#### - GOSPEL MEDITATION --ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Human history reveals many periods where people lost a sense of God's transcendence. It may even be argued that human beings have been wandering and lost more than they have been at home and focused. Human nature being what it is, we struggle with who God really is — the God of our salvation history or the "gods" of human constructs. Relying on our own designs and pursuits, we forget that we really are meant to listen to One upon whom the Spirit of the Lord rests, Jesus Christ, and not to ourselves. That same history that reveals our fickleness and infidelity also reveals God's constancy and faithfulness. God always finds us.

As people wander and fumble to find their way, God is there bringing them back to holiness and giving them the assurance of His presence. We have to allow God's Word, God's life, to touch

us and change us. It can make us more flexible and attentive to the sacred in all facets of life so that every day is one that is holy. Every day is a time when fulfillment is possible for one's soul. Jesus stood before those gathered in the synagogue as the fulfillment of words of promise that were echoed long ago. God doesn't forget. He always comes for us.

Now it is time to remember to go to God. Sometimes our lives are so confused and tangled that it is difficult to see the Word and hand of God. But when we realize, deep within, the depth of friendship God offers to us it really has the power to turn sadness to joy. The promise is fulfilled. Going frequently to God's Word, allowing ourselves to be enriched and rejuvenated, and pondering the certainly of God's fidelity and promise permanently transforms us. We will be more aware of the sacred and the holy and less invested in things that pull us away.


