

Notes from the **Pastor**

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a very good week and a blessed 2022!

A Sunday Reflection

Last Sunday, we heard the from early days of Jesus' public ministry. In the synagogue, He announced that He is the one anointed by the Spirit of God who was sent to bring healing and salvation to the world. Today, we hear the episode that followed when Jesus' listeners turned against Him and tried to eliminate Him because He made remarks about their disbelief and their opposition to Him and His good news.

For all who have been and still are disciples of the Lord Jesus, it's difficult to understand why anyone would be opposed to Him and His message. As Catholic Christians, we believe in Jesus and appreciate His message, His healing power, His teaching, and His death on the cross and His Resurrection. We acknowledge Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of God, and the Savior of humanity. We see Jesus as the Light of the World who's leading us to eternal life in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Yet, even today - 20 centuries since Jesus' ministry on earth - there are many individuals who reject Jesus and His Gospel. There are also many other individuals who simply don't care about Jesus and all that He means to humanity and to our life and society today. All too often, those who reject Jesus and those who ignore Him are actually baptized Catholic Christians and Christians of other communities. Sadly, many weren't raised well in the Faith and didn't participate in the Sunday Liturgy - and so, their lives are devoid of religious practice and belief.

Despite the large number of people in our world, our nation, and our communities who are currently separated from the Lord, it is good and important that

we continue to place our faith in Jesus and to live every day as His people in the Holy Catholic Church. It's important for us to gather in the Liturgy every Sunday (or Saturday evening) to profess our faith, to give thanks to God, to renew our spiritual lives through the Bible and the Eucharist, and to support each other as Catholic Christians!

It can be discouraging to see how many Church members and families (and others) simply don't care about Jesus and Christianity and the Church, but let us appreciate how many Christians in our own community and throughout the world continue to be faithful believers and disciples. Let's continue to celebrate how important Jesus is to us. Let's remain dedicated to the Lord and His way. Finally, let's renew our hope and trust in the divine love and salvation that Jesus gives and promises to all of us who are and who remain His faithful people!

What it means to be "Catholic"

I very much appreciate the times when a parish member - or anyone - asks me to explain some aspect of our faith. Last month, I was asked the question "What do we mean by the name 'Catholic'?"

In the first generations of the Lord's community (the Church), our ancestors who were becoming followers of the Risen Christ came to be called "Christians". This is still the name that we receive and proclaim even today.

During later generations, small groups of Christians were becoming very exclusive and were pursuing their own versions of the Christian faith. They often excluded the poor and uneducated and outcast. They typically considered themselves to be much better than the average member of the Lord's Church. These groups were hostile to the Apostolic Church and its leaders and caused many difficulties and upset through the early centuries.

As a result, in order to distinguish faithful Church members from those who created small, exclusive groups (those who came to be called 'heretics'), the Church began teaching that true disciples belong to a "Catholic Church" - an inclusive Church of Christ that does not exclude anyone and which seeks to share the Good News and the grace of the Lord with all people everywhere.

Today, we often hear the name "Catholic Christians" as a reminder that we are indeed Christians baptized into Christ Jesus - and that we belong to the one Catholic Church (universal, inclusive, open to all) established by Jesus upon the foundation of Peter and the Apostles which welcomes all people and seeks to share salvation with all who believe and live in Jesus the Lord.

Remaining healthy and well

As we enter into the third year of this worldwide Covid-19 pandemic, please remember to protect yourself, your health, and your family during these winter months when illnesses are much more common and prevalent. We all wish this pandemic were finished, but as we hear in the media, this is not vet the situation.

Thank you for receiving a Covid vaccination and a booster vaccination. Thank you for wearing a full face mask when appropriate and wise (especially when you're at the church). Thank you for sanitizing and distancing. Please be mindful of current safety measures as we all try to mitigate and survive this ongoing health crisis. Thank you, too, for your patience and your understanding of these safety measures as we move through these winter months.

May the good Lord protect you and all of us, and may we all have a healthy and safe 2022!




THE GLOBAL SYNOD: WHO ARE YOUR COMPANIONS ON THE ROAD TO HEAVEN?



A NOTE FROM MARYANN: IMPORTANT! Pope Francis wants to hear from everyone about how the Church-the People of God-can help him discern the Holy Spirit's guidance for the mission that Jesus gave to all baptized Christians. The first part of this consultation called a synod will be held in Parishes throughout the Diocese this Winter. Synod means "journeying together." This is not like anything we have done before. This is not, "been there done that." The Holy Father has described the synod as an opportunity to plant dreams, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken hope and give strength to our hands. The sessions for St. Philip Parish will be held on Wednesday, February 23 at 7:00pm in Conner Hall and Thursday, February 24 at 1:00pm in Conner Hall. You may attend either session. The thoughts and comments will be gathered and sent to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. The bishops, in turn, will write a summary of what they have received from every diocese in the country and forward that document to Rome. In October 2023, bishops from across the globe will gather in Rome



to consider what has been heard, shared and experienced. Don't miss this opportunity to gather, listen and dream together. The Church wants and needs to hear about your experiences. Mark your calendar for February 23 or February 24. We need to hear your voice! As we begin this process, St. Philip Parish will pray each week at Mass for the Holy Spirit to inspire the People of God during this time. Let us each be guided by the Holy Spirit as we begin dreaming.

CLASSROOM CHRONICLES: Each week we will highlight the amazing things that are going on in our classrooms at Guardian Angel Academy.

MR. ROY FISCHER'S CLASSROOM:

The 7th grade reading class has finished reading "The Giver." As part of a final project, the students were tasked with creating their own sequel to the book, as *The Giver* has a very ambiguous ending. Students wrote their own original endings and drew their own book covers as well. We stapled them into small books. Students were then able to read their peer's new short stories and write reviews on their classmate's work. The 7th grade's imagination brought us new experiences and offered us a new view of the original text of "The Giver."

The 8th grade social studies is just finishing off a chapter on the Wild West. To help the students experience the life of a settler heading West, we played an old video game: The Oregon Trail! Using an online video game emulator, students were able to play the 1985 game on their Chromebooks in class. Even though it was an old game, the students were able to find not only enjoyment in playing the classic staple of all computer rooms of the 1990s, but were also able to draw conclusions about hardships and life in the West. After playing the game, students were then tasked with writing a reflection about their experiences.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

The Emergency Rental Assistance Program or ERAP has been assisting renters impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic with financial assistance for delinquent and future rent and utility bills since April of 2021 (www.dhs.pa.gov/ERAP). Finally, a similar program for homeowners will begin accepting applications on Tuesday, February 1.

The Pennsylvania Homeowner Assistance Fund or PAHAF, which is funded with \$350 million from the American Rescue Plan, will assist qualifying homeowners with mortgage payments, real estate taxes, homeowners' association or condominium association fees, and utility bills. The total maximum assistance amount per household across all expense categories is \$30,000. Qualifying homeowners can receive up to 24 months of assistance for delinquent mortgage payments. Up to 6 of the 24 months can be allocated to future mortgage payments if the homeowner has not hit the 24 month or \$30,000 cap. Up to \$5,000 can be obtained for delinquent real estate taxes and up to \$5,000 can be obtained for delinquent homeowners' or condo association fees. Utility assistance is capped at \$3,000 or 24 months, whichever is less.

In order to qualify, you must own and live in the house; the house must be located in Pennsylvania; you must have experienced a financial hardship after January 21, 2020 (including a hardship that began before January 21, 2020 and continued after that date); you must meet income guidelines; and you cannot have received assistance from another government agency for the same expenses. The income limit for a household of one is \$89,050 per year, a household of two \$101,800, a household of three \$114,500, and a household of four \$127,200.

To learn more or apply, visit https://pahaf.org or call 888-987-2423. Online applications are strongly encouraged. The launch of this program is very timely as most protections against foreclosure ended on December 31, 2021. If our experience with ERAP is any indication, it may take a while for applications to be processed, and the need may outpace the funds available - so be sure to apply early and follow up on your application often. Please pass this information along to your friends and neighbors who might be in need of assistance with their mortgage payments and/or any of the other expenses mentioned above.


