

Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a very good week and a blessed 2022!

A Sunday Reflection

In today's reading from the Gospel according to Luke, we hear of Jesus' sailing with the Apostles in their boats as they cast their nets into the waters hoping for a catch of fish to sell to the people. This catch of fish is one of the various images for God's People that are used in the Gospels and in the Bible. Another favorite image for the People of God is that of the Lord's chosen flock guided and guarded by the Good Shepherd.

These images and other Biblical images remind us that Jesus has come into the world to gather a great many followers to Himself. Jesus wants the Reign of God, the Kingdom of God, to be populated with countless members who will accept and live in the life and the ways of Almighty God.

As such, we often think of the People of God, the Flock of the Lord, as one very large gathering of Christians who comprise the Body of Christ - joined together in our Faith, our Baptism, and the Eucharist. We speak of the Catholic Church as the Lord's local, national, and worldwide community redeemed by the Blood of Christ and on pilgrimage to eternal life in the presence of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Yet, it's also good and important for us to remember and celebrate that we are unique and individual members of this Catholic community. We are all different from one another, but we are all called to be united in faith, in holiness, in love, and in respect for one another. The Lord Jesus has called each of us to Himself, and He loves each and every one of us – even if our own appreciation of others, even other Catholic Christians, isn't readily apparent.

The Lord Jesus loves each and every one of us for our faith, for our dedication to Him, for our service of God and God's people, and for all that we bring to the Church and to the Kingdom. May you always remember how much Jesus loves you and every one of us. While we're individual members of an enormous flock of the Lord, may we all be grateful that Jesus has called each one of us to Himself, and may we be glad that He - and He alone - has brought redemption to all people and salvation to those who choose the fullness of life in Him!

What it means to be "Catholic"

I very much appreciate the times when a parish members – or anyone – asks me to explain some aspect of our faith. Recently, I was asked the question "What do we mean by the name 'Catholic'?"

In the first generations of the Lord's community (the Church), our ancestors who were becoming followers of the Risen Christ came to be called "Christians". This is still the name that we receive and proclaim even today.

During later generations, small groups of Christians became very exclusive and pursued their own versions of the Christian faith and community. They often excluded the poor and uneducated and outcast. They typically considered themselves to be much better than the average member of the Lord's Church. These groups were hostile to the Apostolic Church and its leaders and caused many difficulties and upset through the early centuries.

As a result, in order to distinguish faithful Church members from those who created small, exclusive groups (those who came to be called 'heretics'), the Church began teaching that true disciples belonged to a "Catholic Church" – an inclusive Church of Christ that does not exclude anyone and which seeks to share the Good News and the grace of the Lord with all people everywhere. Today, we often use the name "Catholic Christians" as a reminder that we are indeed Christians baptized into Christ Jesus – and that we belong to the one Catholic Church (universal, inclusive, open to all) established by Jesus upon the foundation of Peter and the Apostles which welcomes all people and seeks to share salvation with all who believe and live in Jesus the Lord.

Remaining healthy and well

As we enter into the third year of this worldwide Covid-19 pandemic, please remember to protect yourself, your health, and your family during these winter months when illnesses are much more common and prevalent. We all wish this pandemic were finished, but as we hear in the media, this is not yet the situation.

Thank you for receiving a Covid vaccination and a booster vaccination. Thank you for wearing a full face mask when appropriate and wise. Thank you for sanitizing and distancing. Please be mindful of current safety measures as we all try to mitigate and survive this ongoing health crisis. Thank you, too, for your patience and your understanding of these safety measures as we move through these winter months.

May the good Lord protect you and all of us, and may we all have a healthy and safe 2022!

Best wishes for a very good and healthy 2022! Again, thank you very much for your continued faith, discipleship, dedication, goodness, and generosity – to our parish community, to one another, and to those in need.







CLASSROOM CHRONICLES: Each week we will highlight the amazing things that are going on in our classrooms at Guardian Angel Academy.

MR. DAN BAKER, MIDDLE SCHOOL MATH:

Math - Let's talk about it! The 5th grade has been working with decimals. They have discovered how to read them and how they are related to fractions. The students have been learning how to order, round, estimate, and complete problems with all the operations. They will also use decimals with money and learn how to solve real-life problems.

The 6th grade has been working on how to use data in real life. They made different kinds of graphs/plots from data that represent the information in different ways. They discussed what a share of stock is and how to use a line graph to predict how it might perform.

The 7th grade has been working on ratio, rates and probability. They learned how to compare different ratios, as well as find the probability. The students also calculated the probability of winning different types of games.


Our 8th graders have been working on slopes and polynomials. They discussed how slopes can be formed with equations and which jobs use slopes in the real world. The 8th grade will be working with polynomials and learning how to factor them. What's next? Geometry - shapes, formulas, and Pi oh my...



ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

Over the past few months, we have discussed a number of programs that are available to assist people that have difficulty paying their utility bills. Just in case anyone missed one of our articles, here is a recap of the programs that we have discussed.

LIHEAP - The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program provides households that meet certain income requirements grants from \$200 to \$1000, which can be applied to your electric or gas account, depending on which one you use to heat your home. Additional emergency grants to restore service or prevent service interruption are also available. To learn more about LIHEAP or to apply, please visit: www.dhs.pa.gov/LIHEAP.

Dollar Energy - The Dollar Energy Fund provides grants of up to \$500 per participating utility to eligible households. Grants are available for ALCOSAN, Columbia Gas, Duquesne Light, Penn Power, Pennsylvania American Water, Peoples Gas, and Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority. The grants can be applied to existing balances or can be applied as a credit to be used toward future bills. Eligibility varies by utility company, so contact your utility provider or visit <u>www.dollarenergy.org/need-help/pennsylvania</u> for more information.

LIHWAP - The Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program provides qualifying households with one grant for delinquent water charges and one for delinquent sewage charges, up to \$2,500 each. For more information, or to apply, call 877-395-8930 or visit <u>www.dhs.pa.gov/waterhelp</u>.

ERAP - The Emergency Rental Assistance Program provides renters that live in Allegheny County, including the City of Pittsburgh, with utility assistance for electric, gas, fuel oil, garbage, sewage and water bills as long as they meet certain income guidelines and have been financially impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic. You can apply for ERAP utility assistance even if you have been previously denied assistance through some other program, such as LIHEAP or Dollar Energy. In order to apply or for more information, please visit <u>https://covidrentrelief.alleghenycounty.us</u> (this is the preferred method), call their hotline at 412-248-0021, or visit one of their "drop-in centers." The ERAP program is also able to provide rent assistance.

PAHAF - The Pennsylvania Homeowner Assistance Fund provides qualifying homeowners who experienced a financial hardship as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic with up to 24 months or \$3,000.00 of assistance for any utility bill. To learn more or apply, please visit <u>https://pahaf.org</u> or call 888-987-2423. Online applications are strongly encouraged. The PAHAF program is also able to provide mortgage and real estate tax assistance.

With the exception of ERAP and PAHAF, these programs are available to both homeowners and renters. None of the assistance needs to be repaid. If you or someone you know has fallen behind in utility payments or are struggling to stay current, please take advantage of these resources.
