

Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a very good week and a blessed 2022!

A Sunday Reflection

This Sunday, our Gospel reading from the Gospel according to Luke sounds very similar to the Beatitudes found in the Gospel according to Matthew. The Beatitudes are found at the beginning of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in Mathew's Gospel. Today's passage from Luke's Gospel begins the Sermon on the Plain found in Luke.

In fact, the Gospels according to Luke and Matthew and Mark all share many similarities. In recent centuries, Biblical scholars have determined that Mark's Gospel was compiled first. Then the Gospels according to Luke and Matthew were compiled using Mark's Gospel as a source for their own composition.

Building on Mark, the Gospel of Matthew was addressed to Jewish Christians who were very familiar with the Jewish faith and heritage. The Gospel of Matthew also presents Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah who gave clear direction to His Apostles and to the first Christians as to how they should live and conduct themselves.

The Gospel according to Luke - which is the primary Gospel read on Sundays during this Church Year - is also built on the Gospel according to Mark. However, Luke is thought to have been written primarily for Gentile (non-Jewish) Christians who sought to become disciples of Jesus even though they had not been numbered among the People of Israel.

Luke's Gospel adds to the message of Mark's Gospel, and Luke also sounds fairly similar to Matthew. However, Luke has a more inclusive and compassionate message spoken by Jesus throughout His ministry. In Luke, Jesus reaches out to many people who were not Jewish, and in Luke, Jesus

especially shows care and kindness to those who are poor, outcast, and mistreated. In addition, in Luke, Jesus gives us the amazing parables that teach us of God's mercy, love, forgiveness, and compassion. In Luke, during Jesus' suffering and crucifixion as well as in His Resurrection, the Lord speaks of forgiveness, mercy, and understanding.

May we all pay close attention to the passages from Luke's Gospel which we are hearing this year on Sundays. May we also read Luke's Gospel at home. Finally, may we appreciate the Good News from Jesus that Luke shares with us as we too are invited to follow the Lord faithfully in this lifetime and to journey with Him to the Eternal Kingdom!

Our Parish Share Program 2022 will begin in two weeks

As all our members and parishes have done for 50 years, we will soon begin this year's Parish Share Program to contribute our required funding for the operations of the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh in 2022. The PSP allows Bishop David Zubik and his staff to continue and oversee and all the offices and programs of our Diocesan Church.

Many of you, our parish members and families, have been supportive of this important program since its beginning. Some parish members are even very, very generous! All the donations received above and beyond our annual goal are retained by Saint Philip Parish for the benefit and operations of our own Catholic community!

Every year, each parish is asked to raise an extra 17.5% of its income received during the previous year. This extra 17.5% is our annual Parish Share Goal. Because our parish received extra income from our members and estate gifts during the Pandemic, and because our monetary subsidy given to the school was lower thanks to the 2020-2021 Federal PPP funding, this year's 2022 Parish Share Goal is higher than other recent years.

For 2022, our Parish Share Goal for Saint Philip Parish will be \$128,391. This year's goal is \$51,422 higher than the 2021 PSP goal.

As such, I invite every household in our parish to again contribute or pledge at least \$250 to the Parish Share Program this year. If you can contribute \$500, or

\$1000, or \$2500 or more, your generosity will be greatly appreciated. Contribution and pledge cards will be sent in the postal mail to each of our households this month.

As always, I thank you very much for your participation in our parish community and Liturgy, and I thank you for your financial contributions and support for the benefit and operation of our Diocesan Church of Pittsburgh and our Saint Philip Parish. Your generosity and donations help to keep our parish alive - and help to continue and to grow the Kingdom of God here in our community and region!

May the good Lord protect you and all of us, and may we all have a healthy and safe 2022!



The human heart will always find itself wanting unless it finds its rest in God. 


The Guardian Angel Academy Cash Bash was a huge success! The PTG was able to raise a profit of \$15,613 for our school.

The history of St. Conrad of Piacenza is quite fascinating. A member of one of the most noble families of Piacenza, he was known for his utmost honesty. One day while out hunting with friends, he thought he saw some game in an area of brush and ordered his attendants to set fire to the brush in order to scare it out of hiding. Unfortunately, the dry brush quickly ignited, and fire started to spread. Soon, the surrounding area was engulfed in flames.

Unfortunately, a known arsonist happened to be in the same area as the fire. This man was later imprisoned, tried, and condemned to death for the damage. But on his way to his execution, St. Conrad of Piacenza, full of guilt, stopped the proceedings and confessed to the fire. To make restitution for the damages, Conrad had to sell all his belongings, which reduced him to poverty. Soon after, he decided to retire to a hermitage, where he became a hermit of the Third Order of St. Francis, and his wife entered the Order of Poor Clares.

ADDICTION RECOVERY MINISTRY: One of our valuable lessons learned over the past few generations is that people with similar pain can be very good for each other. The expansive growth of AA is probably the largest example, but there are many others. Those that have lost a family member or friend because of an addiction have a uniqueness to their grief and thus far, not many groups have been created for this specific pain.

Addiction Recovery Ministry is beginning a grief group for family members or friends who have lost a loved one because of overdose or addiction. Our discussion will be framed by the video, "Among the *Many*." We will strive to offer hope to anyone grieving such a tragic loss.

Our weekly meetings take place on Tuesdays, and will be held at the Venerable Matthew Talbot Center for Healing and Hope, located at 2599 Freeport Road in Harmar.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

We often report that a friend in need received a clothing voucher and/or a household goods voucher, but what are those things and where do the items come from?

Many of you know that the St. Vincent de Paul Central Council of Pittsburgh operates thrift stores, and you may have even donated by placing items in their blue bins (in front of the Hope House and behind the Ascension Worship Site) or by dropping donations off at one of the thrift stores. There are stores in Coraopolis, Castle Shannon, Monroeville, Penn Hills and Butler. These stores not only provide employment opportunities and low-cost items for sale, but they also supply our friends in need with free items!

When we meet a new friend in need, we often find that the friend in need lacks clothing and/or basic household goods like pots, pans, silverware, towels or sheets. We are able to fulfill these needs by ordering a clothing voucher and a household goods voucher. A clothing voucher entitles the friend in need, and everyone in their household, to obtain three free outfits from a St. Vincent de Paul thrift store. There is no cost to the conference for a clothing voucher.

A household goods voucher allows a friend in need to obtain a certain dollar amount (usually \$50) of items from one of the thrift stores for free. The referring conference pays for the value of the goods that the friend in need "purchases," but our money goes much further by allowing the friend in need to purchase gently used items from our thrift stores than it would if we had to purchase new items.

In order to help the thrift stores to be able to continue the clothing and household goods voucher programs, you can shop at one of the thrift stores or make a donation of new or gently used clothing or household

goods. Clothing, shoes and accessories (purses, scarves, etc.) can be placed in the blue bins in front of the Hope House and behind the Ascension Worship Site, or donated directly to one of the thrift stores. Household goods like pots, pans, lamps and towels must be donated at one of the thrift stores (they cannot go in the blue bins). Please do not place any other items in those bins or leave anything outside of them because they will be thrown away.

The Grief Support Group meets on the third Thursday of the month and is an open, caring sharing group for adults who have lost someone to death. You may come alone or bring someone with you.


