

Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a blessed Season of Lent!

A Lenten Sunday Reflection

I tend to think that most Christians are raised to be trusting of others – especially in our personal relationships. We have been raised to believe that others are honest and good – that others want to be true and faithful disciples of Jesus just as we want to be.

Unfortunately, more than a few people think that being "trusting" is simply being "naïve." They trust no one and think that most people are deceptive and dishonest. They think that we who are trusting individuals are all too often are misled and swindled.

Those people with such a negative evaluation of others have an unfortunate view, but they may have a point to which we should pay attention. That point is that we need to be aware of what is truly going on in our lives, our community, and our society.

In particular, I believe that we all need to be mindful of the messages, images, and activities found throughout our society today which are anything but Christian. Related to the temptations that Jesus experienced in his personal life, we too find temptations all around us every day. Following Jesus' example in today's Gospel reading, we need to protect ourselves, our families, and our communities from the toxic and poisonous messages, temptations, and social trends that wash over us each day like a tsunami.

Rather than accepting all the electronic messages and common thoughts expressed in our media and our society, we are reminded this Sunday by the Gospel to protect ourselves from the temptation, sin, darkness, and evil that are present in our society every day.

How can we protect ourselves and resist the temptation and sin all around us? This will be a good start: unplug as much as possible! Unplug from the internet, from television, and from the entertainment world as much as possible to avoid being lead into sin and evil. Instead, create quiet in your life and in your home. Read the Gospels, spend time in prayer, and turn your life toward the Lord Jesus and the Holy Spirit and our Blessed Mother Mary.

The darkness that still remains present in our world will harm many lives, families, communities, and nations. Let's not be naïve about that. Rather, let us be vigilant and committed to protecting ourselves from all those things that are not of the Lord Jesus and his Kingdom. Best wishes to you and everyone for a good and holy Lent as we draw nearer to Jesus and as we make our way to the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. God bless!

Our Parish Share Program for 2022 has begun!

As all our members and parishes have done for 50 years, we've begun this year's Parish Share Program to contribute our required funding for the operations of the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh in 2022. The PSP allows Bishop David Zubik and his staff to continue and oversee and all the offices and programs of our Diocesan Church.

Many of you, our parish members and families, have been supportive of this important program since its beginning. Some parish members are even very generous! The donations received above our annual goal are retained by Saint Philip Parish for the benefit and operations of our own Catholic community!

Every year, each parish is asked to raise an extra 17.5% of its income received during the previous year. This extra 17.5% is our annual Parish Share Goal. Because our parish received extra offertory from our members during the Pandemic, and because our subsidy given to the school was lower thanks to the 2020-2021 Federal PPP funding, this year's 2022 Parish Share Goal is higher than other recent years. For 2022, our Parish Share Goal for Saint Philip Parish will be <u>\$128,391</u>. This year's goal is \$51,422 higher than the 2021 PSP goal.

As such, I invite every household in our parish to again contribute or pledge at least <u>\$250</u> to the Parish Share Program this year. If you contribute \$500, or \$1000, or \$2500 or more, your generosity will be greatly appreciated. Contribution and pledge cards have already been mailed to all of our registered parish households. <u>Additional donation and pledge</u> envelopes are available in both of our two churches.

As always, I thank you very much for your participation in our parish community and Liturgy, and I thank you for your financial contributions and support for the benefit and operation of our Diocesan Church of Pittsburgh and our Saint Philip Catholic Parish. Your generosity and donations help to keep our parish alive – and help to continue and to grow the Kingdom of God here in our community and region!

Best wishes for these holy weeks of Lent! Again, thank you very much for your continued faith, discipleship, dedication, goodness, and generosity – to our parish community, to one another, and to those in need.







Serving the Poles since 1886, St. Stanislaus is one of the largest and most impressive Gothic-style churches in the country. St. Stanislaus was Cleveland's first Polish parish and was visited by the late Pope John Paul II. Enjoy a tour of the church followed by Mass. Later today, we gather for a special group luncheon at a local restaurant followed by free time for shopping and sightseeing. This afternoon we visit the beautiful St. Paul. A Franciscan parish, St. Paul Shrine serves as an oasis of prayer and devotion through the perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament by the Poor Clare Nuns in residence. Dubbed the "Montmartre of Cleveland," St. Paul's is a fine example of Victorian English country gothic architecture.

Next, visit the Cleveland Museum of Art, located in the University Circle neighborhood on the city's east side. Internationally renowned for its vast holdings of Asian and Egyptian art, the museum houses a diverse permanent collection of more than 61,000 works of art from around the world. With an endowment of over 750 million, it is the fourth-wealthiest art museum in the United State and one of the most visited art museums in the world. Later today, we begin our journey home. A brief dinner stop will be made en route. Arrival back at Ascension Church at approximately 7:00pm.

MISS LAUREN ASTWOOD'S - 5A CLASSROOM

First, 5th grade! 5A is currently reading <u>Wonder</u> and we love it! It is such a wonderfully inspiring book that has an overall theme of *KINDNESS*. In English, we are writing opinion essays. 

The message and reality of Lent is felt when, on Ash Wednesday, we hear the reminder of the Church: *Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return*. The Lenten call to repentance is a continuing challenge of the Gospels, so that we may grow and develop our spiritual life. None of us should remain satisfied with our level of Christian awareness or the quality of our Christian living. **The grace of God awaits us! We can let Lent pass unheeded or grasp it with faith and love.**

-LENTEN REGULATIONS-

As the Season of Lent draws near, it is helpful to recall the discipline of the Church with regards to fast, abstinence and other forms of penance.

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
- 2. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18 and 59. No one should consider this obligation lightly.
- 3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.
- 4. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.
- 5. All members of the Christian Faithful are encouraged to do acts of penance and charity during the Lenten season beyond what is prescribed by law.
- 6. As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. The attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions are not considered sufficient reason to request a dispensation.



ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

These days, having internet service is almost a necessity. Whether it is working remotely, looking for employment online, signing up for benefits, or attending school virtually, the internet isn't just for entertainment anymore. Thankfully, there are resources available for low-income households to make internet service more affordable.

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a federal program that provides discounts of up to \$30/month for internet service through participating providers. If you qualify for SNAP (food stamps), WIC (Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children), Medicaid, or SSI (Supplemental Security Income), then you qualify for the Affordable Connectivity Program. You can also qualify based on household income. For more information or to apply, visit <u>https://acpbenefit.org</u>. You can also call your current provider to see if they participate in the program and how they can help you to apply.

Two major internet service providers in our area participate in the ACP. Comcast/Xfinity is currently offering free internet service through its Internet Essentials program using funds from the ACP (while those funds last). The cost for this service is normally \$9.95 per month. Visit <u>https://internetessentials.com</u> or call 1-855-8-INTERNET (1-855-846-8376) to apply. Verizon Fios offers a \$20/month discount for qualifying households. Visit <u>www.verizon.com/info/low-income-internet</u>

for more information. We urge qualifying households to take advantage of these benefits to stay connected in the most affordable way possible – while freeing up some money that can be used on other necessities.

We would like to remind everyone that we will be kicking off our first
