

## Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a blessed Season of Lent!

#### A Lenten Sunday Reflection

In these first Sundays of Lent, we hear of some remarkable events in the life and ministry of Jesus. Last Sunday, we heard the account of the temptations visited upon Jesus by Satan – temptations which Jesus turned aside just as we should shield ourselves from the many temptations that afflict us in these modern times.

This Sunday, we hear once again of the amazing manifestation of Jesus' divine glory that He shared with Peter, James, and John on Mount Tabor prior to their arrival in Jerusalem for Jesus' final days. This manifestation which we call the "Transfiguration" hopefully assures us that Jesus is the Son of God and our Lord. Hopefully the Transfiguration also strengthens our faith in Jesus just as it bolstered the faith of the Apostles in their time and lives.

In addition to these two remarkable events, this Season of Lent reminds us to deepen our faith and our lives in the Lord Jesus. We are indeed the Lord's people thanks to our faith, our Baptism, the Eucharist and the other Sacraments, our prayer and worship, as well as our discipleship and our Christian service. Yet we are called to deepen and to strengthen our life in Christ Jesus each day and every year.

**During Lent** (and during the Easter Season, and in fact, throughout the entire year), we're called to increase our life in the Lord through **prayer, penance, and charity**.

Prayer deepens our communion with God the

Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Prayer is NOT only making requests of the Lord. Prayer is also listening to the Holy Spirit in silence and meditation. Prayer is also reading the Word of God in the Bible and allowing God's Word to speak to our hearts. Prayer is also thanking, praising, and giving glory to God in gratitude for the life, Good News, and divine grace that are given to us.

**Penance is an important way to discipline ourselves** and to make real our contrition for the sins we have committed. Penance, fasting, and self-sacrifice are important elements of the self-discipline which makes our stronger in our Christian discipleship and in our faithfulness to the Lord.

**Finally, acts of charity deepen our life in Christ by our imitating the love and charity of Almighty God** in real and helpful ways. Just as God is truly generous and charitable to all of us, so too are we called to live just like the Lord Jesus by being generous and good to others – especially those who are truly poor and in need of our help and support.

As we make our way through Lent, may we find ourselves improving our discipleship during each week of this season. May we also continue this effort during the Easter Season and all throughout the year. Now and until we are joined with the company of all the Lord's Holy Ones – his Saints – in the eternal life and Kingdom of God, we're called to deepen our life in Christ Jesus each and every day!

#### Our Parish Share Program for 2022

As all our members and parishes have done for 50 years, we've begun this year's Parish Share Program to contribute our required funding for the operations of the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh in 2022. The PSP allows Bishop David Zubik and his staff to continue and oversee and all the offices and programs of our Diocesan Church.

Every year, each parish is asked to raise an extra 17.5% of its income received during the previous year. This extra 17.5% is our annual Parish Share Goal. For 2022, our Parish Share Goal for Saint Philip Parish will be <u>\$128,391</u>.

As such, I invite every household in our parish to again contribute or pledge at least <u>\$250</u> to the Parish Share Program this year. If you contribute \$500, or \$1000, or \$2500 or more, your generosity will be greatly appreciated. Contribution and pledge cards have already been mailed to all of our registered parish households. Additional donation and pledge envelopes are available in both of our two churches.

As always, I thank you very much for your participation in our parish community and Liturgy, and I thank you for your financial contributions and support for the benefit and operation of our Diocesan Church of Pittsburgh and our Saint Philip Catholic Parish. Your generosity and donations help to keep our parish alive - and help to continue and to grow the Kingdom of God here in our community and region!

The message and reality of Lent is felt when, on Ash Wednesday, we hear the reminder of the Church: *Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return*. The Lenten call to repentance is a continuing challenge of the Gospels, so that we may grow and develop our spiritual life. None of us should remain satisfied with our level of Christian awareness or the quality of our Christian living. **The grace of God awaits us! We can let Lent pass unheeded or grasp it with faith and love.** 

#### -LENTEN REGULATIONS-

As the Season of Lent draws near, it is helpful to recall the discipline of the Church with regards to fast, abstinence and other forms of penance.

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
- 2. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18 and 59. No one should consider this obligation lightly.
- 3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.
- 4. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.
- 5. All members of the Christian Faithful are encouraged to do acts of penance and charity during the Lenten season beyond what is prescribed by law.
- 6. As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. The attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions are not considered sufficient reason to request a dispensation.



**A NOTE FROM MARYANN:** This week is the second week of Lent. It is a time of prayer, fasting and giving to those in need. Loyola Press suggests is a time to rededicate ourselves to prayer. These are some suggestions to help spiritually prepare ourselves during Lent.

- 1. Make your abstinence a prayer-in-action. Whenever you encounter the thing you are abstaining from or the time of day that you would normally enjoy it, take a moment to say a prayer in recognition of God's gift to enjoy life without it.
- 2. Pray the Stations of the Cross at least once during Lent. Stations can be found using the internet at home if that is convenient.
- 3. Meditate on Holy Scripture with Lectio Divina. This method of prayer is characterized by the slow reading and consideration of a text from Scripture, with repetition and meditation on and attention to key words or phrases.
- 4. Make use of the *Growing in Friendship with Christ* booklets that can be found at the entrance to Church
- 5. Start a practice of daily prayer that will last after Lent.
- 6. Participate in Parish Lenten Prayer Activities and Experiences.
- 7. Perform a special act of kindness for a neighbor, friend, or stranger.

#### MRS. ROBIN SANDERS - 4<sup>TH</sup> GRADE CLASSROOM


The last few weeks of school have been very exciting for the 4<sup>th</sup> grade - celebrating Catholic Schools Week and taking part in two Flexible Instruction Days while continuing to perform well in their lessons.

During Religion class, we have learned the first three Commandments help us to show our love and respect for God. Before continuing onto the other Commandments, we are going to spend time breaking down the parts of the Mass to better understand their meanings. This year the 4th grade will take part in the Invention Convention hosted at Seton LaSalle High School. Students are broken into groups to put their creative minds together to create products to help improve our daily lives. Fourth grade did an excellent job completing the multiplication chapters in math. We are now beginning to learn the process of long division. Lunch Money by Andrew Clements is the novel we are currently reading. The story centers around a student's drive to make money. Students are not only practicing their reading skills but are also participating in discussions and writings to better comprehend the novel.



MISS CATHERINE RODGERS - 3<sup>RD</sup> (B) GRADE CLASSROOM 3B is having a great year, not too long ago we celebrated the 100<sup>th</sup> day of school! In reading class, we are talking about what it takes to meet a challenge. We continue to use genres such as expository text, folktales, fairy tales and historical fiction to learn more about stories. We will soon be writing and publishing our own book. During the first week of March we celebrated Dr. Seuss Week by reading some of his books and doing activities on them. We even had a scavenger hunt to see how many feet we could find and whom they belonged to. In math, we are working on multiplying and dividing using different methods. We have also been taking fast fact quizzes to help us master our facts. In Religion, we are learning about the Church season of Lent and how to become closer to God during this time. #### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

For almost a year, the Allegheny County Emergency Rental Assistance Program or ERAP has been providing renters impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic with much needed assistance. It allows renters to get caught up on up to 12 months of delinquent rent and utility payments, as well as paying for up to 3 months of future rent and/or utility bills. The program has distributed over \$83 million dollars to over 12,000 households. Unfortunately, ERAP's funding is almost exhausted and it was recently announced that the program will be coming to an end soon.

Renters who already have approved ERAP applications and qualify for additional future rent and/or utility payments must request those payments for April and May by March 15. No new applications will be accepted after March 31. New applicants requesting future rent and/or utility assistance must do so when submitting their initial application. His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ.
