Notes from the **Pastor**

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a blessed Season of Lent!

A Lenten Sunday Reflection

Why do bad things happen to good people? This question has been asked by the People of God and many others for countless generations. It is the same issue that Jesus addresses in part in this Sunday's Gospel reading from the Gospel according to Luke.

Many of our ancestors in the Church and outside **the Church** presumed that bad things happen to those who deserve punishment and retribution. Jesus knows that this attitude was very common in His own day, and it's been a common way of thinking throughout Christian history and human history.

However, Jesus clearly rejects this thinking in today's Gospel passage when he states that those killed tragically at Siloam were indeed NOT punished because they must have been "wretched sinners." The event was a tragedy and NOT punishment.

So, where does that leave us? If the bad things that befall us and others are NOT necessarily a result of our sins, then "Why do bad things happen to good people?"

In reality, I think that the simplest and truest answer is that "Life happens!" Unlike the people of Islam who believe that everything (every single detail of life) is willed by Allah, we as Catholic Christians simply acknowledge and accept the fact that "Life happens!"

Yes, we believe in the will and the plan of Almighty God, but we don't believe that God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit directs every single

detail of life and of the world. Given our own free will, much of what happens in life is determined by us as individuals and communities. Much of what happens in life is the direct result of our decisions, our words, and our actions. Much of what is bad is a result of human activity. Violence, crime, and many of the tragedies and disasters in this world are caused by us. Much of the illness in this world is caused by what we've done to ourselves, to the environment, and to the world.

You could also say that many of the bad things that happen in our lives are caused by human sin which still pervades the life of almost everyone in this world. Those problems and unfortunate occurrences that aren't the result of sin can often be attributed simply to the fact that "Life happens!"

As Catholic Christians, we approach life (and our individual and family lives) with the attitude that life on this Earth is good and blessed by God. Every day, we give thanks to the Lord Jesus for his goodness and providence and blessings. When bad things or illness or tragedy come our way, we first recall the goodness of Almighty God and the many graces and blessings that we have received throughout our lives. Then we remind ourselves that God is good and NOT hurtful, that many times "Life just happens!" We receive consolation in our belief that we are promised the eternal life and salvation that will heal us of all the bad things that happened to us in this life - that we will receive and share in the divine life of God where all will be well and all will be good!

Our 2022 Parish Share Program - Aiming to reach our goal

As all our members and parishes have done for 50 years, we're conducting this year's Parish Share Program to contribute our required funding for the operations of the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh in 2022. The PSP allows Bishop David Zubik and his staff to continue and oversee and all the offices and programs of our Diocesan Church.

Every year, each parish is asked to raise an extra 17.5% of its income received during the previous year.

This extra 17.5% is our annual Parish Share Goal.

For 2022, our Parish Share Goal for Saint Philip Parish will be \$128,391.

As such, I invite every household in our parish to again contribute or pledge at least \$250 to the Parish Share Program this year. If you contribute \$500, or \$1000, or \$2500 or more, your generosity will be greatly appreciated. Contribution and pledge cards have already been mailed to all of our registered parish households. Additional donation and pledge envelopes are available in both of our two churches.

As always, I thank you very much for your participation in our parish community and Liturgy, and I thank you for your financial contributions and support for the benefit and operation of our Diocesan Church of Pittsburgh and our Philip Catholic Parish. Your generosity and donations help to keep our parish alive - and help to continue and to grow the Kingdom of God here in our community and region!

Before celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession, it's important to conduct a personal examination of conscience in order to offer a complete confession.

"You shall love the Lord with all your heart, all your mind, and all your soul!"

- Is God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit of greatest importance in your life?
- Do you spend time in prayer each day?
- Do you offer thanks and praise to God each day?
- Do you give higher priority to your work, recreation, or possessions?
- Do you speak respectfully of the Lord at all times?
- Do you respect the name of God, and especially of Jesus, at all times?
- Have you missed church worship on any Sunday or any Holy Day?
- Do you keep Sunday as the day of the Lord and a day of prayer?

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

- Are you a person of love as Jesus commands us to be?
- Do you treat your parents, other adults, and all people with respect?
- Do you speak of family members, friends, neighbors, and strangers with charity?
- Have you taken the life of a human person or harmed someone?
- Have you ended or helped to end the life of a pre-born child?
- Have you mistreated or harmed other life?
- Have you broken your marriage commitment or intruded on another's marriage?
- Have you engaged in marital relations before or outside of married life?
- Have you used pharmaceuticals, prophylactics, or surgery to prevent conception?
- Have you made use of pornography or engaged in self-abuse?
- Have you engaged in theft of another's property or money?
- Have you damaged the property of someone else?
- Have you abused or damaged the natural resources of the earth?
- Have you told lies about other people? Have you lied about other matters?
- Have you spoken poorly of others or treated others with little or no respect?
- Have you spoken profanity or curses or sacrilege or blasphemy?
- Are you judgmental or critical of others without cause?
- Do you hold grudges and refuse to forgive family members or others?
- Are you envious and jealous of others, their families, or their possessions?
- Do you appreciate and give thanks for your own blessings?
- Do you share your blessings and possessions with others? With the Church?

An Act of Contrition - Lord God, I am sorry for all my sins. In choosing to do wrong, and failing to do good, I have offended you, whom I should love above all else. With the help of your grace, I promise to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Our Savior, Jesus Christ, suffered and died for our sins. In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen.





FRIDAY ABSTINENCE

Please keep in mind that the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on the Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. The attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions are not considered sufficient reason to request a dispensation.



MRS. MELISSA BENOVITCH - 3RD (A) GRADE CLASSROOM




