Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a blessed Season of Lent!

Praying for Ukraine and for peace

Even though the aggression against Ukraine doesn't make the headlines every day, it still continues to be an unresolved violation and disaster. As we support the people and nation of Ukraine, let us also continue to pray for peace and an end to the invasion and warfare taking place in Ukraine this year.

A Lenten Sunday Reflection

This weekend, we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent which has traditionally been called "Laetare Sunday" - OR the Sunday of Rejoicing. To signify this Lenten rejoicing, the Church traditionally assigns the Rose Color for the vestments and decorations at the Liturgy -Rose being a more joyful color than Violet, I suppose.

This Sunday of Rejoicing reflects the message of the Bible readings for this Sunday, and it's meant to lift the spirits of Christians in the middle of this Season of Lent - this season of penance, self-restraint, self-discipline, confession, and reconciliation.

So then, what brings us joy and rejoicing on this Fourth Sunday of Lent?

Well, let's take a look at the readings for this Sunday. The first reading from the Old Testament Book of Joshua celebrates the arrival and entrance of the People of Israel into the Promised Land where they celebrate the Passover commemoration and rejoice in the gift of salvation which they finally received from God. In the second reading, Saint Paul reminds us Christians of the new life and glory that will be ours thanks to the death and Resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth, Jesus the Lord. Finally, in the reading from the

gospel according to Luke, we hear the Parable of the Prodigal Son and the Forgiving Father. This is Jesus' clear teaching and assurance that God the Father is entirely merciful no matter how far we go astray. This is the joyful promise that we are loved so much that the Father wants to join to us and reconciled to us at all times.

The Bible readings today - and the promise of our Resurrection - will hopefully cause all of us to rejoice during this Fourth Sunday of Advent! As we make our journey to the eternal Kingdom of God, may we be filled with joy and confidence that one day we, our loved ones, the Saints and Angels, and all God's People will live forever with one another in the divine presence of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. And so, let us indeed Rejoice!

Our Parish Share Program for 2022 continues

As all our members and parishes have done for 50 years, we're conducting this year's Parish Share Program to contribute our required funding for the operations of the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh in 2022. Every year, each parish is asked to collect an extra 17.5% of its income received during the previous year. This extra 17.5% is our annual Parish Share Goal. The funds which you contribute are the primary way that the ministry of our Bishop and his staff are financed - along with all of the important and charitable programs of our Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh.

For 2022, our Parish Share Goal for Saint Philip Parish is \$128,391. This year's goal is \$51,422 higher than the 2021 PSP goal.

As such, I invite every household in our parish to again contribute or pledge at least \$250 to the Parish Share Program this year. If you contribute \$500, or \$1000, or \$2500 or more, your generosity will be greatly appreciated. Contribution and pledge cards have already been mailed to all of our registered parish households. Additional donation envelopes are available in both of our two churches.

As always, I thank you very much for participation in our community and Liturgy, and I thank you for your financial contributions and support for the benefit and operation of our Diocesan Church of Pittsburgh and our Saint Philip Catholic Parish. Your generosity and donations help to keep our parish alive - and help to continue and to grow the Kingdom of God here in our community and region!

- Have you missed church worship on any Sunday or any Holy Day?
- Do you keep Sunday as the day of the Lord and a day of prayer?

- Are you a person of love as Jesus commands us to be?
- Do you treat your parents, other adults, and all people with respect?
- Do you speak of family members, friends, neighbors, and strangers with
- Have you taken the life of a human person or harmed someone?
- Have you ended or helped to end the life of a pre-born child?
- Have you mistreated or harmed other life?
- Have you broken your marriage commitment or intruded on another's marriage?
- Have you engaged in marital relations before or outside of married life?
- Have you used pharmaceuticals, prophylactics, or surgery to prevent conception?
- Have you made use of pornography or engaged in self-abuse?
- Have you engaged in theft of another's property or money?
- Have you damaged the property of someone else?
- Have you abused or damaged the natural resources of the earth?
- Have you told lies about other people? Have you lied about other matters?
- Have you spoken poorly of others or treated others with little or no respect?
- Have you spoken profanity or curses or sacrilege or blasphemy?
- Are you judgmental or critical of others without cause?
- Do you hold grudges and refuse to forgive family members or others?
- Are you envious and jealous of others, their families, or their possessions?
- Do you appreciate and give thanks for your own blessings?
- Do you share your blessings and possessions with others? With the Church?





As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on the Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. The attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions are not considered sufficient reason to request a dispensation.






