Notes from the **Pastor**

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a blessed Palm Sunday and Holy Week!

Celebrating Palm Sunday and Holy Week

For the past 37 days, we've been observing the Holy Season of Lent during which we've all made progress in our life of holiness, penance, prayer, and charity on our individual and community journey toward a deeper life in the Lord Jesus and toward our eventual sainthood. I truly hope that each of us and all of us have benefitted from a good Season of Lent.

Now, we come to our celebration of Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion when we commemorate Jesus' welcome and entry into the holy city of Jerusalem and remember His arrest, trial, suffering, and death on the cross. This the holiest week of the year because the events of Jesus' Death and Resurrection are at the very heart of our Catholic Christian faith. Jesus' Resurrection on the third day is the event which leads us and all of our ancestors and all Christians to believe that Jesus is the divine Son of God, our Redeemer, our Savior, and our Lord!

This Sunday, as we remember how the people of Jerusalem welcomed Jesus into the holy city with great joy, may we too acclaim Jesus in our own words and in our very lives. As we recall Jesus' final days and the events of His suffering and death, may we draw close to Him and remain faithfully by His side. Then next Sunday - and for the 50 joyful days of the Easter Season - may we celebrate with great gladness that the Father and the Holy Spirit did indeed raise Jesus from the dead. The Resurrection brings us to faith in Jesus the Risen Lord. The Resurrection is our promise, assurance, and hope that we too will share in the Resurrection to everlasting life that has been promised to all the faithful departed on the last day.

Please accept my best wishes for a prayerful Holy Week and a joyful Easter celebration and Easter **Season!** Please be sure to join us for the Liturgies and services of this week as well as for our Liturgies at the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday. Also, please consider celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation this week OR during the coming Easter Season. May God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit bless you, your family, and our parish community with renewed faith and faithfulness this Holy Week and throughout the glorious Easter Season!

Good Friday Collection

As you know, every Good Friday, all parishes and Catholic communities throughout the world take up a Collection for the Holy Land. This important effort provides funding and support to the Catholic parishes and programs located in Israel, the Holy Land of Jesus Christ.

Your generosity will be greatly appreciated as we together continue to maintain and support the holy places which honor the life, events, teachings, death, and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus. Your support will help to keep alive the Catholic Christian communities which continue to make present - in Israel - the Gospel and our Christian faith and life in the coming year. Thank you very much for your generous donation!

Our Parish Share Program for 2022 has begun!

As all our members and parishes have done for 50 years, we've begun this year's Parish Share Program to contribute our required funding for the operations of the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh in 2022. Every year, each parish is asked to raise an extra 17.5% of its income received during the previous year. This extra 17.5% is our annual Parish Share Goal. The funds which you contribute are the primary way that the ministry of our Bishop and his staff are financed - along with all of the important and charitable programs of our Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh.

For 2022, our Parish Share Goal for Saint Philip Parish is \$128,391. This year's goal is \$51,422 higher than the 2021 PSP goal.

As such, I invite every household in our parish to again contribute or pledge at least \$250 to the Parish Share Program this year. If you contribute \$500, or \$1000, or \$2500 or more, your generosity will be greatly appreciated. Contribution and pledge cards have already been mailed to all of our registered parish households. Additional donation and pledge envelopes are available in both of our two churches.

As always, I thank you very much for your participation in our parish community and Liturgy, and I thank you for your financial contributions and support for the benefit and operation of our Diocesan Church of Pittsburgh and our Saint Philip Catholic Parish. Your generosity and donations help to keep our parish alive - and help to continue and to grow the Kingdom of God here in our community and region!


Best wishes for a very good Holy Week and a joyful Easter Sunday!

The liturgies during Holy Week are unique and rich in symbolism. The Mass for Palm Sunday follows the pattern of the day 2,000 years ago when Jesus entered Jerusalem. It includes a Gospel reading outside the church building and the entrance of the priest into the sanctuary while the congregation waves palms.

The Holy Thursday Mass also follows the rhythm of the ancient Last Supper. The presider washes the feet of members of the congregation, like Jesus washed the feet of the disciples. After Mass, all remaining hosts are taken to an altar of repose, where adoration of the Blessed Sacrament occurs late into the night. Parishioners can remain like the disciples in Gethsemane, asked to "watch and pray."

On Good Friday, we celebrate another special liturgical service. Following the Liturgy of the Word, there is a communal reverencing of the cross. The intercessions are solemn and include prayers for many different groups of people, reminding us that Jesus' passion is for the whole world. There is no Liturgy of the Eucharist. Hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday are distributed, after which the tabernacle is empty. The tabernacle remains empty through Holy Saturday — just as Jesus departed from this earthly world in death and we wait in hope for Easter Sunday!



GOOD FRIDAY IS A DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Good Friday is a day of Fast and Abstinence. The obligation of Abstinence (no meat) begins at the age of 14. The Law of Fast (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter ones) obliges all between the ages of 18 and 59. No one should take this obligation lightly.

PONTIFICAL GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION

The Pontifical Good Friday Collection offers all Catholics an opportunity to express their solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land. A donation to the Holy Father's annual appeal is a direct way to make a difference in the lives of those caught up in the instability of this region, and you become an instrument of peace in the Holy Land.

Last year's Good Friday Collection: Supported 29 parishes, 4 homes for orphans, and 3 academic institutions; helped rehabilitate 80 homes for Christian families; helped keep schools open for over 10,000 pre-K through grade 12 students; supported 120 men preparing to be priests or brothers; provided senior care facilities in Bethlehem and Nazareth; preserved 54 shrines connected with the life of Jesus, the Apostles and the prophets; and began the work of restoration of the floor of the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher, the holiest place on Earth and completed the restoration of the Basilica of the Nativity, done for the first time in 200 years.





FAITH FORMATION NEWS



CLASSROOM CHRONICLES: Each week we will highlight the amazing things that are going on in our classrooms at Guardian Angel Academy.



MRS. CORNETTI'S CLASSROOM

The 1st grade students have grown so much this year! In reading, they are continuing to read stories about how people work with animals. In math, they are working hard to use different strategies to subtract from 20.

Kindergarten through 4th grade Music Classes have been playing different instruments. Kindergarten is connecting songs with movement. They are also practicing rhythm on drums and rhythm sticks. 1st grade is identifying environmental sound, rhythm, and musical words like crescendo/decrescendo. 2nd grade is learning the musical alphabet and transferring that to instruments like boom whackers. 3rd and 4th grades have started exploring musical genres. Right now they are learning about classical music and classical composers. In Spanish, grades Kindergarten through 4th have been practicing prayers in Spanish, as well as reviewing calendar words. Kindergarten has been focusing on colors, counting, and toy words. 1st grade is practicing pet names with

song, dance and art. 2nd grade is working hard on creating family trees. 3rd grade is beginning a map study, they will be labeling different map words and Spanish speaking countries. 4th grade has begun learning room names. They will be creating a mural, labeling rooms and their items, as a class. In computer class, students in 2nd through 4th grades have been practicing their typing skills. They have also been exploring Google Docs and all the exciting ways they can transform what they have typed.


