

Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for the Holy Day of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - and for a good month of August!

Mary's entrance into the presence of the Lord

For Catholic Christians, all the events of Jesus' life and his mother Mary's life are amazing and inspiring. These sacred events are remembered in our daily prayer of the Holy Rosary as well as in our reading of the New Testament and the study of our marvelous faith.

Like so many mothers and their children, Mary and Jesus are truly inseparable in their love for one another and in their life together. From the Annunciation of Jesus' birth to Mary, all the way to Mary's joining her divine Son Jesus in the realm of the Almighty, it is entirely understandable that Mary and Jesus would quite naturally share their life with one another always.

This is the belief and the reality which we celebrate each year in the Solemnity (the Holy Day of Obligation) of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Jesus is so united with his own mom that he assumed her body and soul into the divine realm after her death. What a well deserved honor for the mother of our Savior, and what a remarkable act of love Jesus has extended toward his own mother.

Of course, there are always those who ask for proof of our Catholic Christian beliefs, and it is good that we respond to their questions. Why do we believe that Mary was assumed into the presence of God?

First, Mary was so very important among the followers of Jesus that, if her body were still on this

earth, you can be certain that it would be buried in a remarkable tomb that would be visited by countless pilgrims every day. Given the existing tombs of the Apostles, Mary's burial place would be a tremendously important site in all of Christianity. Yet, Mary is not buried in a tomb.

Second, the tradition from the days of the Apostles contains the belief that after her burial, Mary's grave was found to be empty - just like Jesus' own tomb.

Third, our first ancestors knew that Mary was "full of grace" from the moment of her Immaculate Conception in the womb of her own mother Anne. We've always believed that Mary has a most special role in God's plan of salvation - a special role for which she was honored by God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit at the end of her earthly life.

Fourth, throughout these twenty centuries, Mary has visited her Son's disciples in many ages and lands. If we truly believe these visits to be true and authentic, then we can certainly believe that Mary is fully alive in the glory of her divine Son Jesus. From Mary's place in the Kingdom of God, she continues to be an emissary for the Lord as well as a friend and mother to Jesus' many disciples throughout the world.

For twenty centuries, Catholic Christians have believed and professed that Mary was assumed into the glory of God following her passing from this life. May we continue to honor the Blessed Mother, and may we continue on our own journey to sainthood so that at the end of our days we might join Jesus, Mary, Joseph, and all the saints of God in the eternal life and joy that Jesus promises his faithful people!

Pastoral Planning for the years ahead --Information from the **Secretary for Parish Services**

PASTORAL PLANNING - ENVISIONING TEAM AND PURPOSE

An essential step before beginning a pastoral plan is to establish a parish Envisioning Team consisting of five to seven members. This team will assist Father with analyzing the results of the Disciple Maker Index Survey and in the creation of a pastoral plan. A pastoral plan lays the path for how best the parish is going to achieve its mission and lead parishioners in furthering our call to Jesus and our ability to lead others to Jesus.

The Church teaches that the purpose of the parish is to proclaim the Gospel, celebrate the Sacraments, and promote works of charity all directed towards the salvation of souls. The process of pastoral planning will allow us to bring this purpose to life as we strive to live out the mission entrusted to the Church by Christ: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Good News to all of creation." (Mark 16:15).

A VISION FOR THE PARISH

As our parish begins the work of pastoral planning, we will be charged to look to the future of the parish. In the next three to five years, how will our parish look and act differently? How will we be living out the purpose of the Church which was given to us by Christ: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Good News to all of creation" (Mark 16:15)?

The Envisioning Team, our pastoral planning leadership body, will work to create a parish vision that will answer these questions. The parish vision is a statement of hope that summarizes the way in which we will bring our mission to life. Accomplishing our parish vision for the future will not be a simple task. It will only be accomplished through much prayer, discernment, and work towards bringing about the mission of Christ.

PASTORAL PRIORITIES

As many of you may know, Bishop Zubik is requiring that every parish in the diocese create a pastoral plan that will help us grow our mission and ministry over the next three to five years. All pastoral plans are due by February 14, 2024, but may be submitted as soon as this fall due to staggered pastoral planning schedules and the efforts and diligence of the Envisioning Team.

As the work of pastoral planning continues, one of the key elements of our work will be developing three pastoral priorities. The priorities are specific to what the parish sees as needs of the community utilizing the results of the Disciple Maker Index Survey.

These pastoral priorities will move the vision forward for the next three to five years. The priorities are to be focused on accomplishing the vision for the future set by the Envisioning Team while taking into account the three priorities that Bishop Zubik has identified for the diocese as the priority focus areas:

- Evangelization
- Missionary Discipleship
- Shifting the focus of the parishes from Maintenance to Mission

THE DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX SURVEY RESULTS **ARE COMING**

As you recall, the Disciple Maker Index Survey closed on March 31, 2023, and due to the great volume of information gathered, all of our parish leaders have been and continue to review the results. In next week's bulletin, you will see a one-page parish summary report that will provide information such as:

- · How many parishioners completed the survey and the overall response rate
- · Key parish strengths and opportunities for growth
- Summary of key responses

These results will enable parish Envisioning Teams, our pastoral planning leadership body, to begin the work of pastoral planning. The information will be repeated in the bulletin for the next two weeks to reach as many of our parishioners as possible during the summer travel season.

REMINDER: The universal distribution date for DMI results has been established for the weekend of August 19-20, 2023. All parishes in the diocese will use a common template to publish their individual results.

The weekend of August 26-27, 2023 aggregate results for the entire diocese will be published in parish bulletins.



NEW BAPTISM REQUESTS: For all of us, our journey of faith begins with the Sacrament of Baptism. Baptism "is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which give access to the other sacraments."(Catechism of the Catholic Church 1213)

To help make your child's baptism a special time, the process for baptism at Saint Philip Church will include new opportunities. There will be an introductory welcome meeting for any baptism requests. Meetings will take place on Sundays at 10:30am at Ascension or at a time convenient to parents. This meeting will streamline the process and make it easier for parents to know and understand the Church's requirements for baptism. RCIA IS NOW OCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults "RCIA" is the process by which the Church welcomes new converts to the Catholic faith and educates catechumens and candidates. Recently, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops changed the name to the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). The change from "Rite" to "Order" is in part a retranslation of the Latin to English. The new translation is more accurate and comprehensive. After all, it is not one single rite; it is a collection of rites. OCIA reflects a more continuous process of spiritual formation.

The Catholic Bishops Conference states the following with regard to the Order of Christian Initiation. The Order of Christian Initiation is designed for adults who, after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, consciously and freely seek the living God and enter the way of faith and conversion as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts. Who might participate with the OCIA process?

- Individuals who have no experience with a particular faith community and would like to know more about the Catholic Church;
- Individuals who were baptized in another faith but would like to learn more about the Catholic faith community; and
- Individuals who were baptized in the Catholic faith but have had no specific religious instruction and have not received the Sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are welcome to join the group for catechetical instruction.

Last Spring, we welcomed three adults and two children into the Church who participated in the process. If you, or someone you know, would like more information or if you would like to be part of the OCIA Leadership team, call 412-922-6388.

Featuring: St. Anthony Chapel of Relics Old Saint Patrick Church St. Stanislaus Kostka Church St. Paul Cathedral Historic Strip District Station Square

Presented by St. Philip Parish Wednesday, September 13, 2023

Depart Ascension Church at 8:00am and travel aboard a deluxe motorcoach to Troy Hill and visit St. Anthony's Chapel Shrine of Many Relics. Under the direction of Father Suitbert G. Mollinger, St. Anthony's Chapel was dedicated on the feast of St. Anthony, June 13, 1883. Since then, more than 4,400 relics of saints and blessed have made their way into the chapel. Among these relics include splinters of the True Cross and of the Last Supper table, pieces of instruments from the scourging of Jesus, and other elements from the Passion.

Following a group luncheon at a local restaurant in Station Square, travel into the historic Strip District and visit St. Patrick Church. Established in 1808 by Father William Frances Xavier O'Brien, St. Patrick's is Pittsburgh's first Roman Catholic Church. Pilgrims come to see the beautiful outdoor monastery garden and the famous "Holy Stairs," replicated from the original Holy Stairs in Rome. The garden features a large outdoor grotto built in honor of Our Lady of Lourdes. The Holy Stairs includes 28 steps which represent Christ's ascent to Pilate who condemned Our Lord to death.


Next, visit St. Stanislaus Kostka Church. Tracing its roots back to the 1800s, St. Stanislaus Kostka is a beautiful Europeanstyle church which became known as the "Mother Church" of Pittsburgh's Polish community. Along with many other churches throughout Pittsburgh which reflect the diversity and vitality of the city's early immigrant faith communities, St. Stanislaus stands as a symbol of the dedication and discipleship of the city's early Polish settlers. Enjoy free time to explore the shops and markets of the strip district.

Continue onto North Oakland and St. Paul Cathedral, Mother Church of the Diocese of Pittsburgh. St. Paul's parish was established in 1834 and then later chosen as the cathedral when the diocese was established in 1843. Return to Ascension Church at approximately 6:00pm.
