

# Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a blessed season of Autumn!

#### Our final reward

For 2000 years, we who are Christians have marveled upon hearing today's parable teaching from Jesus in the Gospel according to Matthew. Jesus often described the Kingdom of God in striking and very memorable terms, and today's account is certainly remarkable!

As we hear in today's Gospel passage, Jesus asserts that the Kingdom of God can be likened to a landowner who gives all of his employees the same wage at the end of the workday – whether they worked eight hours, or six hours, or two hours, or one hour.

This message is a wonderful promise of the generosity of Almighty God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. All who come to the Lord and who serve the Lord as His disciples will receive the same generous reward at the end of time. What a remarkable promise!

And yet, I think we might wonder if those who worked a full day will actually return as early the following day. Then in what sort of predicament would the landowner be in if all the workers arrive at the last hour of the next workday?

**Of course, I know it's a parable** with a message from the Lord Jesus rather than a lecture on good business practices and labor relations. I simply think that it's an interesting question.

In truth, Jesus is assuring all His disciples that no matter at what point in their lives they come to faith and life in God, they/we will all receive the final reward that Jesus promises to all who come to Him. Jesus calls all of us to be His disciples, friends, and co-workers. He clearly assures us that, no matter when we come to Him and share our lives with Him, He will give us all the same generous reward of salvation and life in the presence of God.

For all of us who have been true to the Lord since our infancy and our Baptism, the happy truth is that, belonging to the Lord for our entire lifetime, we've been richly blessed with goodness and divine grace during all our years. We've already been rewarded throughout our lifetime. Rather than grumble like the day long workers in today's Gospel passage, we can rejoice in the Lord's goodness and generosity. We can be grateful that all who finally come to Jesus, even in their last days of life, will share in the company of the saints and angels with all of us and with all the holy people of God!

Best wishes for this new season of Autumn!

# Sharing the Good News and growing the Kingdom of God!


**So far, in the five weeks of this column**, we've been reminded of the many blessings that are present in our parish community and life - blessings supported by you, our members, and our contributors. Here in

St. Vincent de Paul is much more than a patron saint of thrift shops! Young Vincent became a priest hoping to advance and rise above his modest upbringing. His early ambition amounted to little when he was assigned to a poor rural parish. Here he experienced a new joy in his vocation. Hearing the profound deathbed confession of a dving servant, Vincent became more convinced of the special attention that must be given to the poor. In 1625, Vincent founded the Congregation of the Mission for the purpose of caring for the poor. Originally priests only, the mission expanded to include groups of laity who provided for spiritual and material needs of the poor in each parish. Nearly 400 hundred years later, his legacy lives on!





### PUBLIC SQUARE ROSARY





#### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

This Wednesday, September 27, is the feast day of our namesake, St. Vincent de Paul. Our organization's founder, Frederic Ozanam, named the Society after St. Vincent due to his dedication to service to the poor.

St. Vincent de Paul was born on April 24, 1581 to a poor family in Pouy, France. Vincent decided to become a priest in order to earn money to support his family. He was ordained at the age of 19 after lying about his age to become a priest at a younger age than was allowed. According to legend, he was captured by pirates and sold into slavery while traveling from his hometown of Pouy to Toulouse, where he attended university. He eventually was sold to a former Christian that had converted to Islam. After hearing Vincent sing songs praising God, the slave owner's wife scolded her husband until he converted back to Christianity. After his conversion, the slave owner and Vincent escaped from Africa back to France, where Vincent was given his freedom.

Vincent did not realize his calling to serve the poor until a chance encounter with a gravely ill man in 1617. During his time as a tutor to the children of a wealthy Parisian family, Vincent traveled with the family to their country home, where he was asked to hear the confession of a dying peasant. Through the confession, Vincent learned that neither the spiritual, nor corporal needs of the poor were being met. The man eventually recovered and told the countess for which Vincent worked that Vincent had saved his soul by hearing his confession. The countess was so moved by this man's testimony that she asked Vincent to be her spiritual director and donated to his new mission to serve the poor. St. Vincent de Paul fulfilled his calling to serve the poor by starting the Congregation of the Mission, which is an organization of priests and laymen that go on mission, mostly to rural areas, to preach to the people and perform works of charity. Vincent also partnered with his contemporary, St. Louise de Marillac, in order to organize noblewomen to serve the less fortunate. This effort later turned into the Ladies of Charity. Poor girls were recruited to help the Ladies of Charity, which became the Daughters of Charity.

Vincent passed away on September 27, 1660 after dedicating most of his life to serving the poor and effecting social change in France. He was canonized by Pope Clement XII in 1737 and was named the patron saint of all works of charity by Pope Leo XIII.
