

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a blessed month of November!

Our Catholic Holy Days and holidays

The season of Autumn is a favorite time of the year for many of us - especially when the weather is moderate to warm - and sunny! Then again, this is Southwestern Pennsylvania where clouds and storms can always be expected to create cold, overcast, and rainy days.

During this Autumn season, we also come to some of the most favorite Holy Days and holidays of every calendar year - beginning with All Saints day on November 1, and then Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, the season of Advent, the Immaculate Conception Holy Day, Our Lady of Guadalupe, and then the Christmas celebration of Jesus' birth which we celebrate until the Solemnity of the Epiphany and the Baptism of Jesus!

As this Year of Grace 2023 moves toward its conclusion, we're reminded in these final two months of all the faith and goodness that fill our lives as the People of God!

In this time of celebration, of homecoming and of giving thanks, we begin by first honoring our ancestors in the Church who are listed among the many heroes of Christianity. saints inspires our own faith in the Lord Jesus. The work, service, and charity of all the saints hopefully inspire all of us to imitate their discipleship and their work for the Kingdom of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Immediately after the November 1 Solemnity of All Saints, we then observe the Day of All the Faithful Departed (or All Souls' Day). Along with the entire month of November, All Souls Day is a very important day for us to remember our parents, grandparents, family members, friends and fellow members of the Church who are making their way home to our Creator and Lord. Most people forget our Christian belief that we are made for eternal life and a share in the Lord's Resurrection. Yet the reason why we place our mortal remains into cemeteries is to await the final Day of Resurrection when the Lord Jesus will raise us to new and glorious life in our transformed bodies.

It's good and important that we remember and pray for our family members and fellow disciples who've gone before us. It's beneficial to remember everything that those who are now deceased have shared with us. Also, it's a commendable Christian practice to visit the burial places of our beloved deceased during the month on November for a time of prayer.





A NOTE FROM MARYANN: Blessings as we enter this beautiful time of the year in our Church. This Sunday's readings from the Bible focus on love. The Gospel tells us that the greatest commandment calls us to love the Lord, our God, with all our heart, with all our soul and with all our mind. The second greatest commandment calls us to love our neighbor. I recently attended a National Conference where the theme was, "We Choose Love." One workshop focused on "What Is Love?"



In his First Letter to the Corinthians, chapter 13, Saint Paul describes love as patient, kind, not jealous, not rude etc. But he doesn't answer the question, "What Is Love?" Saint Thomas Aguinas provides us with a definition of love as, "Working hard to bring out the best in the other." This calls us to a life of forgiveness, generosity, sharing, prayer, and service done in the name of Jesus. It calls us to want happiness in heaven for all people, even those who have hurt us in some way. These are some thoughts for us to pray with as we move into All Saints and All Souls Day celebrations. The saints and our loved ones knew love and shared love. They were people of forgiveness, generosity, prayer and service. They shared the Good News of Jesus Christ with us. Perhaps this week we could remember our loved ones when we pray and call upon them to guide us to be people of Love.

Blessed Carlo Acutis, pray for us!

Blessed Carlo Acutis was born May 3, 1991. He had a great love for God and a tremendous devotion to the Holy Eucharist - he called it his "highway to heaven," He was a typical teenager who loved his family, his friends, sports, movies, and the computer.

Between the ages of 11 and 14, he used his gifts as a computer whiz to create a website reporting in detail on every Eucharistic Miracle recorded in history. Carlo died October 12, 2006 at the age of 15, just days after being diagnosed with a rare type of leukemia. He was beatified only 14 years later on October 10, 2020.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, better known as LIHEAP, will begin accepting applications for its 2023-2024 program year this Wednesday, November 1 and will continue accepting applications through April 5, 2024. If you, or someone you know, worries about how they will pay to heat their home this winter, LIHEAP is here to help.

LIHEAP provides households that meet certain income requirements with grants from \$300 to \$1000, which can be applied to your electric or gas account, depending on which one you use to heat your home. This money does not have to be paid back, and you can get the grant even if you are not behind on your heating bill. LIHEAP also helps people in emergency situations by providing monetary assistance of \$25 to \$1000 to avoid a shut off, restore a shut off utility, replenish heating fuel, and fix broken heating equipment. Qualifying households can receive one regular LIHEAP and one LIHEAP crisis grant per program year. Grants are available to both homeowners and renters.

Customers of any utility company can call the LIHEAP hotline at 1-866-857-7095 for additional information.
